

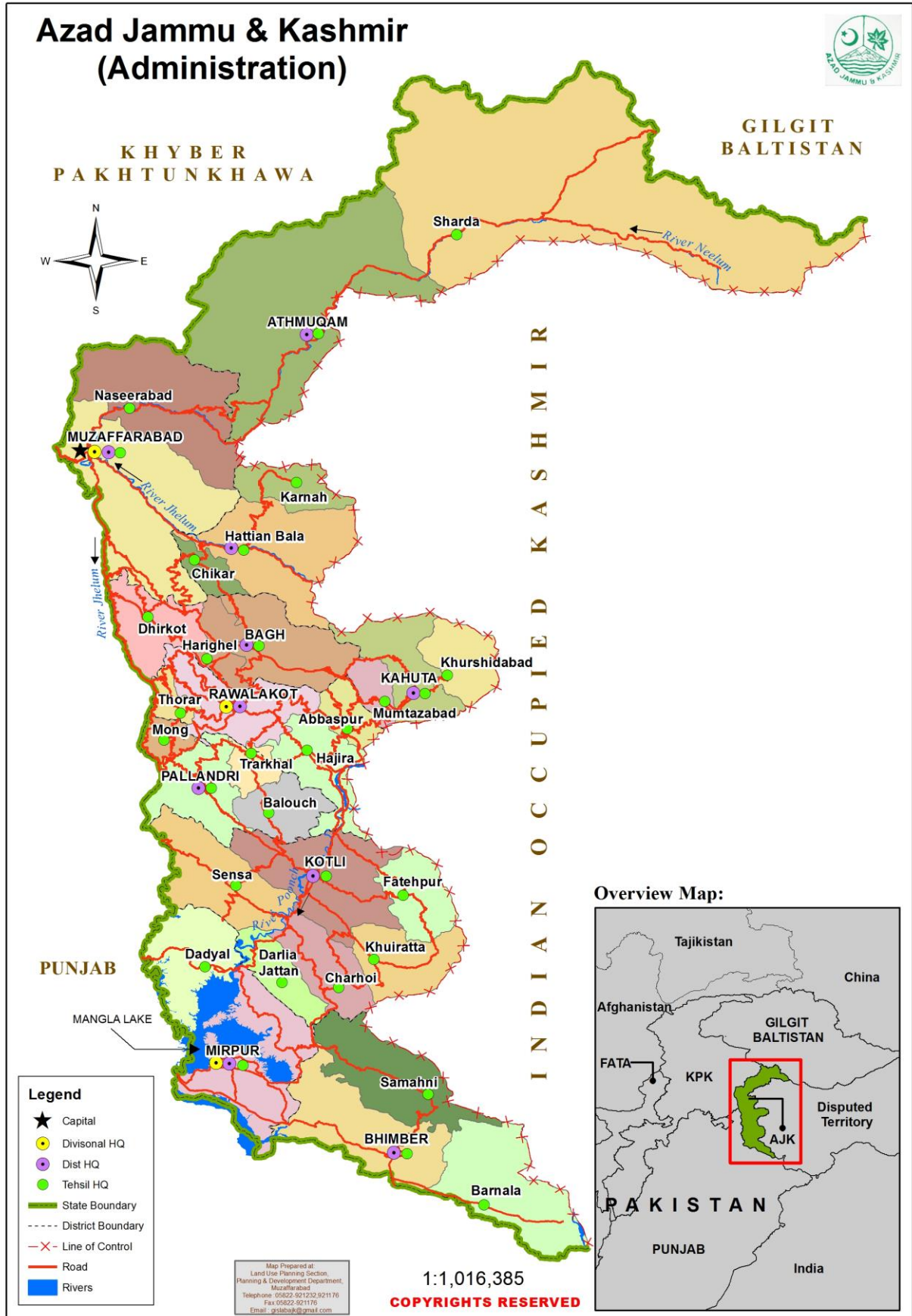

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Chapter 1

INTRODUCTION

1.1 Introduction

On the termination of British rule over the Sub-continent two independent states Pakistan and India emerged in August 1947. In view of geographical, religious and historical links the people of Jammu & Kashmir State demanded freedom from the rule of Maharaja Hari Singh and the accession of the state to Pakistan. The Maharaja, ignoring the wishes of the Muslim majority, acceded to India. This sparked the liberation movement of the Muslim Population of the State against the Dogra and Indian forces in Kashmir. As a result of this, a part of the State was liberated from India in October 1947, and named Azad Jammu & Kashmir (AJ&K). The state of AJ&K comprises an area of 5,134 square miles (13,297 Square Kilometers).

It is bounded on the north by Gilgit Baltistan, on the east by the Indian occupied State of Jammu and Kashmir, on the south by the Punjab Province and on the west by the Punjab and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KPK). AJ&K is divided into three divisions (Muzaffarabad, Poonch and Mirpur), 10 administrative districts and 32 Subdivisions with Muzaffarabad as the capital of the State. The detail of Divisions, Districts, Subdivisions, Villages and Union Councils (UCs) is given in Table 1.1.

Districts of AJ&K are further divided into 183 Union Councils and 1768 Revenue Villages. There are 5 Municipal Corporations, 13 Municipal Committees, 18 Town Committees and 31 Markaz Councils, which are administrated by the Local Government & Rural Development Department (LG&RDD).

AJ&K has a parliamentary form of Government. The President of AJ&K is the constitutional head of the State, while the Prime Minister, supported by a Cabinet of Ministers, is the Chief Executive. AJ&K has its own Legislative Assembly comprising 41 direct and 8 indirect elected members, one member each from technocrats, mashaikhs, overseas Kashmiris and 5 female members. The AJ&K has its institutions of the Supreme Court, High Court and Sharia Court.

1.2 Topography

The state of AJ&K lies between longitude 73°-75° and latitude 33°-36°. AJ&K falls within the Himalayan organic belt. As such, its topography is mainly hilly and mountainous characterized by deep ravines, rugged, and undulating terrain.

The northern part of AJ&K constitutes Himalayan Zone. This is a high altitude mountain zone with narrow incised valleys. Steep slopes often widening out into upper slopes forming alpine pasture uplands. Glaciers and avalanches are actively eroding the landscape and modifying topography. The high mountains in the extreme north form the ridges of the Nanga Parbat massif, the highest point is 6359 meters above sea level. The Sub-Himalayas constitute the lower part of Neelum Valley. The lesser Himalayas from the central part of Neelum Valley and are separated from Sub-Himalayas by the main boundary thrust exposed near Nauseri in the south and from Higher Himalayas in the north.

The northern districts (Neelum, Muzaffarabad, Jhelum Valley, Bagh, Haveli, Poonch, and Sudhnoti) are generally mountainous while southern districts (Kotli, Mirpur, and Bhimber) are relatively plain. The mountain ecosystems are relatively unstable and have low inherent productivity. Within this fragile environment, however, there is a great variety of ecological niches upon which people base their livelihood. Small land holdings and scarcity of cultivable land are the main factors limiting on-farm income.

Northwards, through Poonch and Sudhnoti districts, to the Jhelum-Neelum watershed in Muzaffarabad district is a mountainous terrain. Being the foot hill ranges of the outer Himalayan's rising to 3758 meters above sea level in the Pir Panjal in the East, but more commonly forming mountain ridges of 1800 to 2750 meters in height.

The plains in the extreme South of the state resemble to that of Punjab plains, forming a narrow strip in southern Mirpur and Bhimber districts with almost level plain areas. In northern Mipur and Bhimber districts and most of Kotli district topography is characterized by older rocks are found forming a more compact hilly area dissected by narrow incised valleys.

The area is full of natural beauty with thick forests, fast flowing rivers and winding streams. Main rivers are the Jhelum, the Neelum and the Poonch.

i) The Jhelum (Length 750 Km)

The Jhelum is the main river of AJ&K which has its source Chashma Verinag in the Anantnag (Islamabad) in Occupied Kashmir. It enters in Muzaffarabad districts near Chakothi and flows in a south-east to north-west direction up to Muzaffarabad city where the Neelum River joins it. It is 430 Km long from its source to Mangla Lake. Its source height is 13,027 feet Above Sea Level (ASL).

ii) The Neelum (Length 270 Km)

The Neelum River is the most important tributary of Jhelum. Neelum was named by the AJ&K Govt., while it was previously known as “Kishan Ganga”. Its source is Vishnasar (Occupied Kashmir) and it joins the Jhelum River at Domel (Muzaffarabad) after flowing from Gruez and through Neelum Valley. It is 270 Km long from its source to Domel. Its source height is 18,093 feet ASL.

iii) The Poonch (Length 130 Km)

Another important tributary of the Jhelum River is the Poonch River, which rises from the Pir Panjal Range then passes through Poonch city (occupied Kashmir). It finally joins the Jhelum River near Chomakh before entering Mangla Lake. It is 130 Km long from its source to Mangla Lake. Its source height is 12,425 feet ASL. The nature has bestowed AJ&K with abundant lakes, the detail of some important lakes is given in the Table 1.2, below:

1.3 Climate

Depending on the altitude that varies from 360 meters in the South to 6,325 meters in the North, AJ&K has a wide range of climatic conditions. The South has dry sub-tropical climate while the North most moist temperate. There is significant variation in the rainfall pattern across different regions both in terms of amount and distribution. Average annual rainfall ranges from 1,000 mm to 2,000 mm. In the northern districts 30% to 60% precipitation is in the shape of snow. In winter, snow line is around 1,200 meters while in summer it is 3,300 meters. Average maximum temperature ranges from 20°C to 32°C while the average minimum temperature range is 04 to 07°C.

The Neelum Valley at northern zone has cold temperate climate with prolonged and severe winter months from December to May. In winter, snow falls with average depth of snow accumulation of 3-4 meters up to 3,000 meters elevation whereas 4-6 meters in higher elevations.

The southern zone has a similar climate as the neighboring areas of the Punjab. The summer season starts in April and lasts till October and June is the hottest month. The maximum temperature is often over 45°C from May to September. Rainfall is concentrated in the monsoon season between late June to the end of August. There is often a prolonged dry period from October to early January followed by winter rains from January to March.

1.4 Soil

Based on the location, the soil in AJ&K can be broadly grouped into three categories:

- i. Soil of mountain plateau is generally leached and relatively infertile.
- ii. Soil of mountain slopes is gravelly loam, shallow and deficient in organic matter.
- iii. Soil of inter-mountainous valleys is alluvial with a high agricultural potential.

1.5 Housing

In urban areas most of the people built their houses with RCC/tin roofs, generally walls are made up of local stone, bricks and RCC blocks. In the villages there was a trend of mending walls with mud and clay before earthquake 2005 but afterwards trend changed.

1.6 Occupations

Agriculture and forest are the main source of income but majority of people prefer government services. Business is also a big source of income. Although animal husbandry, poultry and fruit farming has great potential yet these sectors are still under developed. Many people are working abroad and contribute to the development of the country through remittances.

1.7 Languages

Urdu is the official language of the Government of AJ&K. Urdu was known as the language of Mughal Empires, as it is the mixture of Persian and Arabic. Beside, Urdu, Gojri, Kashmiri, Pahari, Pothohari, Hindku and Punjabi are frequently spoken in AJ&K.

1.8 Food

Rice had been the staple food of the Kashmiri. In AJ&K favorite food contains wheat, maize, rice, meat, lassi, vegetable etc. The manner of cooking is the same as throughout Pakistan. In the rural areas of AJ&K, vegetable are found in abundance. Subsidiary food is egg and fish. During festivals, people cook Plao, Zarda, Biryani, etc. Drinking water is also available from wells and springs which are quite numerous. People in some areas collect rainy water from ponds and use it for drinking and other purposes. In Muzaffarabad Goshtaba, Kofta are used abundantly in festivals. At the present, tea and cold drinks have replaced the traditional beverage Lassi everywhere in AJ&K.

1.9 Dress Ornaments.

Majority of the people in AJ&K wear Shalwar Kameez. Women folk use the same dress with the addition of a Dopatta as head wear. Those working in the fields mostly use Kameez and a Tehband in Mirpur and Bhimber districts instead of Shalwar. In summer, garments are light which are more comfortable. In winter, people use blankets or Loi to protect themselves from cold. Majority of people wear turban. Generally, women wear bangles (made up of glass or gold), finger-ring, a golden chain neck and ear-ring of different sizes, color and design.

The jewelry produced in the form of leaves, bracelets and nose-rings are well known.

Neelum and Leepa valleys best quality deodar associates with kail, fir, taxus, betulaprunus and poplar are found.

1.11 Fauna

The fascinating topography and vegetation of AJ&K is best suited for wildlife. AJ&K because of its vegetative wealth, different ecological zones, geographical conditions and altitude variations has different types of wildlife.

1.11.1 Rarest Species of Wildlife

Animals: Snow Leopard, Musk Deer and Markhor among the animal population.

Birds : Western (Horned) Tragopan, Chir Pheasant and Monal Pheasant among birds.

1.11.2 Other Animals and Birds

Blue Bull, Chinkara, Black Partridge, Brown Partridge, Leopard, Cat, Common Leopard, Black Partridge, Hare, Quail, Pea-Fowl and Chukor, Himalayal Ibex, Black Bear, Resus Monkey, Grey coral, Grey Langur, Yellow Martin, Western Horned, Tragopan, Koklas Pheasant, Kaleej Pheasant, Mona Pheasant, Plam Civet, Brown Bear, Red Fox, Kashmir Marmot, Snow Cock, Jackals etc. The detail of wildlife species diversity in AJ&K is given in the Table 1.6, below:

1.12 Agriculture

The agriculture of AJ&K mainly depends upon rainfall. Maize, wheat and rice are the major crops of AJ&K. Most of the area is mountainous. However plains of some valleys of northern areas such as Jhelum Valley, Neelum Valley, Hajira, Bagh are cultivable whereas district Kotli, Mirpur and Bhimber comprise of Vast Plains stretches

and valleys where crops like maize, wheat, rice, jawar and bajra is extensively grown. The pattern of agriculture varies with the condition of soil, climate, rainfall and availability of irrigation water. Where water is assured, paddy has the priority but where the water supply is comparatively limited, maize is grown in summer and wheat in winter. Potato, pulses, oil seeds, jawar, bajra, gram particularly in Mirpur and Bhimber districts are also grown. There are tremendous possibilities of fruit and vegetable cultivation in AJ&K. The high pressure of population on land has led to very small size of holdings, which varies roughly from two acres in district Neelum to three acres in Muzaffarabad and Jhelum Valley. The areas comprising slopes where grass is available, are generally utilized for grazing cattle. The total area under cultivation is around 197,683 hectares which is about 13.0 percent of the total territory. The average farm size is only 1.7 hectare (Agriculture Census 2010) half of which is cultivated: a large proportion of farm land is culturable waste, including forest, whereas per capita land holding is 0.235 hectare.

1.13 Fisheries

AJ&K has abundant sources of water ranging from big rivers to high altitudinal lakes and snow melted streams. One big reservoir and several canals also contribute the water resources. As water temperature of these sources ranges from cold to warm regions, hence a large diversified fish fauna is found in AJ&K. Fish fauna includes commercial, sports, and cultivable.

In AJ&K 82 species of fish are found. Mahesher, Singhara, Rahu, Thaila, Trout and Gulfam are very famous fishes

1.14 Forestry

About 42.6% of the total geographical area (1.330 in million hectares), is controlled by the Forests Department. The productive forests cover 0.379 million hectares whereas non-productive forests cover 0.188 million hectares out of 0.567 million hectares. The per capita standing volume is 299.5 Cubic feet and per capita forest area is 0.35 Acre. The local communities have traditional rights in terms of use of the forests and on an average 3 trees are burnt by 1 household every year for the fuel-wood requirements in the absence of alternate sources. Similarly, about 5 trees on average are required to construct a house for which the wood roofs have to be replaced after every 8-10 years. Deodar, Kail, Fir and Pine are important tree species.

The territory of AJ&K is stretched in a strip from North most region of the high mountains to tropical arid zone in the South. As a result of this, a large number of forest types are present in AJ&K. Southern Zone contain acacia, ber and sisoo, which is followed by sub-tropical bushes (pabbies) of Mirpur district with sanatha,

cassia, olea, berry, dhak and pine (Chir). Moist temperate zone covers the high altitude forest areas, which fall in the monsoon zone. In Northern zone kail, spruce and poplar are common. Dry temperate zone lies in the Neelum and Leepa valleys, where best quality deodar, kail, fir, taxus, betula, prunus and poplar are found. Alpine zone consists of the highest peaks of the Himalayan range with great glaciers and avalanches. Are-wise detail of the AJ&K Forests is given in the Table 1.9, below:

1.16 Industry

The State of AJ&K by virtue of its topography, meteorology, hydrology & administrative setup provides huge opportunities of investment in various sectors. Keeping in view the investment potential in AJ&K the Government is encouraging investment in multiple sectors. The AJ&K Government established industrial estates in some districts. Government offers more incentives to the local and non-local investors, as a result it creates enabling environment and has attracted investors to establish industries in AJ&K.

