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A GLANCE AT THE BASIC FACTS AND DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMMES

GENERAL

Azad Jammu and Kashmir lies between longitude 73° - 75° and latitude 33° - 36° and comprises of 5,134 Square Miles (13297 Square Kilometers).

The topography is mainly hilly and mountainous with valleys and stretches of plains. The area is full of natural beauty with thick forest, fast flowing rivers and winding streams. The main rivers are Jehlum, Neelum and Poonch. The climate is sub-tropical highland type with an average yearly rainfall of 1300 mm. The elevation from sea level ranges from 360 meters in the south to 6325 meters in the north. The snow line in winter is around 1200 meters above sea level while in summer it rises to 3300 meters.

According to the 1998 population census the state of Azad Jammu & Kashmir had a population of 2.973 million, which is estimated to be 3.4 million in the year 2003. Almost 100% population is comprised of Muslims. Rural: urban population ratio is 88:12. The population density is 252 persons/Sq. Km. The literacy rate reported to be 55% in 1998 is now estimated to be well above 60%. The infant mortality rate is 56 per 1000 live births, whereas the immunization rate for the children under 5 years of age is more than 88% (which is hardly 46% for the children under 2 years of age)

According to the most recent available survey, the majority of rural population depends on forestry, livestock and agriculture to eke-out its subsistence. Average per capita income is hardly US\$ 200 to 250. Unemployment ranges from 35 to 50 %. In line with the national trends, indicators of social sector improvement, particularly health and population welfare have not shown much proficiency so far. Sustained efforts have been made during the recent past to make up this deficiency, which will bring the fruits of development to the common man.

Area under cultivation is around 172400 hectares, which is almost 13% of the total area of AJK. 92% of the cultivable area is rain-fed. About 84% households own very small land-holdings averaging one to two acres. Major crops are maize, wheat & rice whereas minor crops include vegetables, grams, pulses (red lobia) and oil-seeds. Major fruits are apple, pears, apricot and walnuts. Agriculture and livestock income ranges between 30 to 40% of household earnings. Reduced agriculture productivity has very adversely affected the traditional lifestyle and average per capita income of the rural household.

About 42% of the total Geographical area — about 0.5 million hectares, is controlled by the Forest Department. The per capita standing volume and area are 400 cft and 0.2 hectares respectively. Annual wood demand is 1.65 million cubic meters and sustainable production is 0.7 million cubic meters. The local communities have traditional ights in terms of use of the forests. On an average three trees are burnt by one household every year for the fuel-wood requirement in the absence of alternate sources. Similarly 25 trees on average are required to construct a house, for which the wood roofs have to be replaced after every 8-10 years.

GOVERNMENT

Azad Kashmir has a parliamentary form of Government. The President of Azad Jammu and Kashmir is the Constitutional Head of State, while the Prime Minister, supported by a council of Ministers, is the Chief Executive. Azad Kashmir has its own Supreme Court, High Court and Legislative Assembly comprising 40 directly and 8 indirectly elected members - a member each from technocrats, Mashaikh, Overseas Kashmiris and 5 females.

ADMINISTRATION

Azad Kashmir is divided into two divisions (Muzaffarabad & Mirpur) and seven administrative districts with Muzaffarabad city as the capital of the state. The Muzaffarabad Division consists of Muzaffarabad, Bagh, Poonch & Sudhnuti districts whereas Mirpur Division comprises of Mirpur, Kotli & Bhimber districts.

The people's participation in the political process is ensured through the elected in titutions of AJK Legislative Assembly with 40 directly elected members, AJK Council with six elected members, besides members of local councils all over 1646 villages of the state.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

At the time of partition in 1947, the economy in Azad Jammu and Kashmir was on subsistence level but the determination to develop the area was there. It was in early 60's when economic development of the area started in earnest. Despite financial constraints, planners made good efforts in laying down a proper path for the rapid development of the area.

PHYSICAL INFRASTRUCTURE

a. ROADS

Roads and air transport are the only modes of transportation in Azad Jammu and Kashmir. The present road length position and its comparison with the position in 1947 is given below: -

b. POWER

At present, the installed Grid capacity is 270 MVA. About 17000 km transmission lines have been extended to 1589 villages out of a total of 1646 villages and about 350000 consumers have been provided with power connections. The per capita electricity delivered for consumption in Azad Kashmir is 280 kWh. At the time of independence, power facility was practically non-existent in Azad Jammu and Kashmir. The Government lays great emphasis on generating electricity in order to launch a program for constructing a number of small hydel stations and six hydel stations have so far been completed as a result.

c. PIPED WATER SUPPLY

At the time of independence, availability of piped water-supply was nonexistent but significant progress has now been made in this regard. Presently 77% of the urban population and 64% of rural population has been provided with a piped water supply through house connections and public stands.

SOCIAL INFRASTRUCTURE

a. HEALTH FACILITIES

Health coverage in Azad Jammu & Kashmir is quite inadequate. There are approximately 1731 hospital beds available in the area averaging 0.52 bed per 1000 population. The total number of doctors including administrative doctors & dentists is 5710ut of which there are 327 medical officers, 47 dental surgeons, 150 specialists and 47 health managers giving an average of 0.170 per 1000 pop. in respect of doctors, 0.098 Per 1000 Pop. in respect of medical officers, 0.014 per 1000 Pop. in respect of dentists, 0.045 per 1000 Pop. in respect of specialists and 0.014 per 1000 pop. in respect of health managers.

b. EDUCATION

Education has been a priority of the Govt. of Azad Jammu & Kashmir as about 27% of its total recurring budget besides 10 % of the total development budget is allocated to this sector. As a result of this substantial investment, AJ&K's literacy rate is well above 60% of the total population, which is significantly higher than the national average for Pakistan. At present the gross enrolment rate at primary level is 95% for boys and 88% for girls (between the age of 5-9 years).

c. AIRPORTS

The Government of Azad Jammu and Kashmir in collaboration with the Civil Aviation Authority of Pakistan has constructed two small airports at Muzaffarabad and Rawalakot cities in recent past in order to provide easy and fast mode of travel (Presently Suspended). This facility is also expected to be extended to Mirpur and Kotli cities later on.