The Government has adopted the Industrial policy of Federal Govt. according to which all types of industries are allowed to be established in the territory of AJ&K except arms & ammunition, security printing, explosive material and radioactive material.

In order to accelerate the pace of development, the Department of Industries has established 6 Industrial Estates in various districts of AJ&K with basic infrastructure like roads, water supply, and sewerage system and telephone and electricity facilities. A number of medium & large scale Industries which have already been established in different districts of AJ&K since 1970.

In view of the localized requirement of AJ&K, there is huge potential for Industries like food, hydro power generation equipment, ready-made garments, furniture and plastic products in the area. In order to boost the industrial production in AJ&K, the Govt. is providing incentives to the Industrialists including concession in different taxes and providing energy on cheaper rates for first five years to run the Industries. It will be advisable that detailed feasibility of industrial products must be carried out for making final decisions for investment and also to provide inducement to local investors particularly to persons who are major source of remittance in the area.

As the area is mostly hilly and does not produce raw-material required to be used in major industries hence more emphasis is on handicrafts and small scale industry.

Following small scale industries of AJ&K are famous within AJ&K and even known internationally due to their quality and design.

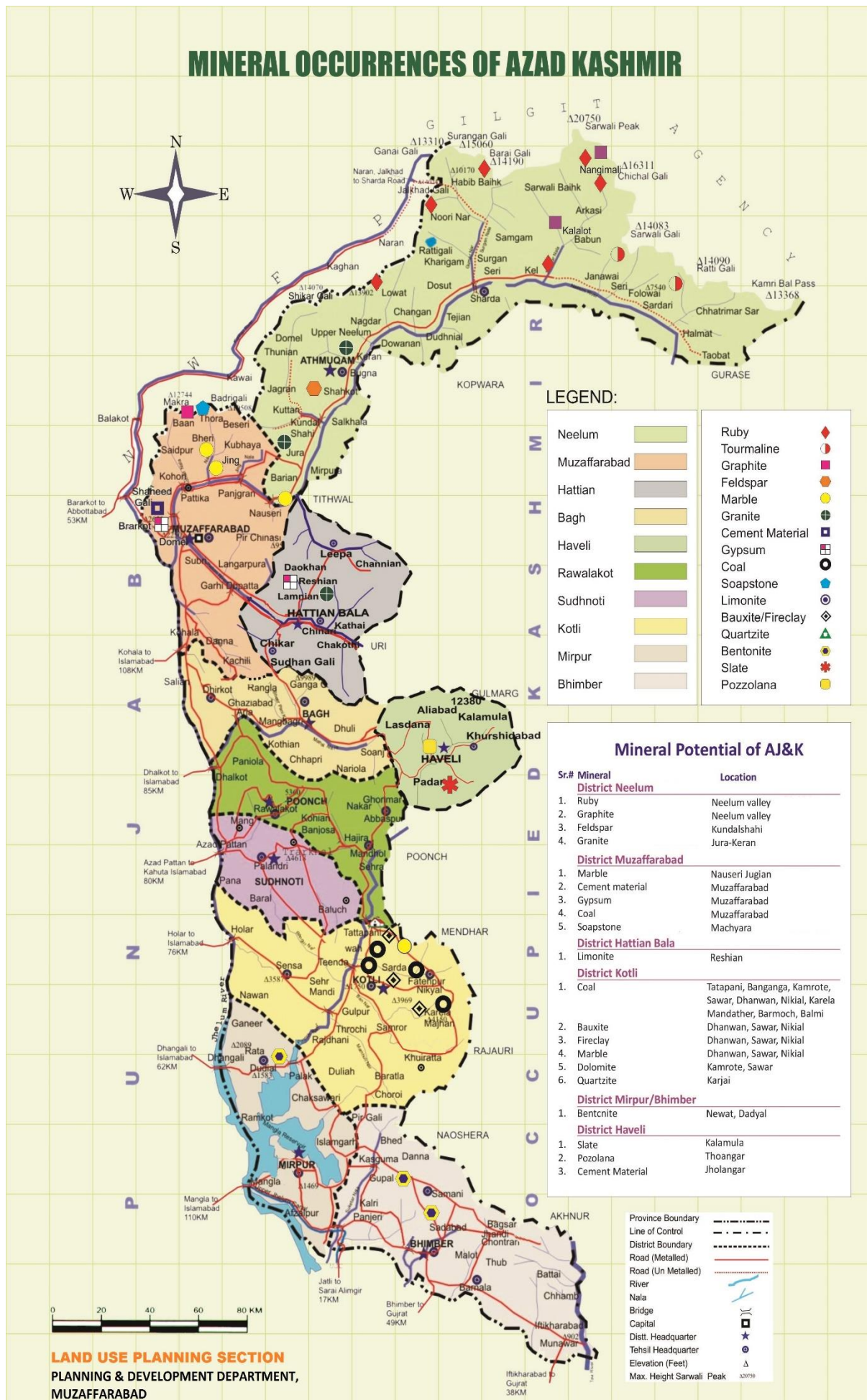
1.17 Mineral Resources

1.18 Development of Cottage Industry and Kashmiri Handicrafts

There are many investment opportunities in traditional handicrafts of Kashmir. AJ&K Small Industries Corporation (AKSIC) established in 1992, is an official body committed to promote the development of handicrafts for the economic betterment of the working handicraftsmen. AKSIC objective is to educate and assist the working craftsmen to set up and run their business properly. Equipped with God gifted resources and manned with requisite expertise, the AKSIC is committed to honor the buyers, demands, preferences and requirements.

1.19 Piped Water Supply

At the time of independence, availability of piped water supply was non-existent but significant progress has now been made in this regard. Presently 44.51% households of the urban area and 57.71% population of rural area have been provided with a piped water supply through house connections and public stand posts.

1.20 Communication

In the State of AJ&K, in spite of the fact that road construction is arduous and expensive due to hilly and mountainous even though road network covers almost all the areas of AJ&K regardless of the fact that road quality is also questionable in some hard areas.

At the moment the total length of Metaled Roads 9,372 km, Fair-Weather Road 7,423 km. Total Roads in AJ&K is 16,795 Kilometers. Unfortunately, AJ&K is lacking railways. District-wise detail of metaled and fair weather roads is given in Table 1.12, below:

The Government of AJ&K in collaboration with the Civil Aviation Authority of Pakistan has constructed two small airports in Muzaffarabad and Rawalakot cities in order to provide easy and fast travelling facility (Flights presently suspended). More than 1.5 million people belonging to AJ&K are living abroad, hence; there is a dire need for construction of international airports in AJ&K. Therefore, construction of airport at Mirpur is being persistently demanded. Besides this the extension of airport at Muzaffarabad and Rawalakot is essentially required to facilitate ever increasing tourist's traffic in the area.

1.21 Telecommunication/Post Offices/Radio/T.V

AJ&K is now exceedingly well provided with Post Offices. The telephonic system is now extensively in use, and its demand from subscribers is continuously increasing day by day. Detail of Post Offices and telecommunication facilities etc., are given in the Tables 1.13 and 1.14, respectively.

Special Communication Organization (SCO) raised since 1976, is providing state-of-the-art, modern IT and Telecom facilities in the most difficult region of AJ&K, current services include landline Telephone (PSTN), Mobile (GSM), Wireless Local Loop (WLL), Internet Broadband (DSL) and Digital Cross Connect (DXX). Despite competitive market, de-regulated telecomm environment and presence of all cellular giants in the area, SCO has been declared Significant Market Player (SMP) by the PTA during current year.

Vision of the SCO is stipulation of reliable, effective, innovative and up-to-date voice and data communication services to the people living in the most rugged / arduous terrain.

The major telecom providers in AJ&K include SCOM, Jazz, Telenor, Ufone and Zong. The present communication network of cellular companies does not provide proper coverage and effective connectivity. In addition, internet facility is very poor. This needs to be improved substantially to meet need of the day.

Radio AJ&K has remained a prime source of information and entertainment. With the introduction of television its importance, however, is reduced to a great extent but even then it has considerable value in certain quarters. There are two radio stations working in AJ&K one at Muzaffarabad and other at Trarkhal. AJ&K Television is also working in Muzaffarabad, with the cooperation of Pakistan Television.

The present communication network of cellular companies does not provide proper coverage and effective connectivity. In addition, internet facility is very poor. This needs to be improved substantially to meet need of the day.

1.22 Education

Education is a fundamental factor which contributes in transforming the socio-economic conditions of a region. It promotes social, cultural as well as moral and ethical values. The dream of a welfare society cannot become true without fighting against illiteracy, ignorance and poverty.

In 1947, there were 254 Primary Schools, 30 Middle Schools, 6 High Schools and 1 Intermediate College in AJ&K whereas in 2016 we had 4015 Primary Schools, 1047 Middle Schools, 805 High Schools and 97 Intermediate Colleges in AJ&K. We also have 58 Degree Colleges, 12 Post Graduate Colleges, 4 Medical Colleges and 5 Public Sector Universities in AJ&K in 2016.

Literacy rate of AJ&K was 76.6% in 2016 as compared to 60% of Pakistan. Level wise detail of Education Institution is given below:

The Police Department is supposed to maintain law and order in the State. Rangers and Reserve Force help whenever people needed. The setup of Police is given in the following two Tables.

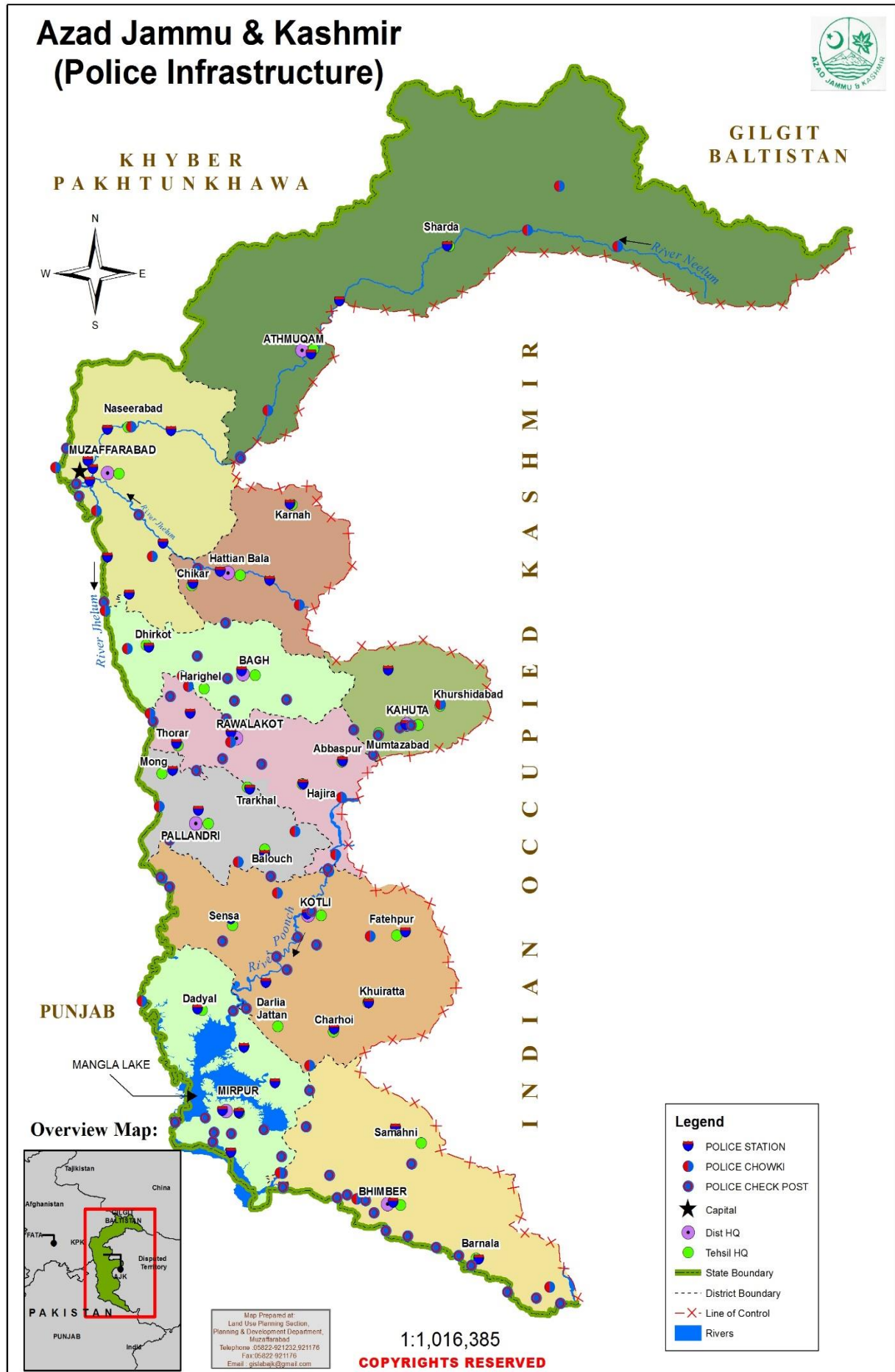

1.25 Power

At present, the installed Grid capacity is **766** MVA. About 25,861 Km transmission lines have been extended to 1764 villages out of 1,768 villages and about 4.419 million population (94.85%) have been provided with electricity supply. The Government has laid great emphasis on generating electricity in order to meet the growing domestic as well as industrial requirements. It has been planned to launch a comprehensive programme for construction of Hydro power stations to exploit this vast potential.

1.26 Hydro Power Generation

In AJ&K, electricity production was 1,141.82 MW in 2016 which was three times of the actual requirement of the whole AJ&K. Total capacity of AJ&K is 9,034.72 MW which can fulfill almost 50% national needs but unfortunately, this potential and environment friendly cheap source of energy could not be tapped due to non-availability of required financial resources.

1.27 Tourism

Tourism has following potential areas:-

Scenic Beauty, Historical and Archaeological Assets, Cultural Heritage, Religious Tourism, Mountain Based Adventure Tourism, Mountaineering, Trekking, Summer Camping & Hikes, Water Based Adventure Tourism and Para-gliding.

Number of tourist is increasing day by day in AJ&K. In 2013 there was 0.654. Whereas 1.562 million in 2016 which showed 239% increase in 2016 as compared to 2013.

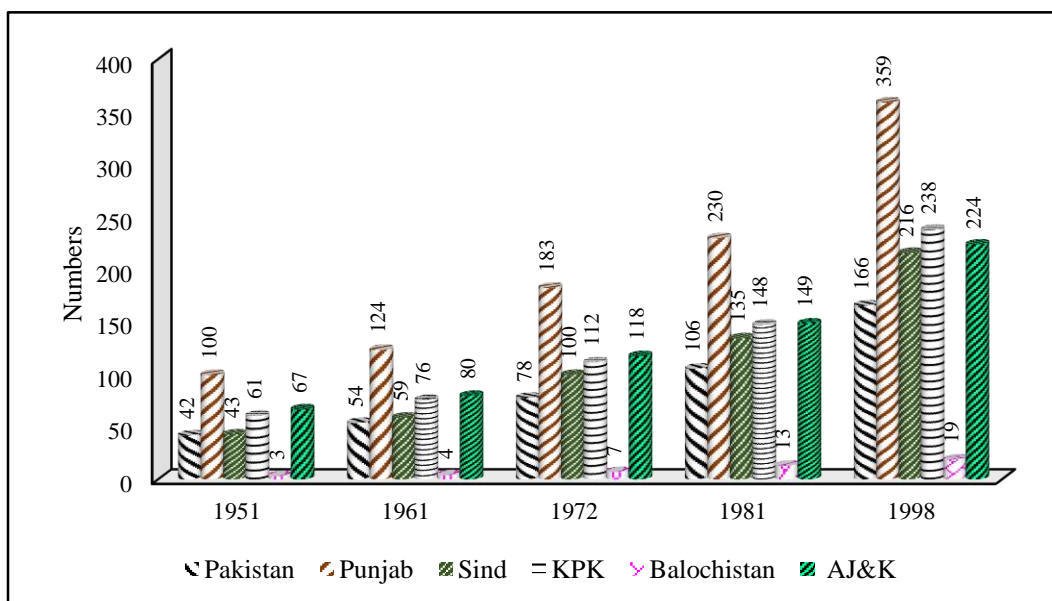


Figure 2.1: Density of the Population of Pakistan, Provinces and AJ&K in different Censuses

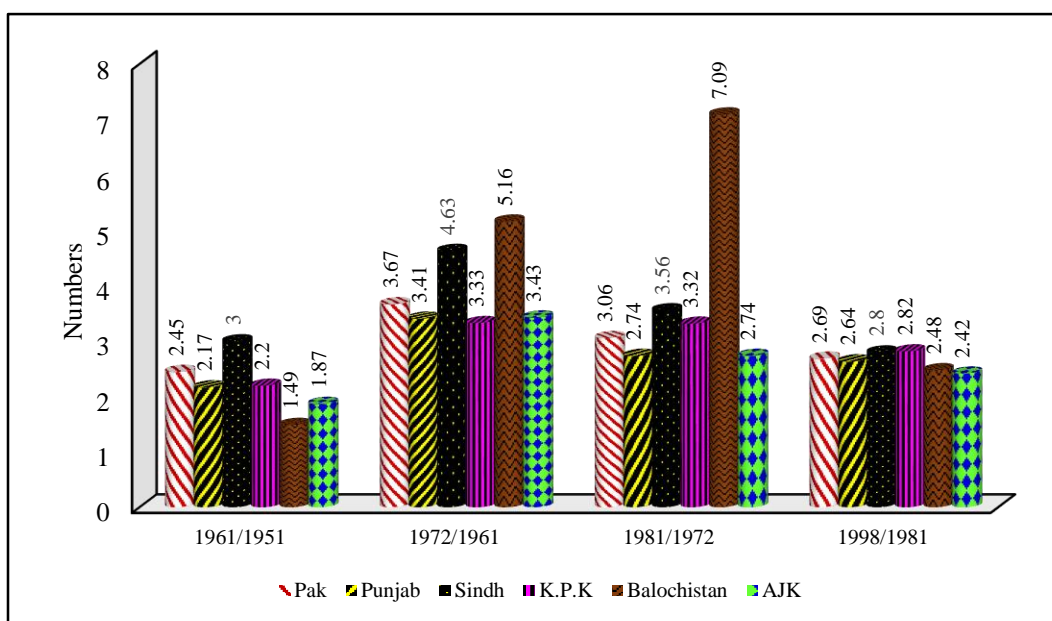


Figure 2.2: Annual growth Rate of Pakistan, Provinces and AJ&K in different Censuses

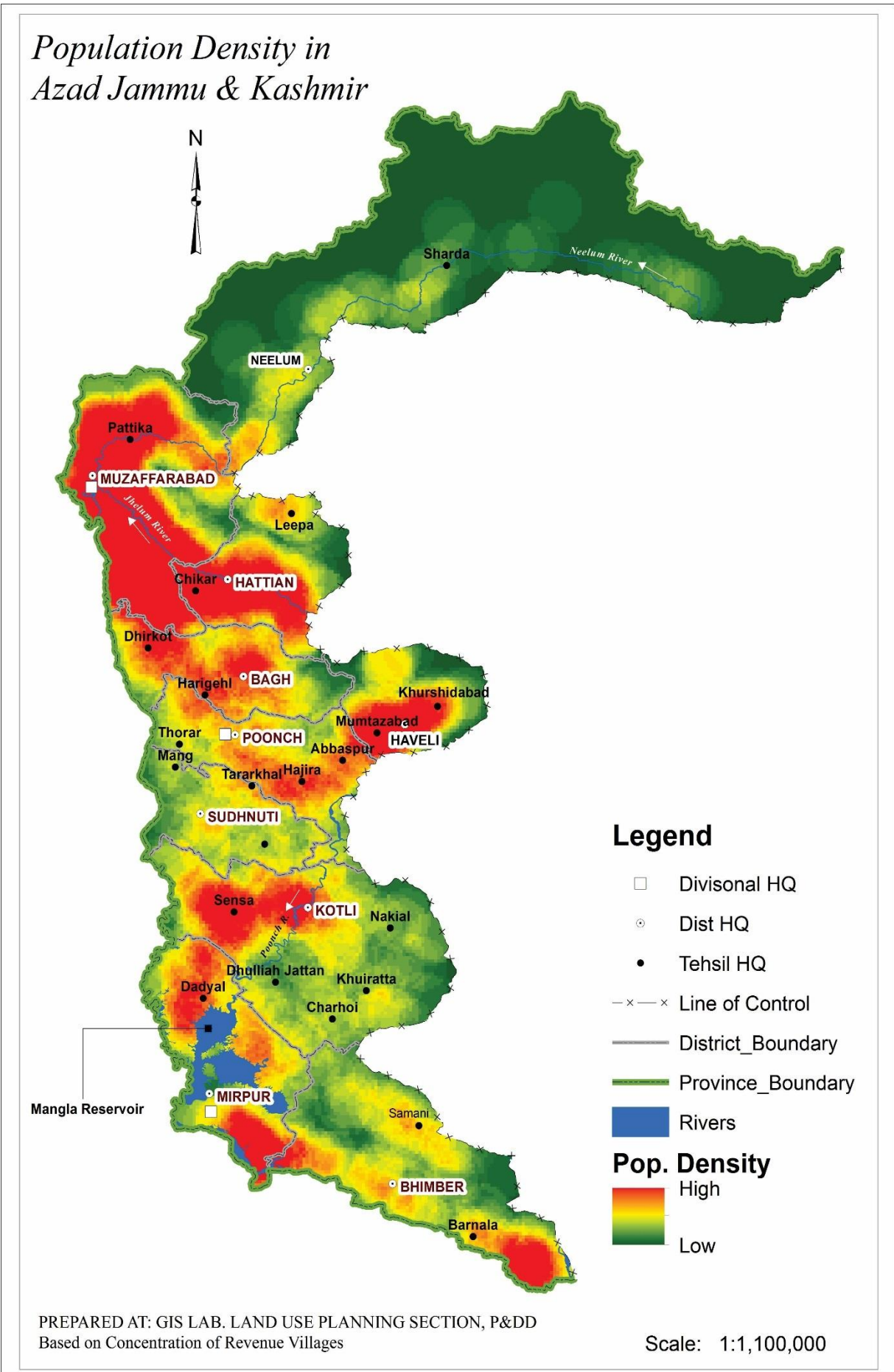

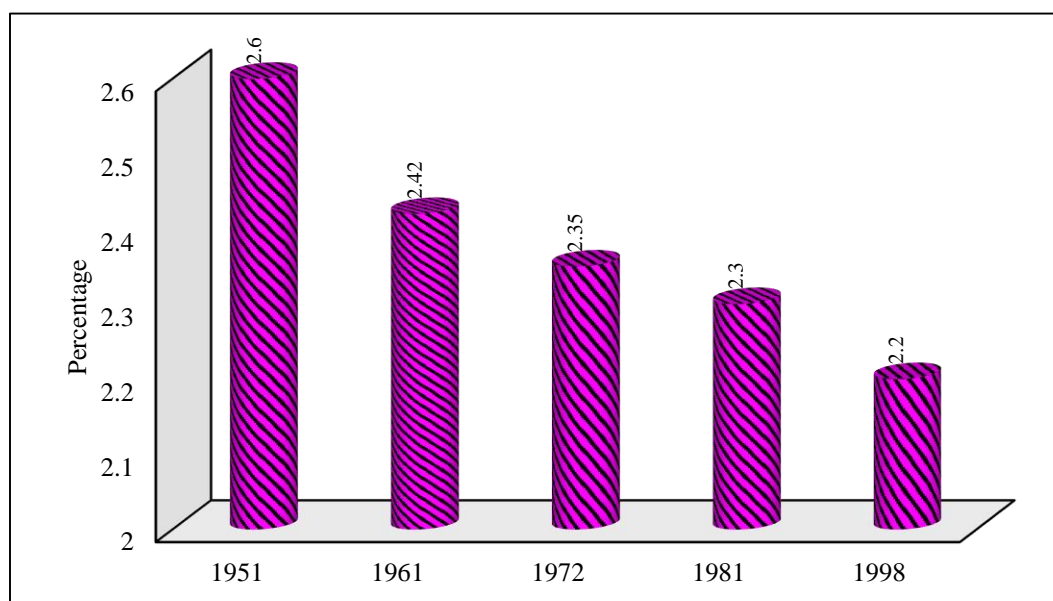


Figure 2.3: Percentage of Population of AJ&K with Pakistan in different Censuses

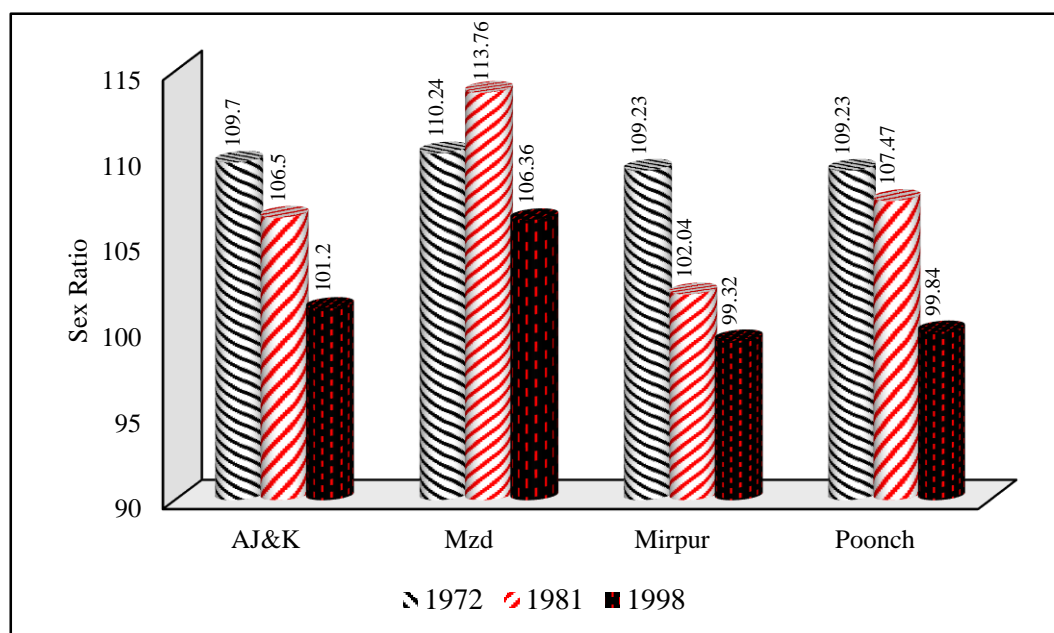


Figure 2.4: Division-wise Sex Ratio in AJ&K in 1972, 1981 and 1998 Censuses

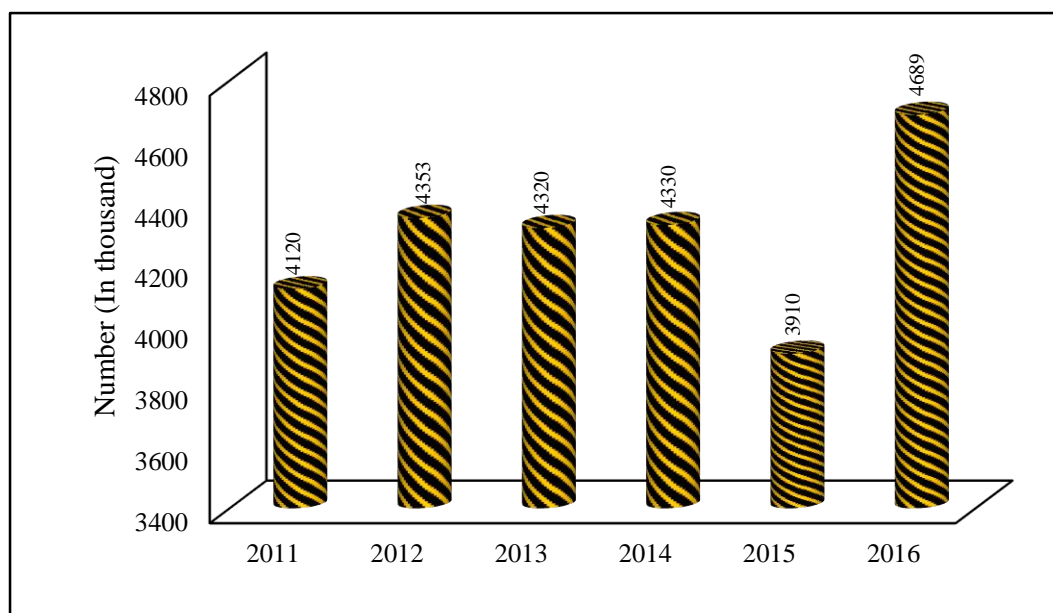


Figure 3.1: Number of Outdoor Patients in Government Hospitals in AJ&K

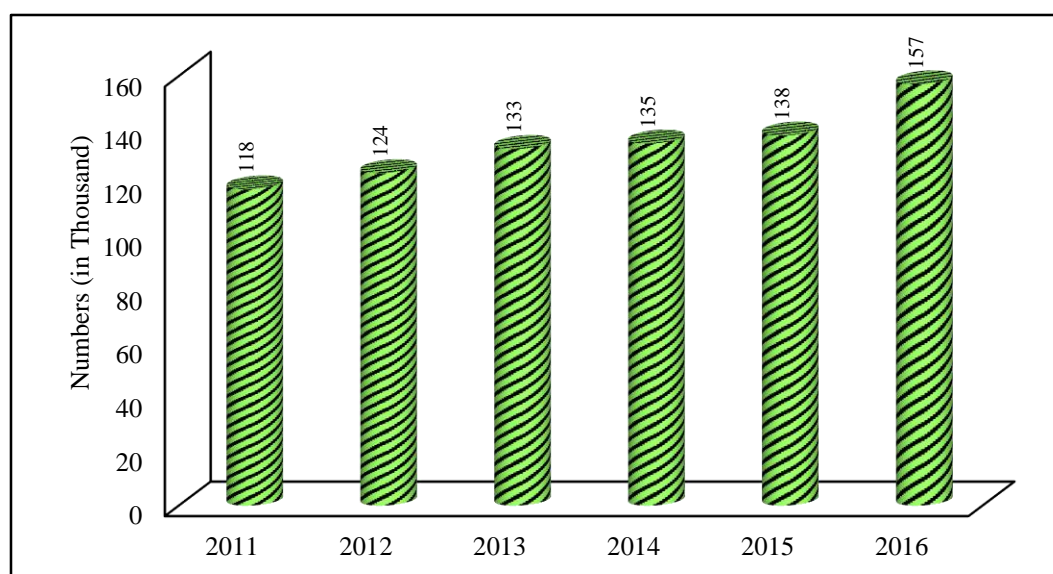


Figure 3.2: Number of Indoor Patients in Government Hospitals in AJ&K

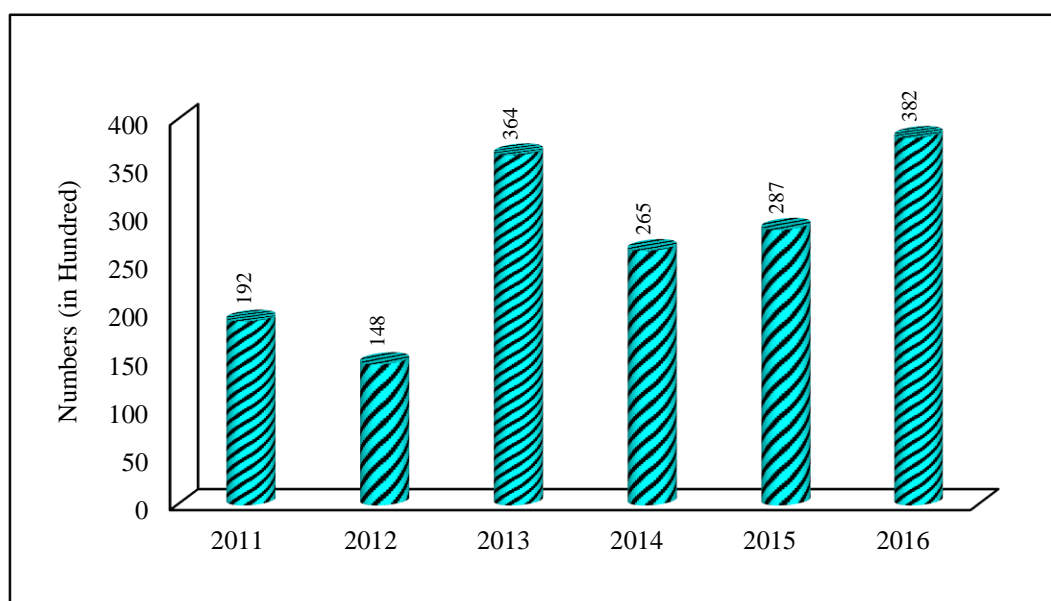


Figure 3.3: Number of Normal Deliveries in Government Hospitals in AJ&K

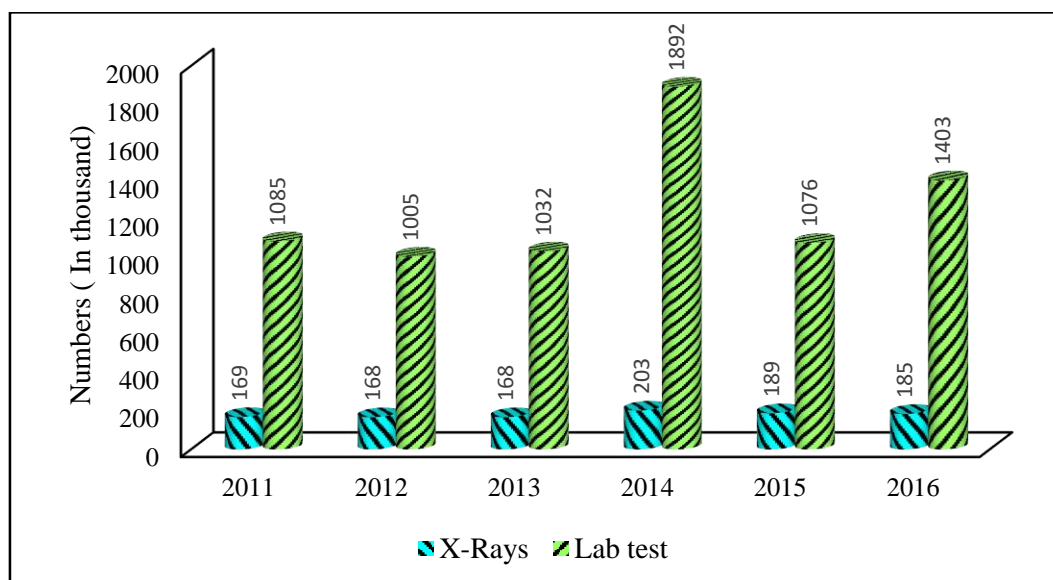


Figure 3.4: Number of X-Rays and Laboratory Tests in Government Hospitals in AJ&K

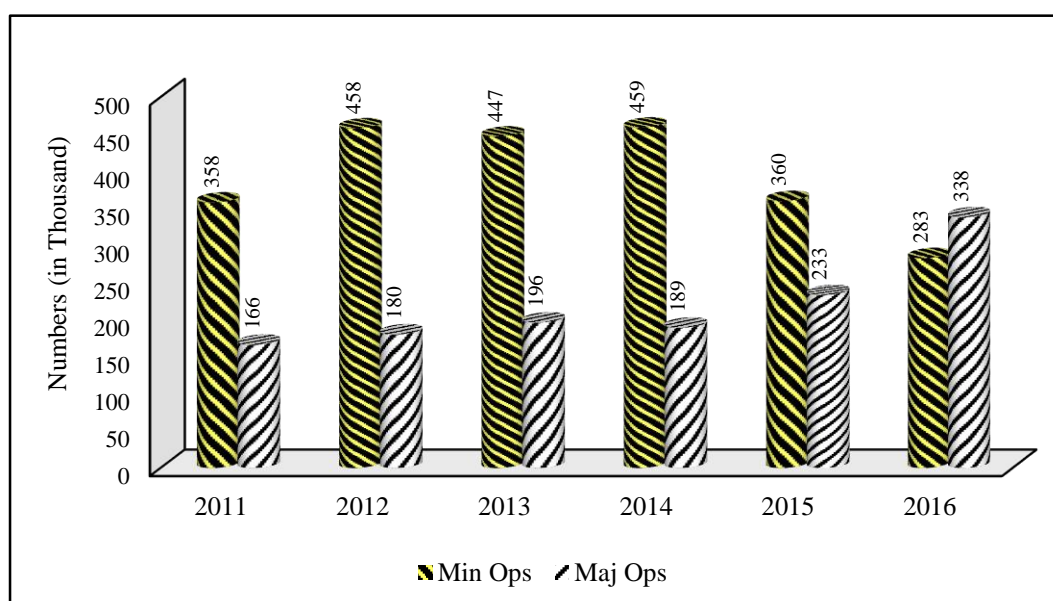


Figure 3.5: Number of Minor Operations and Major Operations in Govt. Hospitals in AJ&K

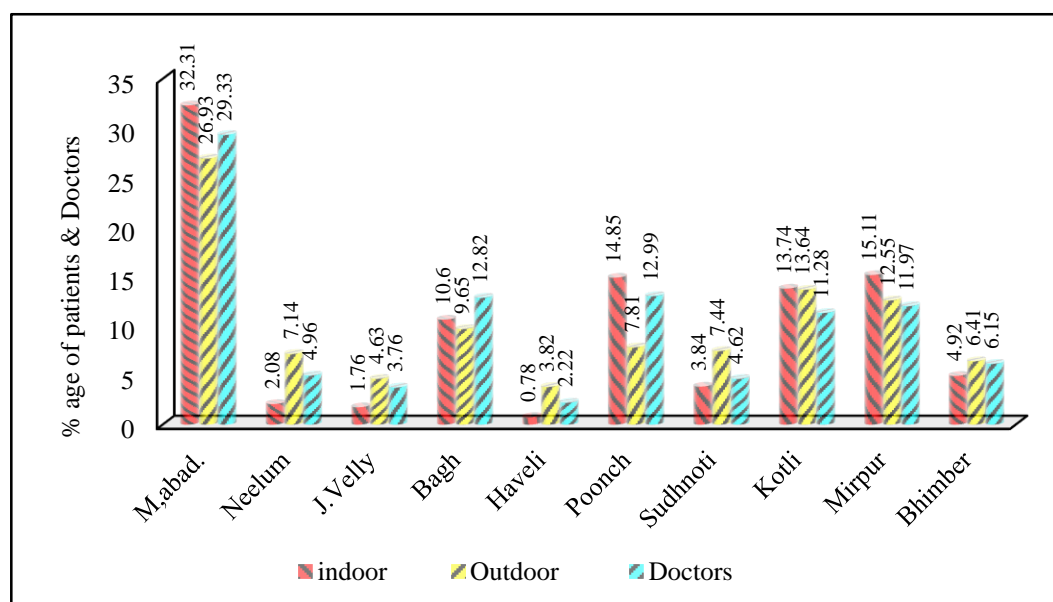


Figure 3.6: District-wise Percentage of Outdoor Patients, Indoor Patients and Doctors in Government Hospitals of AJ&K 2011 to 2016

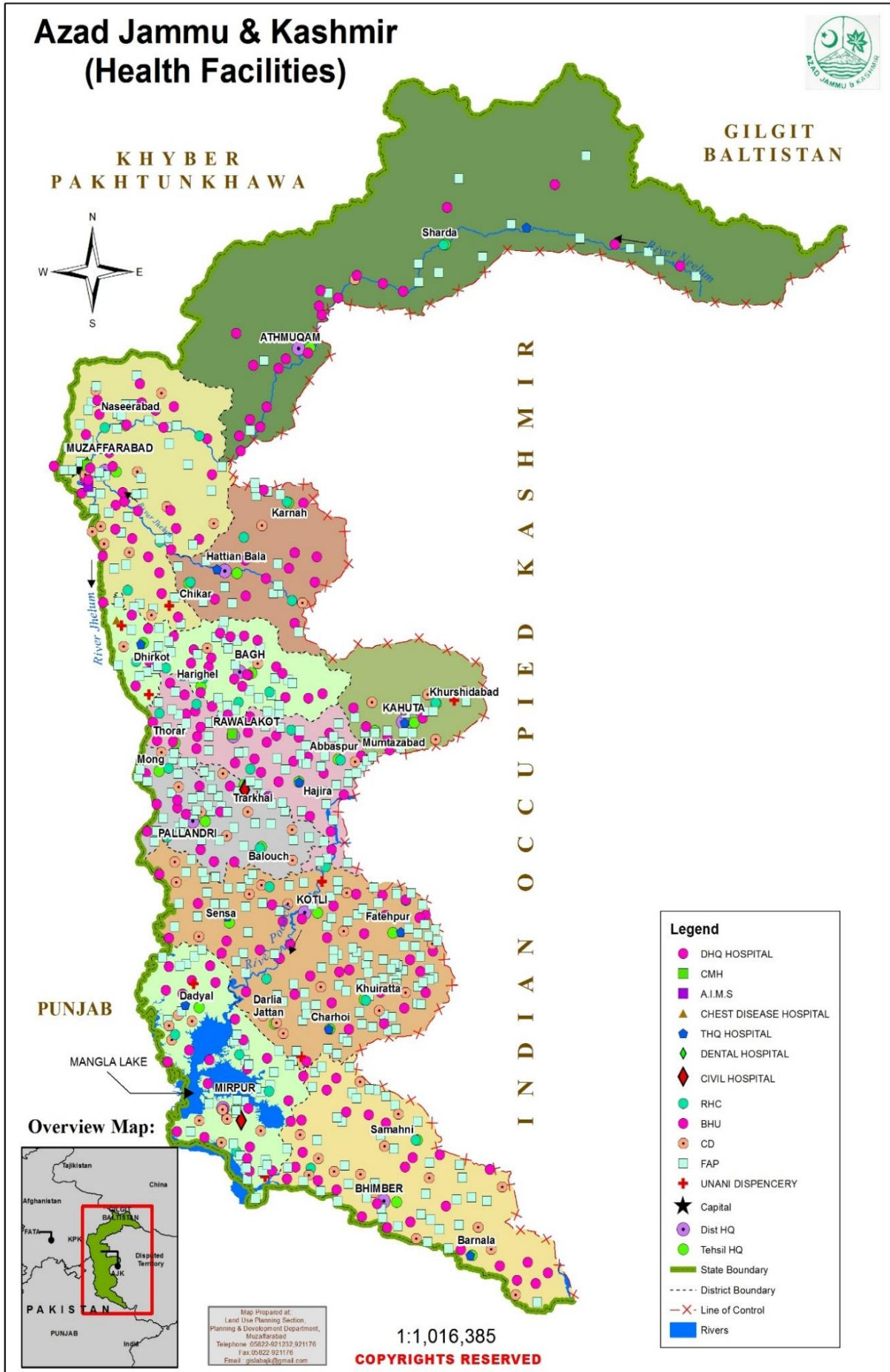

Nutrition and Contraception in AJ&K

Important Definitions

Stunting: Failure to reach line growth potential because of inadequate nutrition or poor health, also defined as a chronic restriction of growth in height indicated by low height –for-age. Stunting is usually a reliable indicator for long-term under nutrition among young children.

Wasting: Acute weight loss indicated by a low weight for high ratio. Wasting is usually a result of acute starvation or sever disease. Often more chronic during the first two year of life, wasting is part of a pattern of under nutrition.

Couple years of Protection (CYP): CYP is defined as the estimated protection provided by family planning services during one year period, based upon the volume of all contraceptives sold or distribution free of charge to the clients during that period.

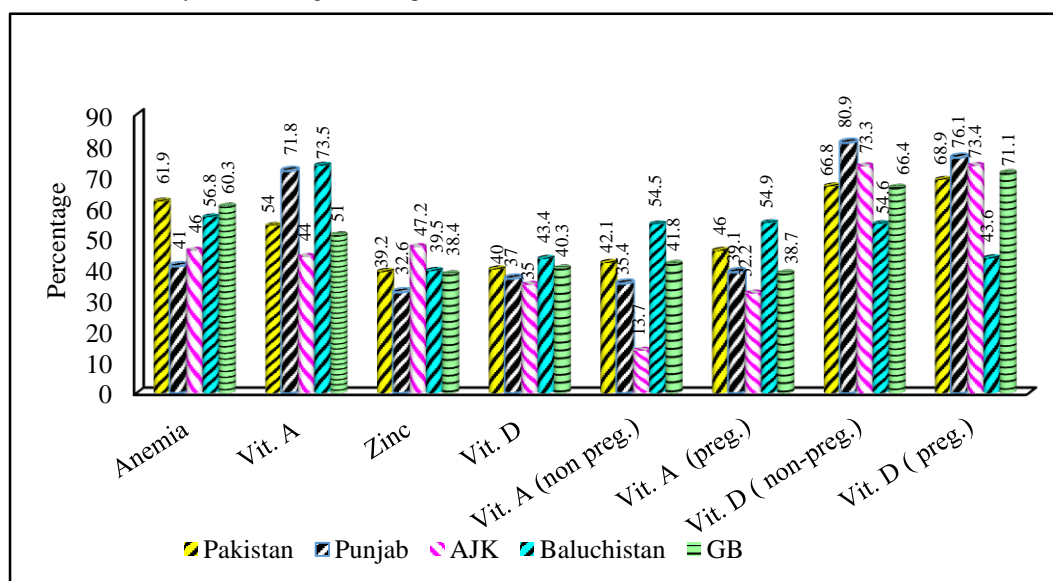


Figure 3.7: Micronutrient Deficiencies in Children under Five & Women of Reproductive age for Pakistan, Punjab, Balochistan, GB and AJ&K

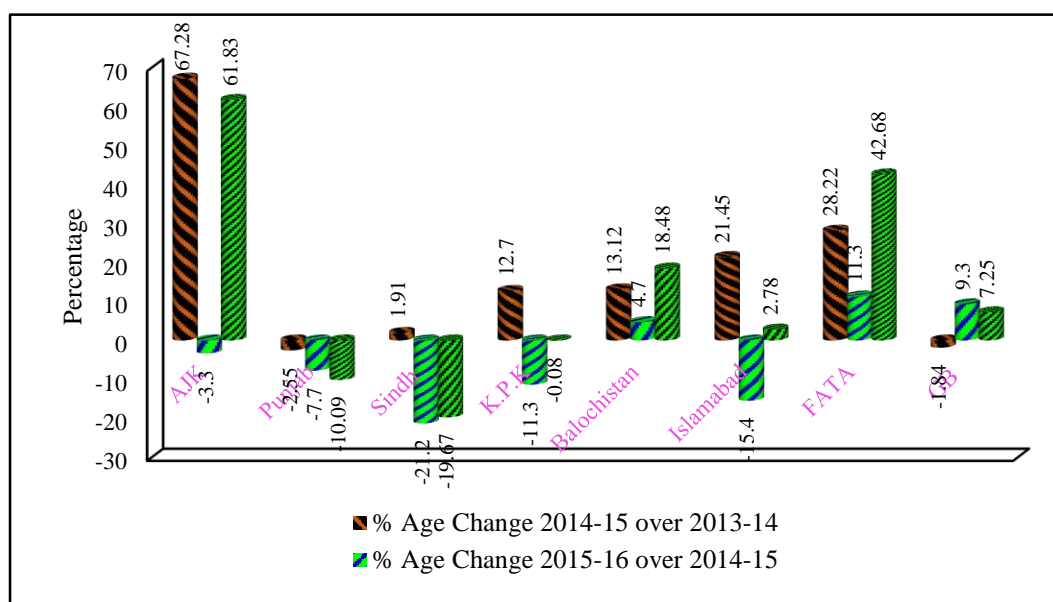


Figure 3.8: Contraceptive Usage by Data Provided by Population Welfare Departments (PWDs)

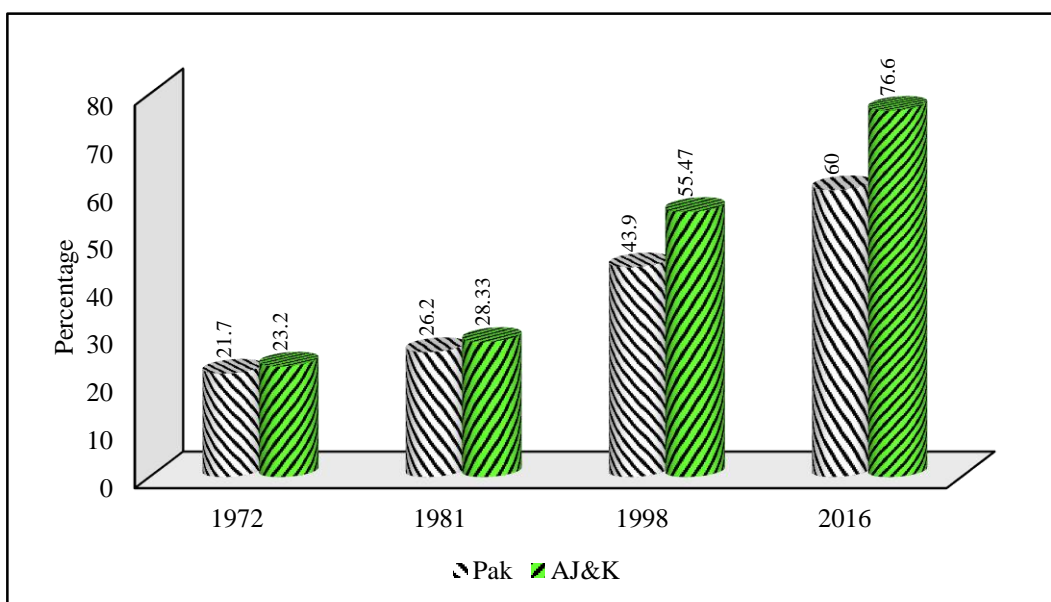


Figure 4.1: Literacy Rate of both Sexes of Pakistan and Azad Jammu & Kashmir

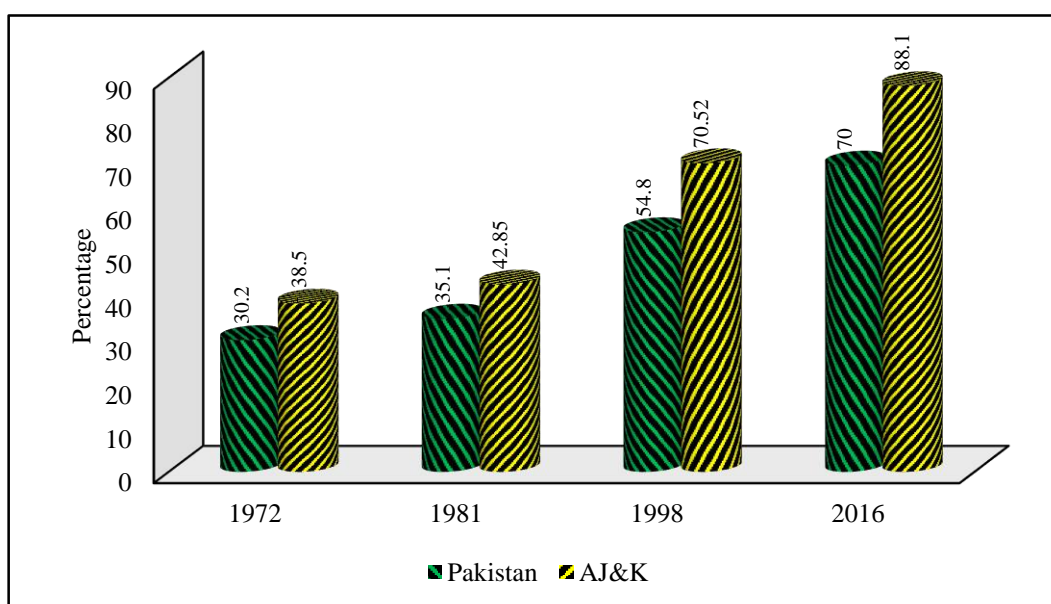


Figure 4.2: Male Literacy Rate of Pakistan and Azad Jammu & Kashmir

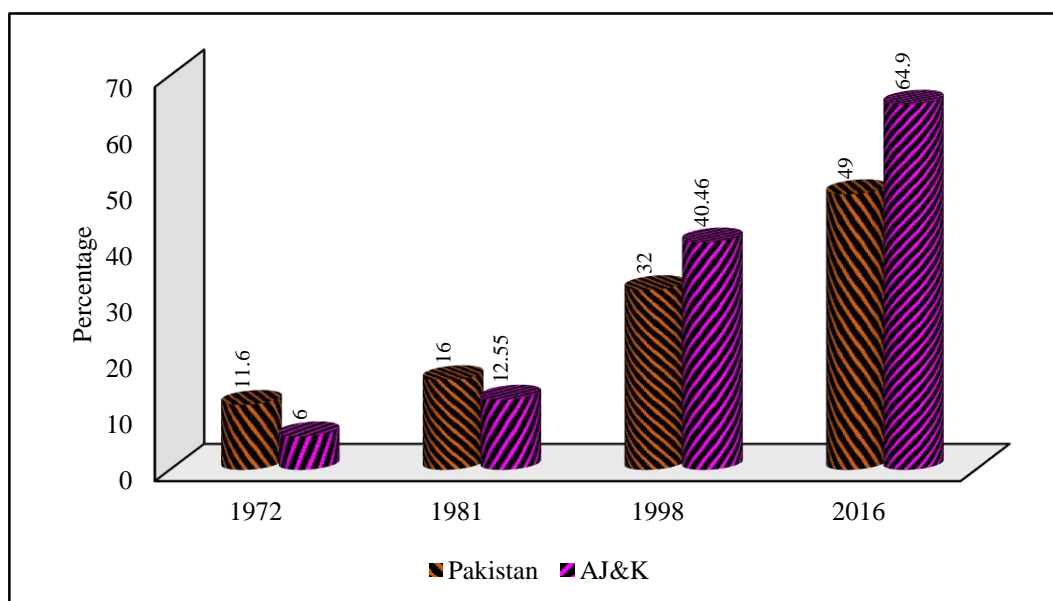


Figure 4.3: Female Literacy Rate of Pakistan and Azad Jammu & Kashmir

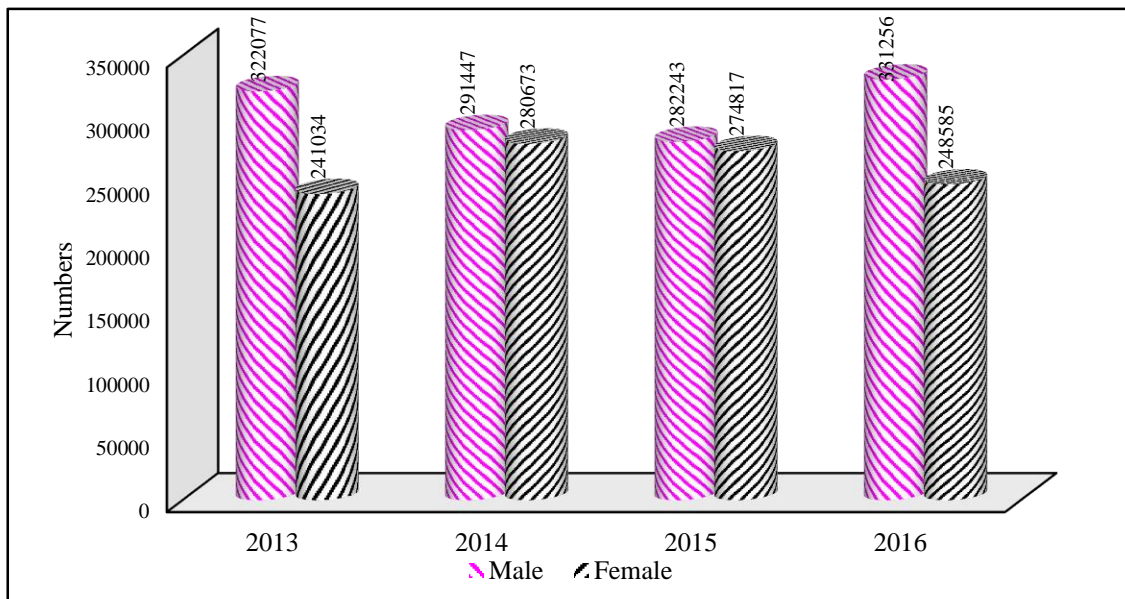


Figure 4.4: Total Number of Students Enrolled in Government Institution of AJ&K 2013 to 2016

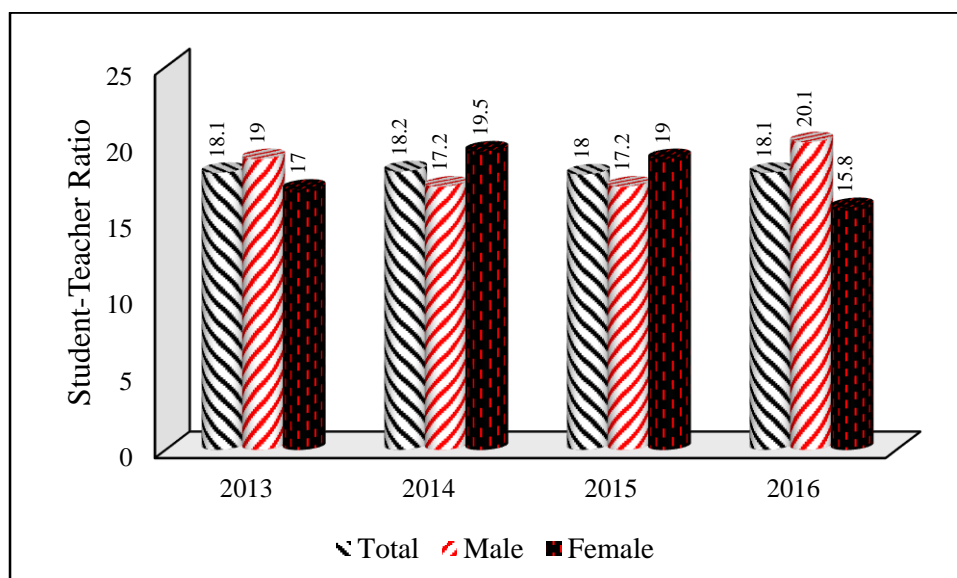
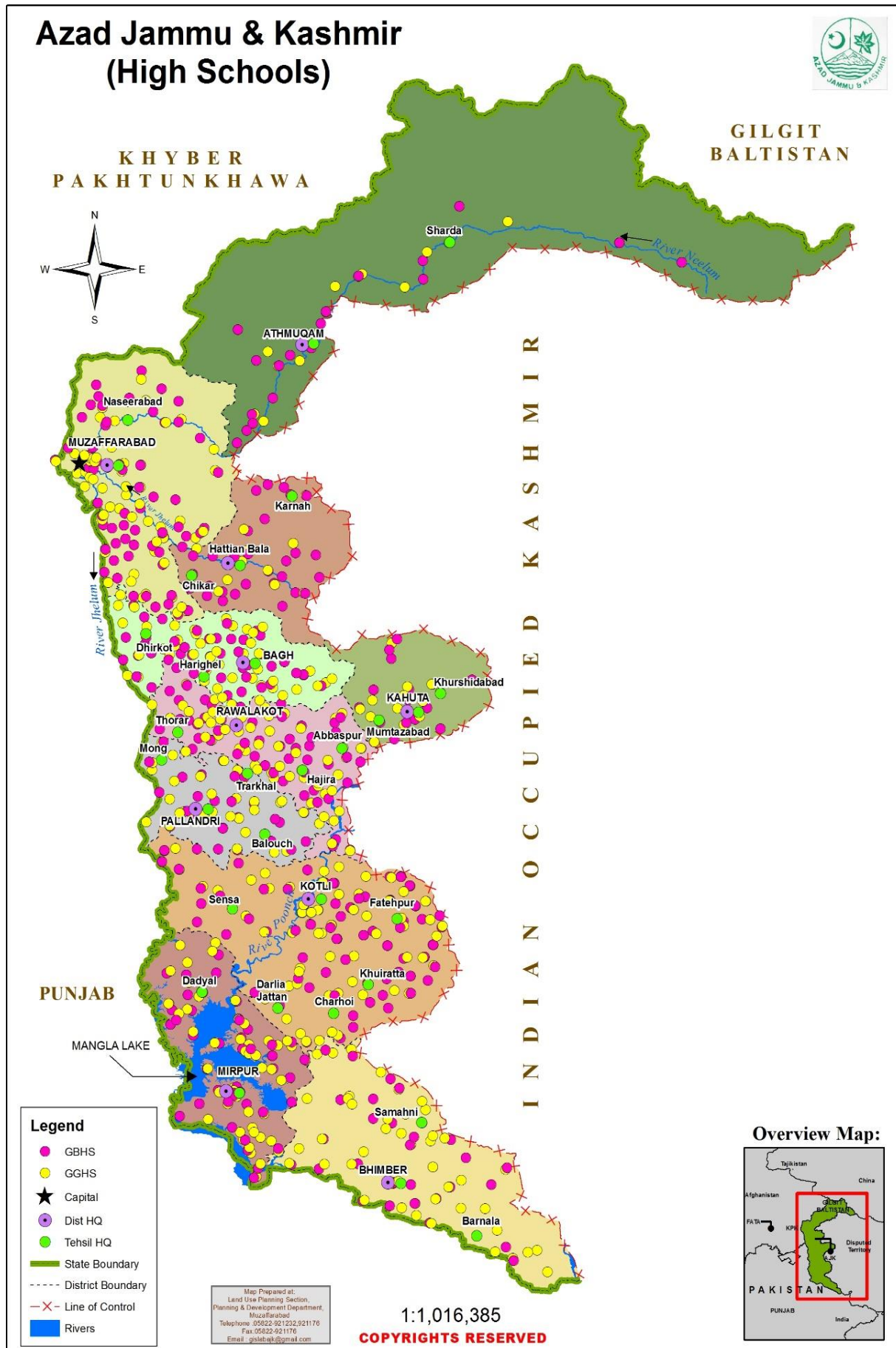


Figure 4.5: District-wise Student Teacher Ratio in Govt. Schools in AJ&K 2013 to 2016

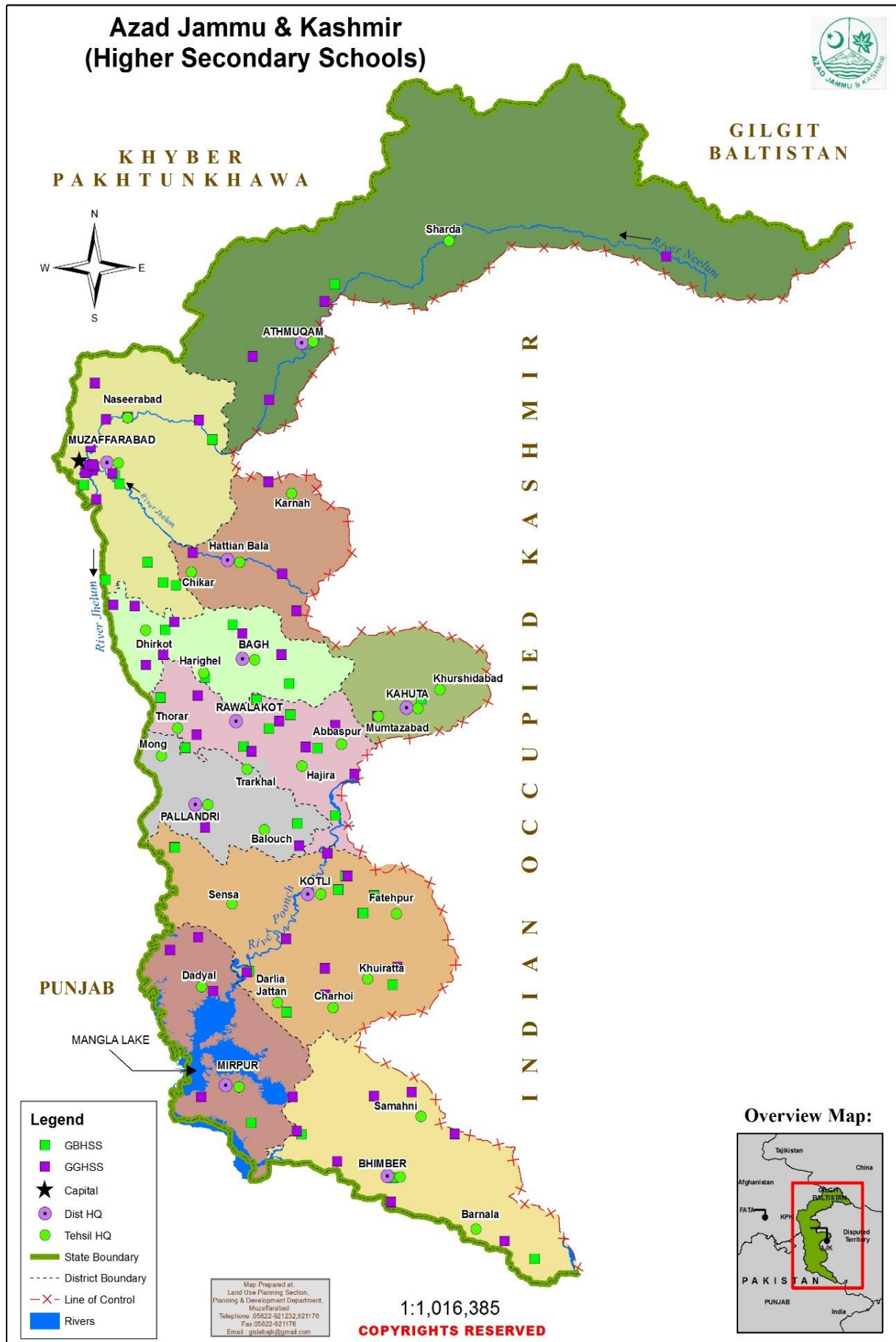

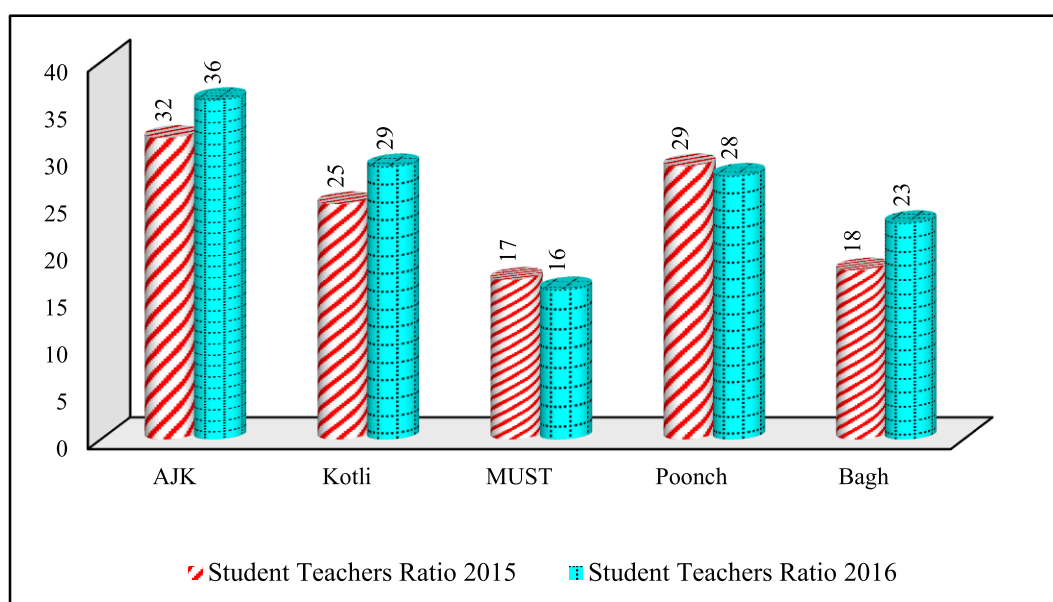


Figure 4.6: Student Teachers Ratio in the Universities of AJ&K 2014 to 2016

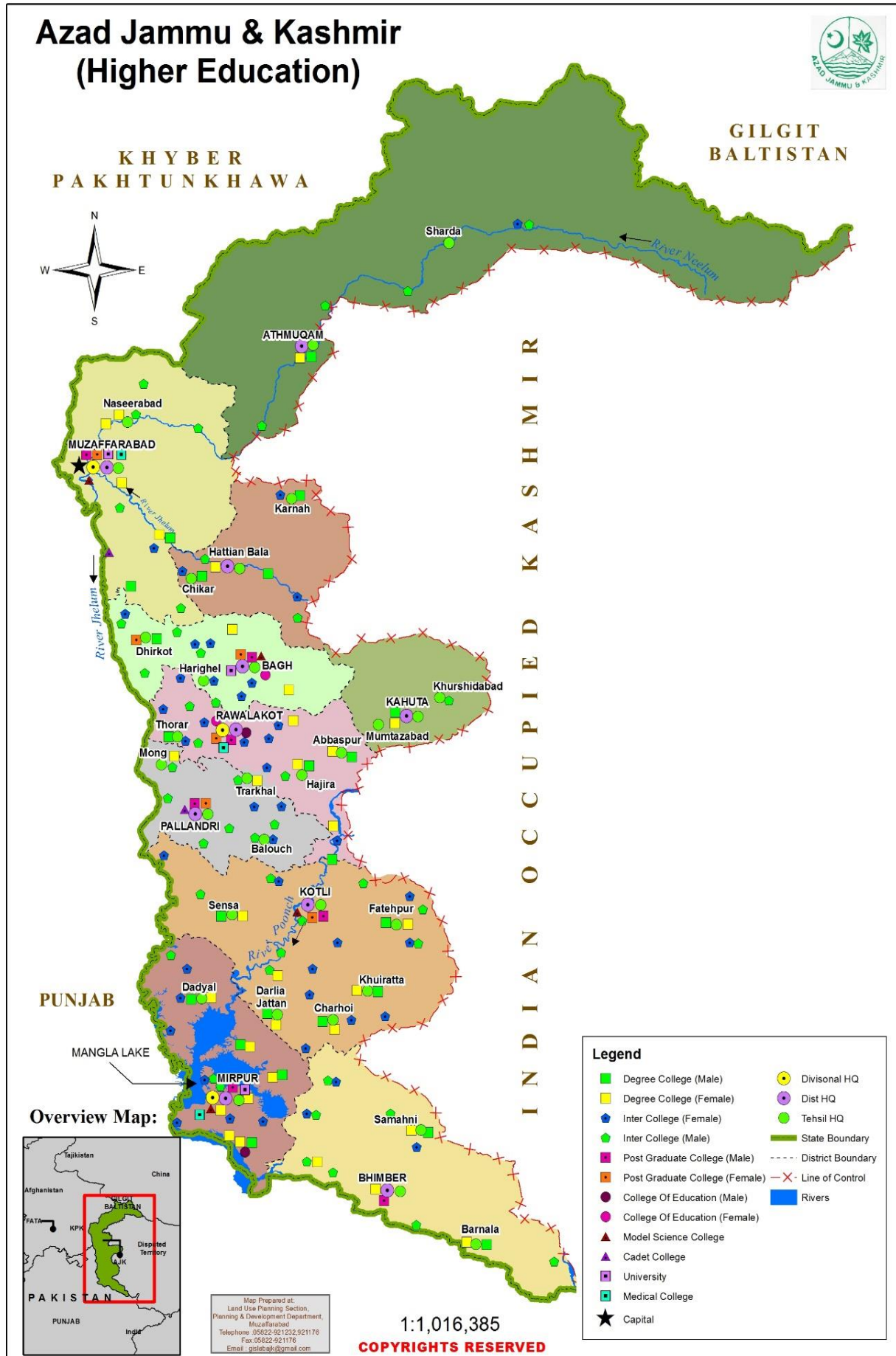

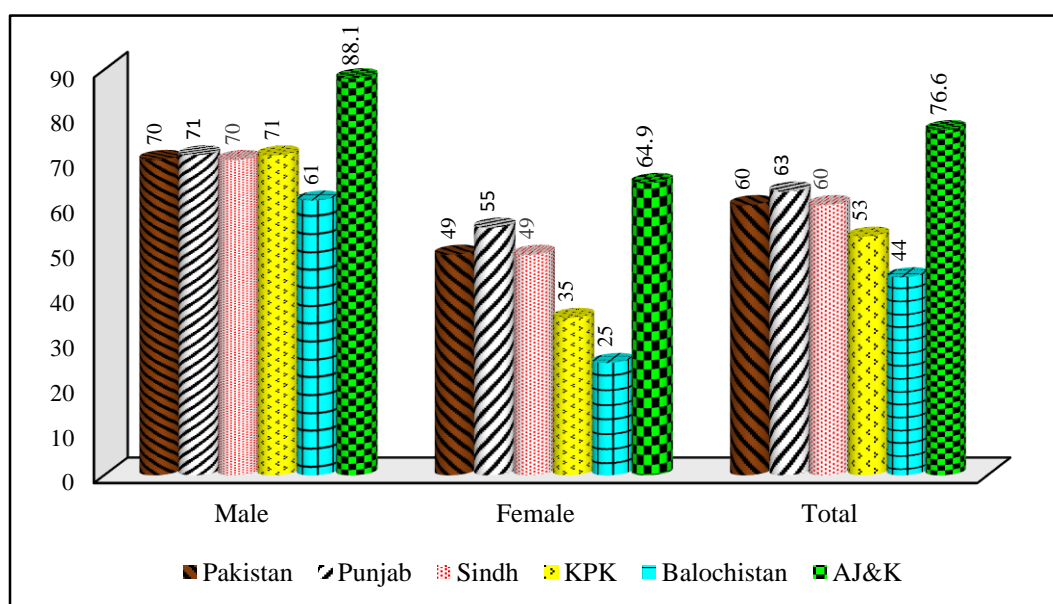


Figure 4.7: Literacy Rate of AJ&K and Provinces of Pakistan

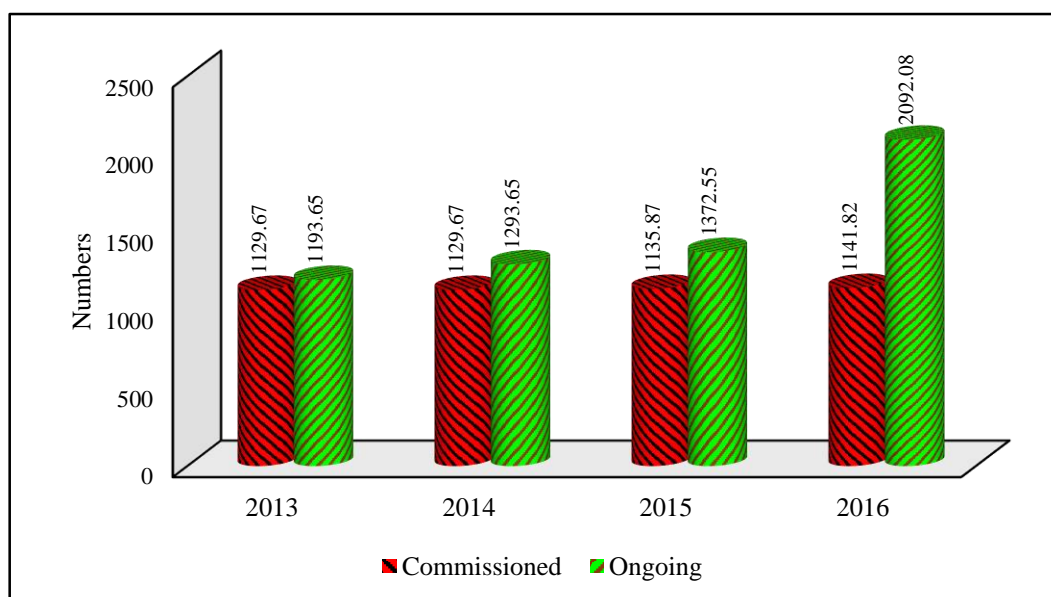


Figure 5.1: Power Capacity of Commissioned and Ongoing Power Projects in AJ&K 2013 to 2016

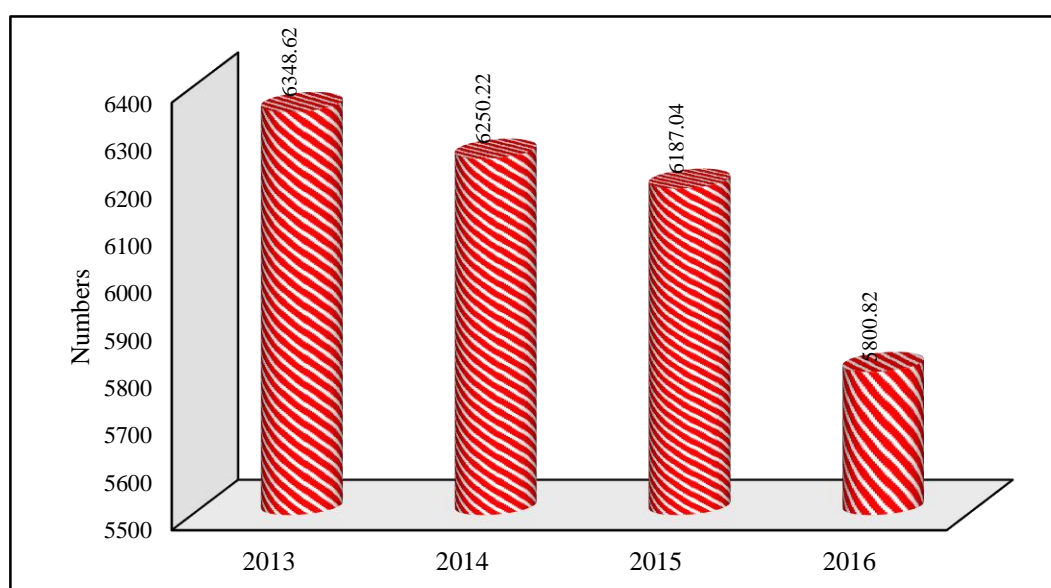


Figure 5.2: Power Capacity of Projects under Planning Process in AJ&K 2013 to 2016

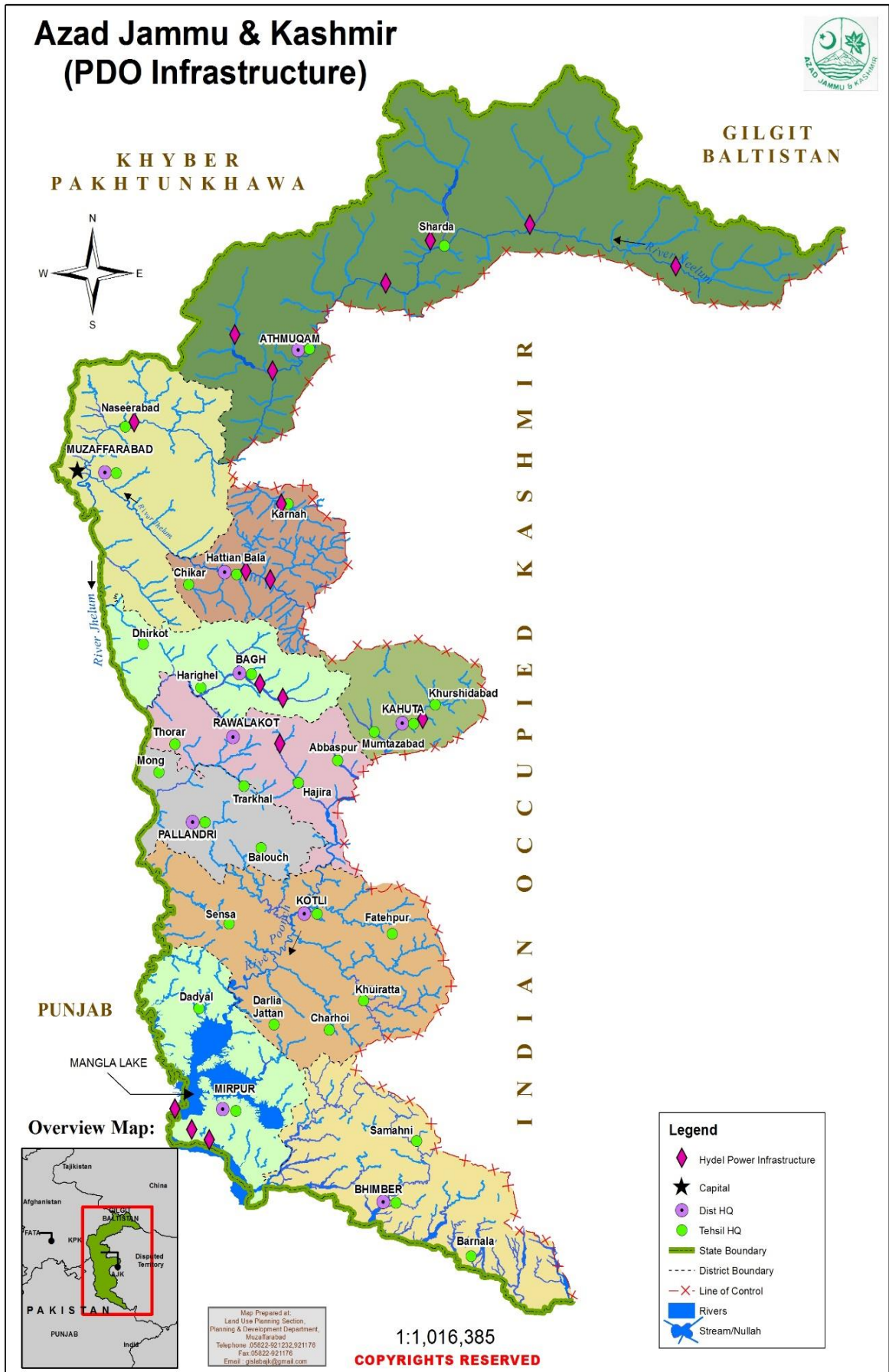

FORESTRY

Explanatory Notes

Protected Forests

The area under the control of the Forest Department.

Coniferous Forests

Natural forests of cone bearing trees with usually needle like leaves mostly occurring in the hilly areas at elevation of 3500 feet above the sea level.

Irrigated Plantations

Man-made forests in the shape of blocks in the canal irrigated track.

Riverian Forests

Forests occurring in varied sized patches along the river banks.

Linear Plantations

Rows of trees planted in the land strips, alongside canals, roads and railway lines.

Range Lands

Naturally vegetated lands uncultivated due to adverse ecological conditions useable for the production of forage for animal consumption.

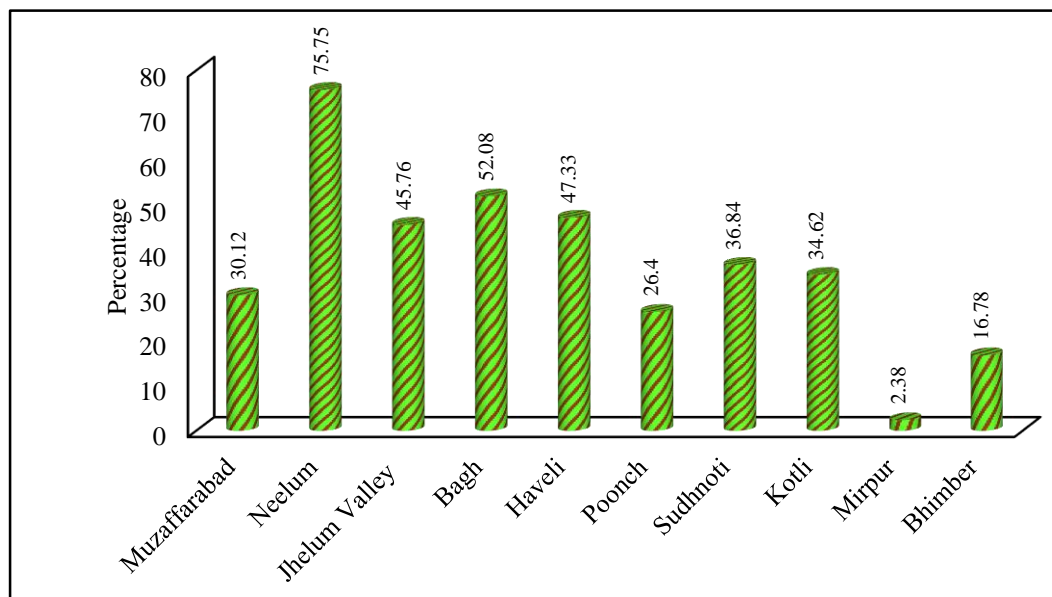


Figure 6.1: Percentage of District Area under different types of Forests in AJ&K 2016

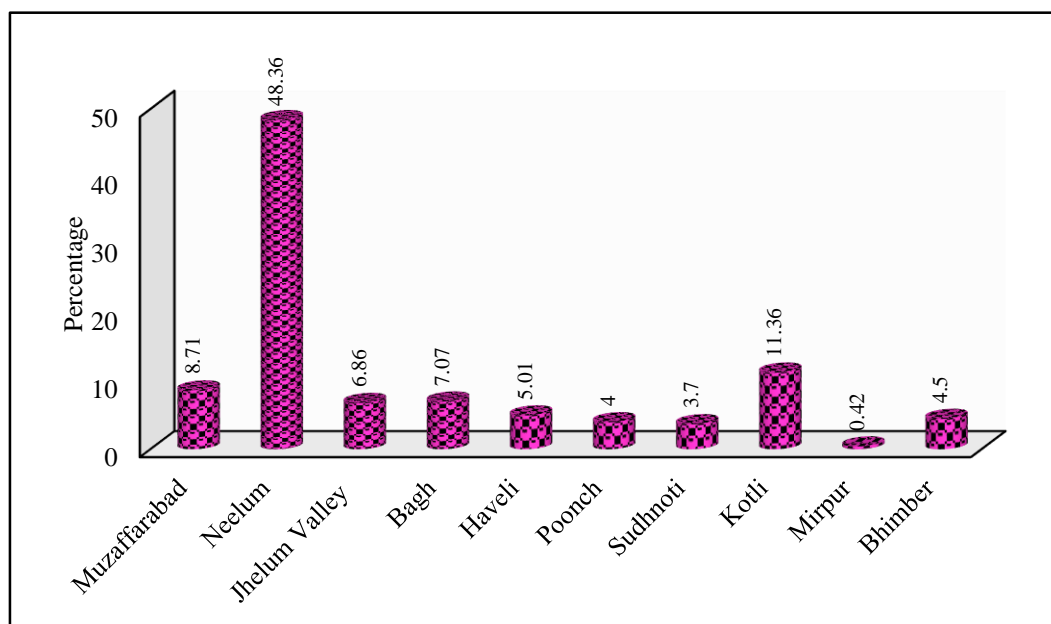


Figure 6.2: District wise Percentage of Area under different types of Forests in AJ&K 2016

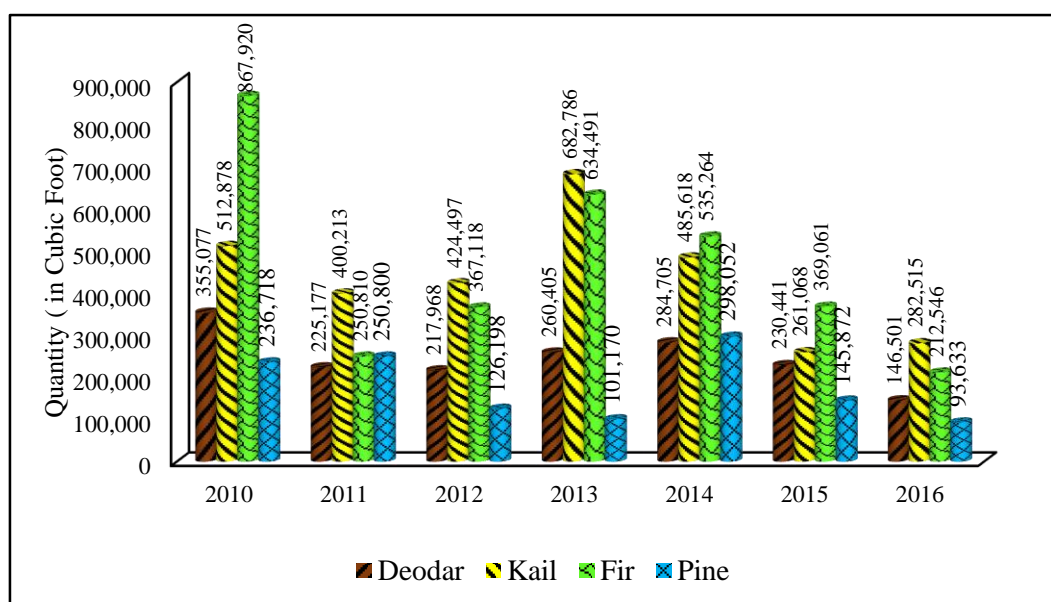

**Figure 6.3:** Quantity of Timber Production in AJ&K 2010 to 2016

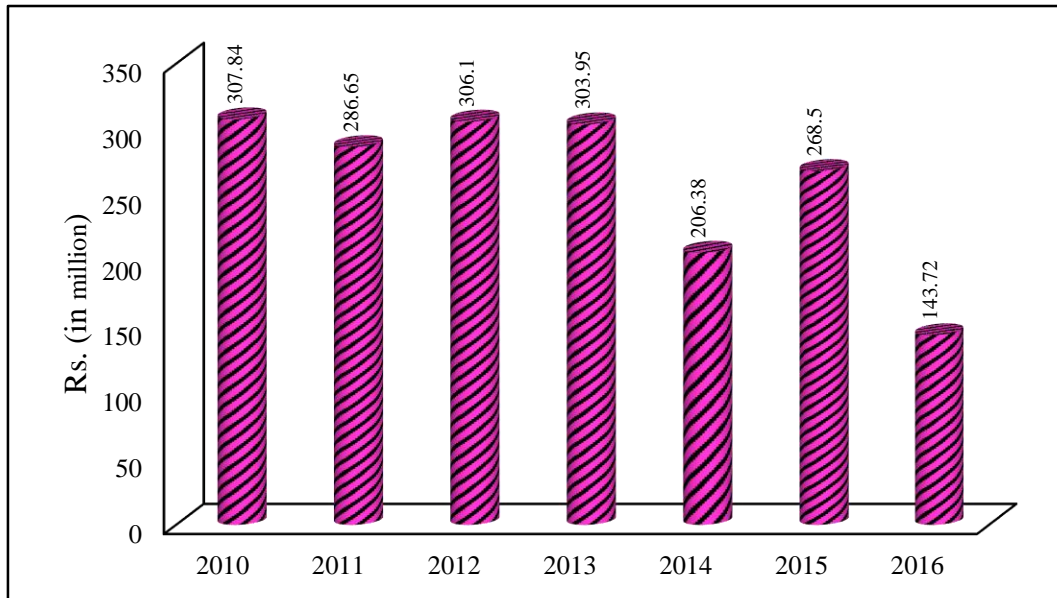


Figure 6.4: Value of Timber Production in AJ&K 2010 to 2016

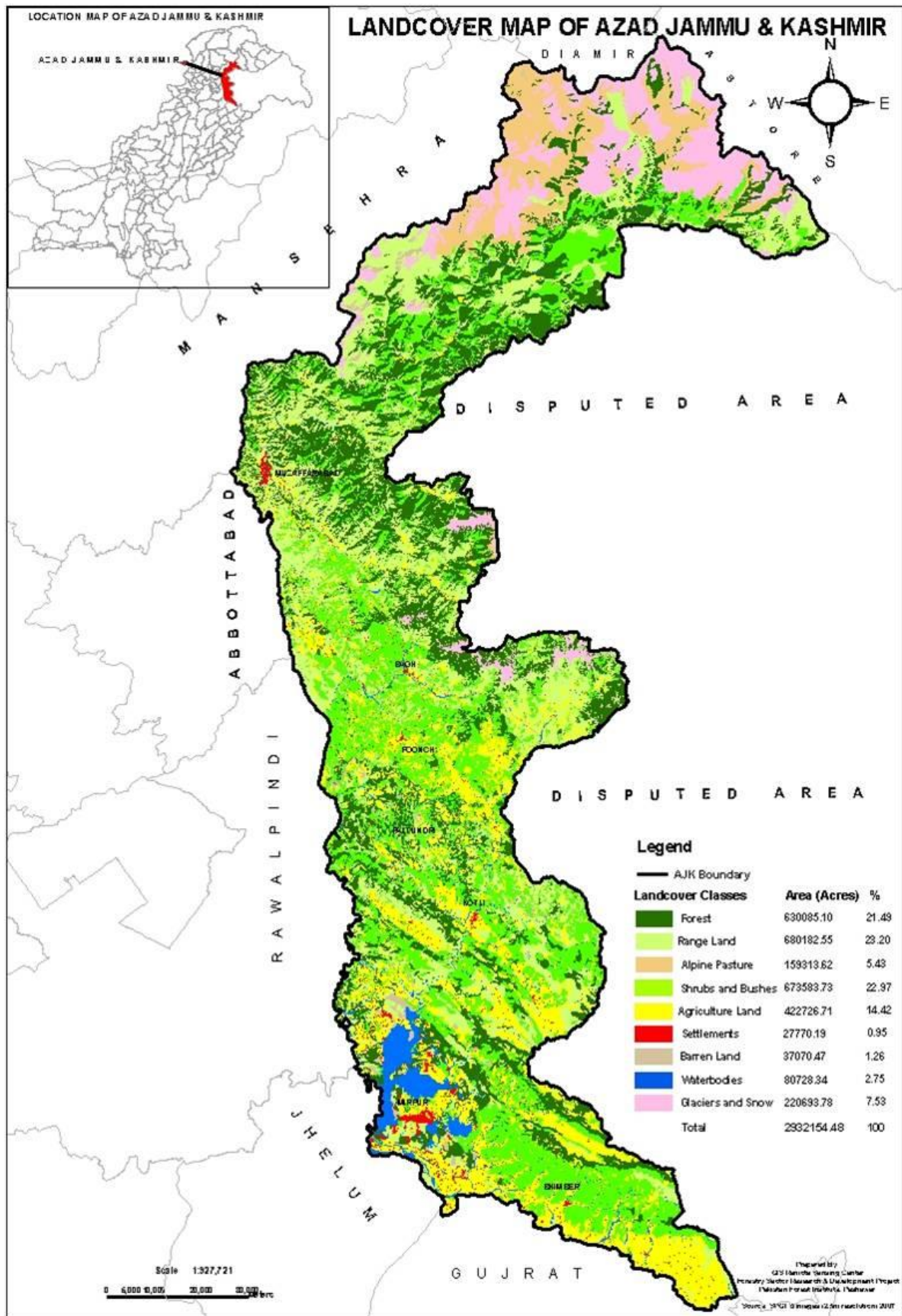

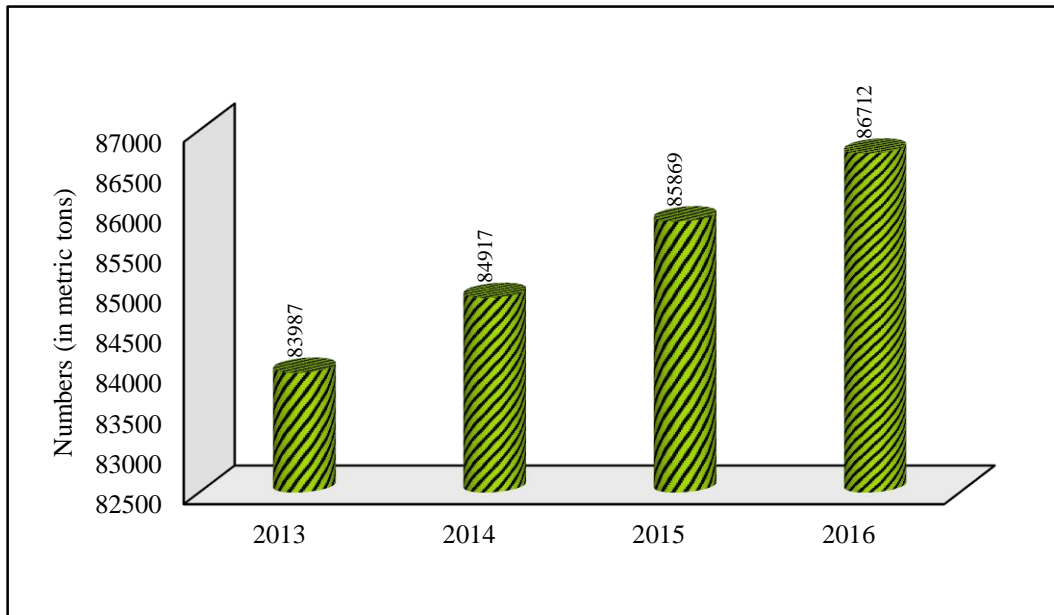


Figure 7.1: Production of Meat in AJ&K 2013 to 2016

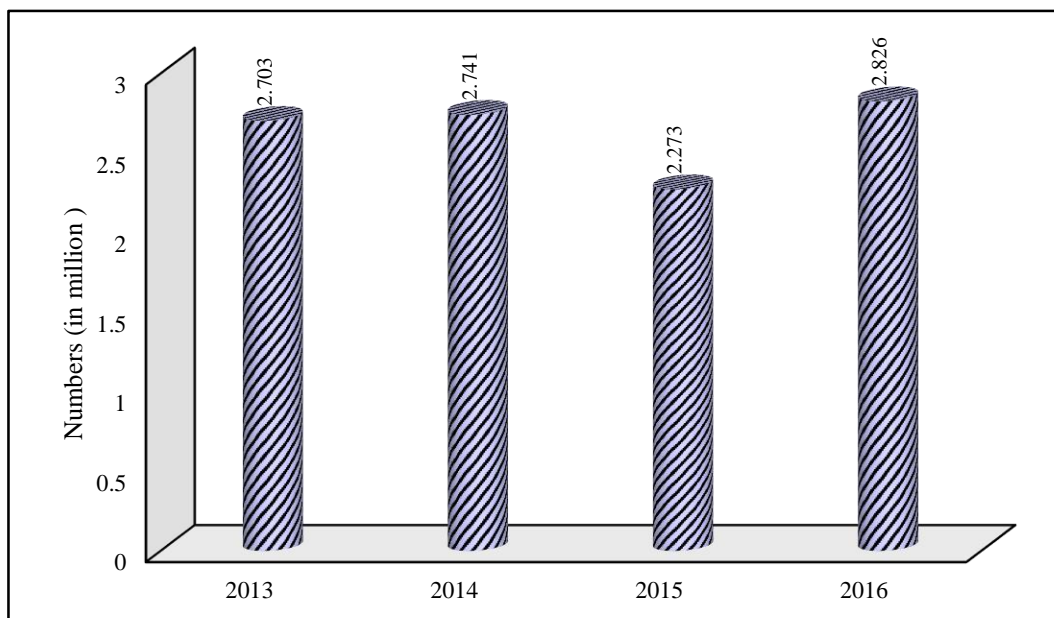


Figure 7.2: Production of Milk in AJ&K 2013 to 2016

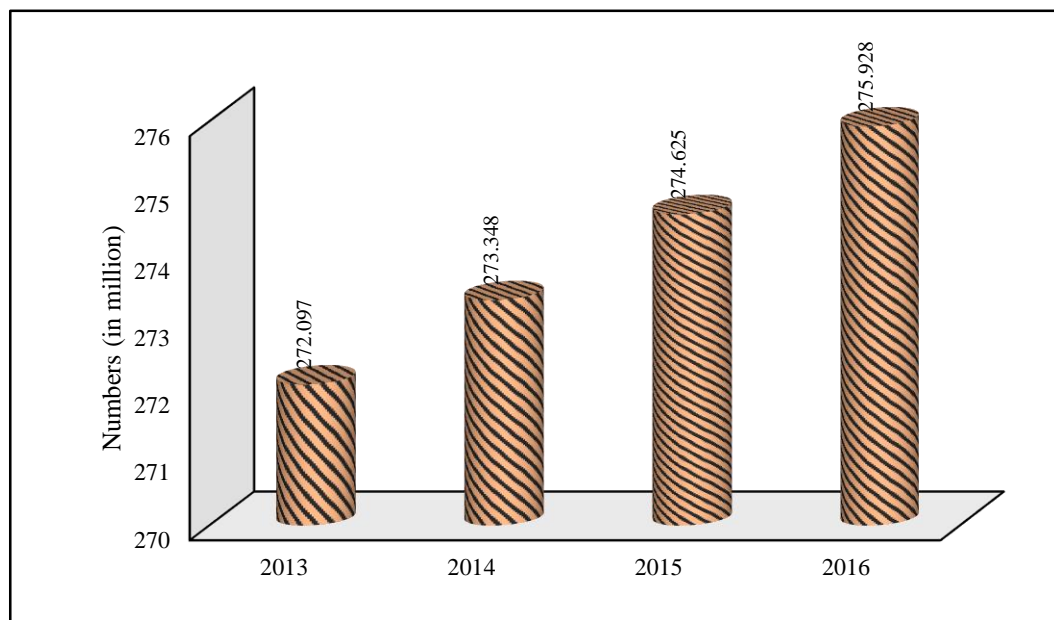


Figure 7.3: Production of Eggs in AJ&K 2013 to 2016



Chapter 8

AGRICULTURE

Definitions

1. **Casual Labour** means the labour employed occasionally on daily wage basis for a specific agricultural work.
2. **Cattle** is the collective name given to bovine animals.
3. **Crop Seasons** define the cropping pattern in Azad Jammu & Kashmir. The cropping pattern of the State is bifurcated as Kharif and Rabi and all type of crops are sown in these two seasons. Detail of both seasons are
 - a. **Kharif crop** are sown in the summer from April to June in late summer or early winter during October to December.
 - b. **Rabi crop** are sown in the winter from October to December and harvested in late winter to early summer from April to May.
4. **Farm** is the aggregate area of land operated by member(s) of one household alone or with the assistance of member(s) of others household(s) without regard to location, size or title and normally used for crop production. Farms wholly uncultivated during the census year are also included in this category. The term “Farm” is synonymous to a holding.
5. **Land Tenure** refers to the rights / arrangements under which the land is operated. Land tenure may be of following types
 - a. **Owner Farm:** A farm in which the entire land is owned by the operator himself.
 - b. **Tenant Farm:** A farm in which the entire land is taken from other household(s) against the fixed rent in cash or kind or a share in the produce or against any other terms and conditions.
 - c. **Owner-Cum-Tenant Farm:** A farm in which a part of land area is owned by the operator household and the remaining is taken from other household(s) against rent or share of the produce or any other terms and conditions.
6. **Mouza or Deh** is a demarcated territorial unit for which separate revenue record including the a cadastral map is maintained by the provincial revenue departments. One Mouze / Deh may contain one or more population settlements or may have no settlement.
7. **Cropping Intensity** represents the total cropped area in terms of total cultivated area multiplied by 100, i.e.

$$\text{Cropping intensity} = \frac{\text{Total Cropped Area}}{\text{Total Cultivated Area}} \times 100$$

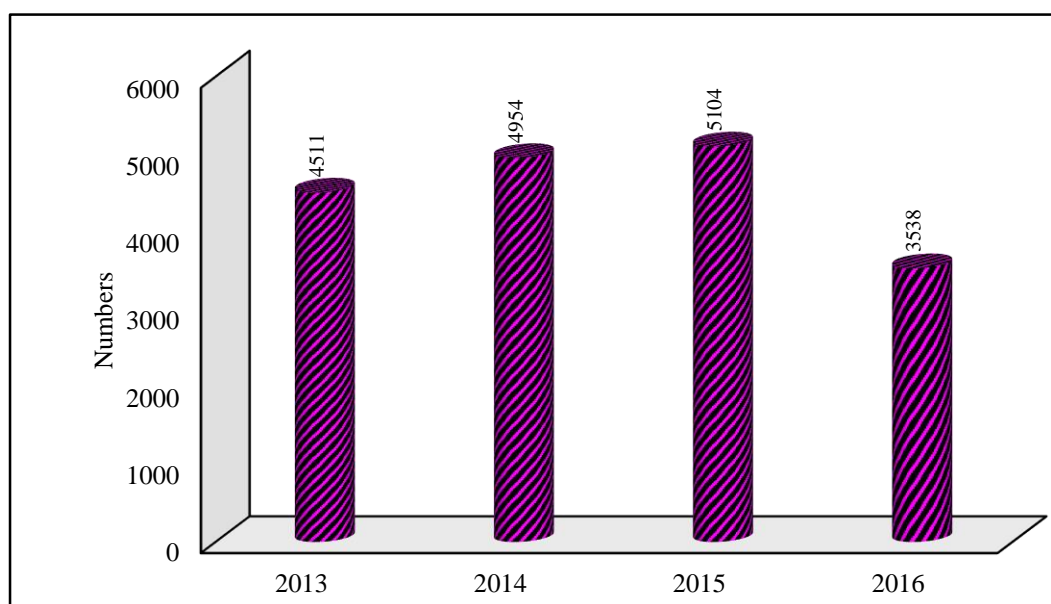


Figure 8.1: No. of Loanees 2013 to 2016

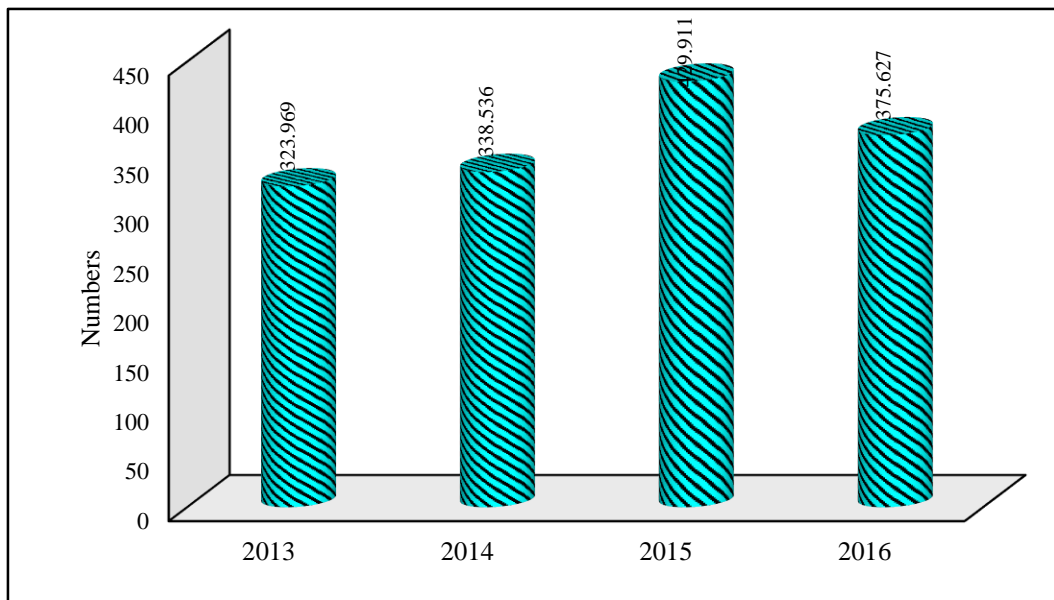


Figure 8.2: Loan advanced/disbursement 2013 to 2016

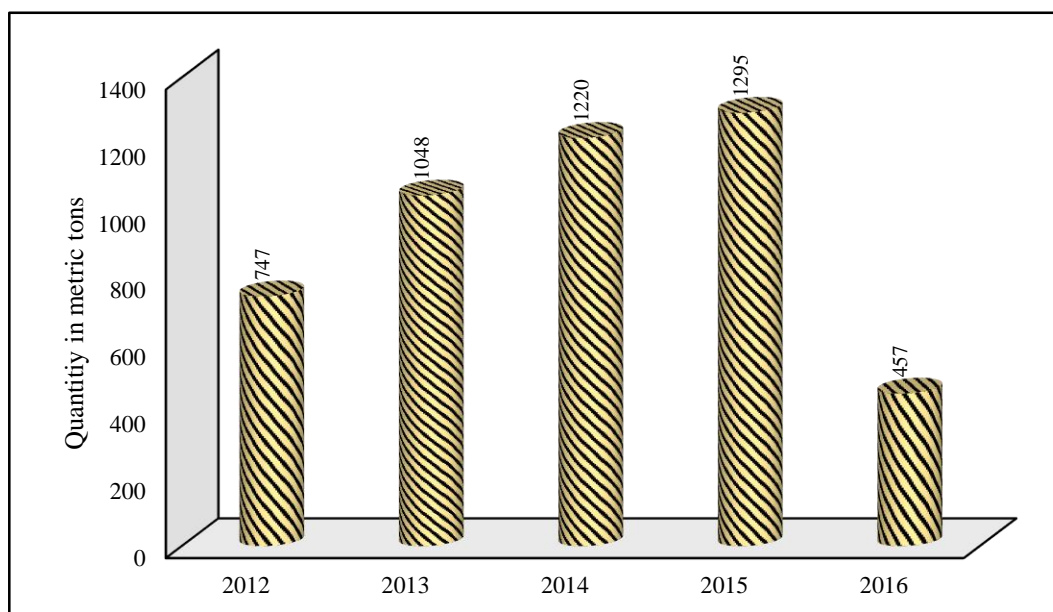


Figure 9.1: Quantity of Fish Production in (Metric Tons) 2012 to 2016

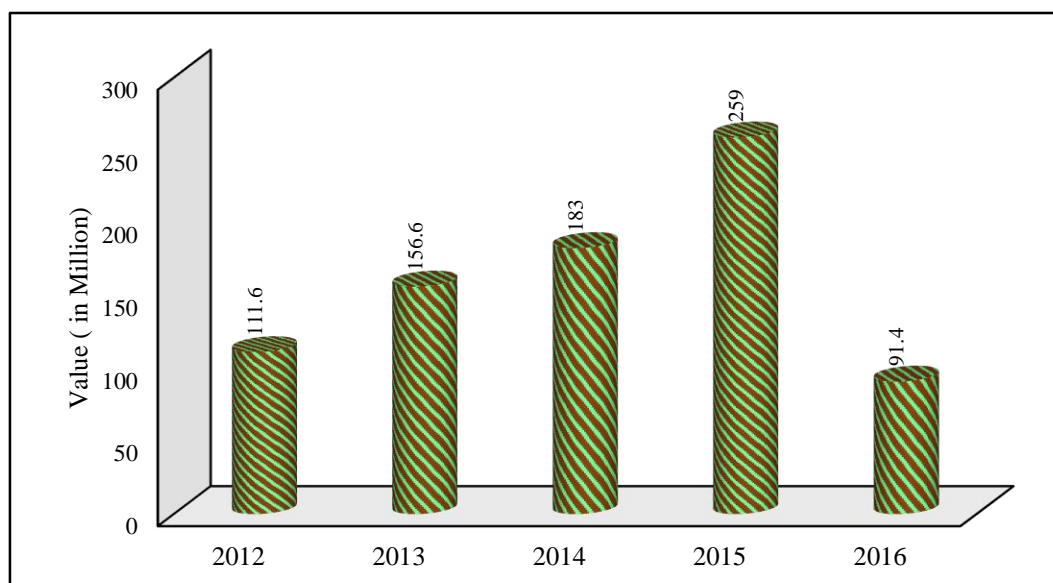


Figure 9.2: Value of Fish Production (in Million) 2013 to 2016

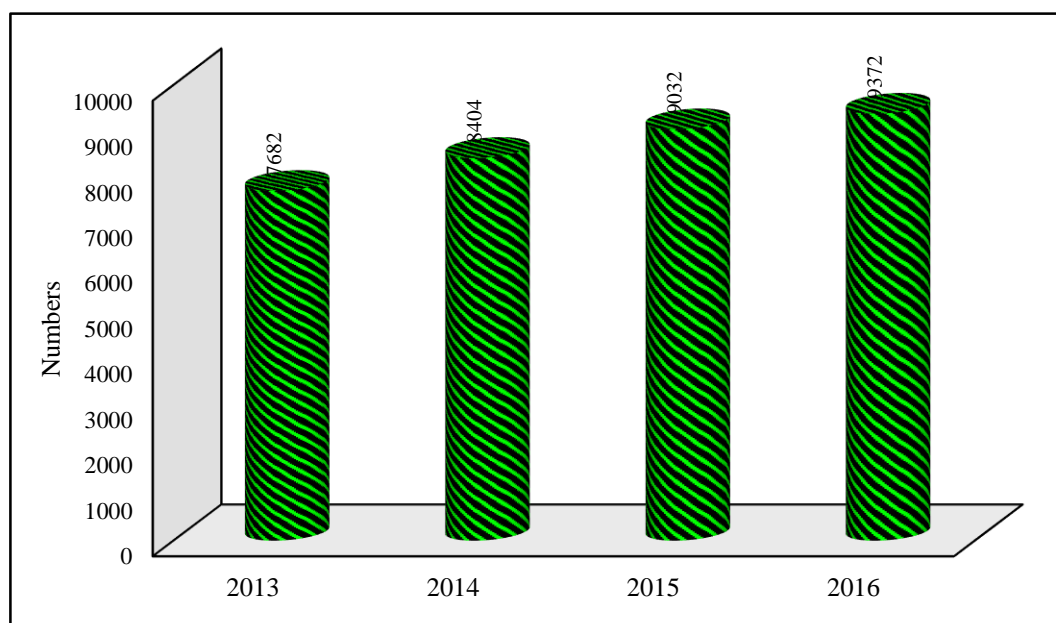


Figure 10.1: Metaled Road in AJ&K 2013 to 2016

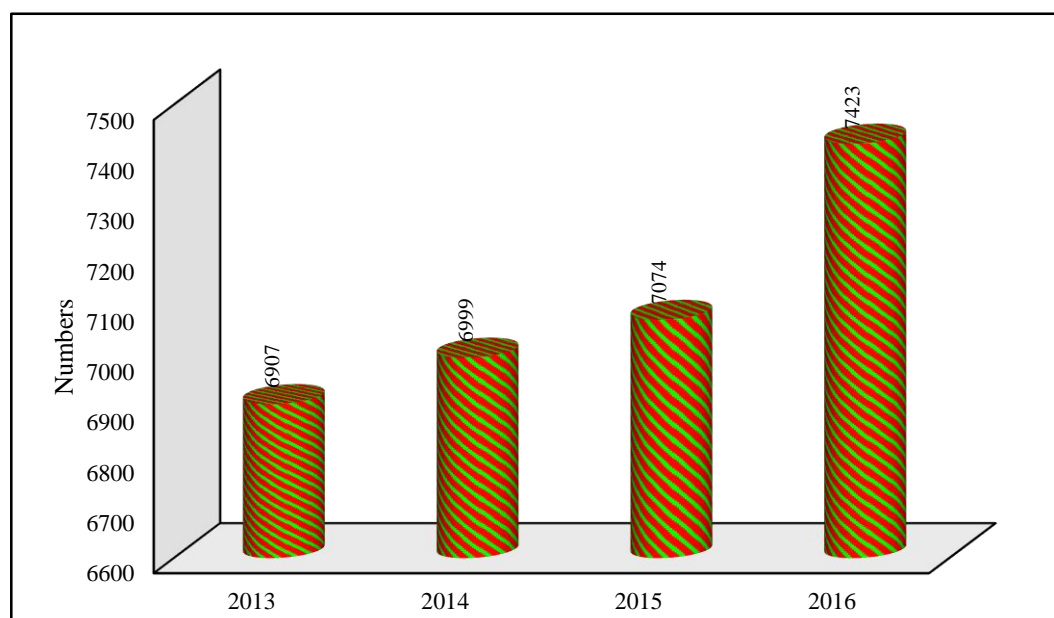


Figure 10.2: Fair weather Road in AJ&K 2013 to 2016

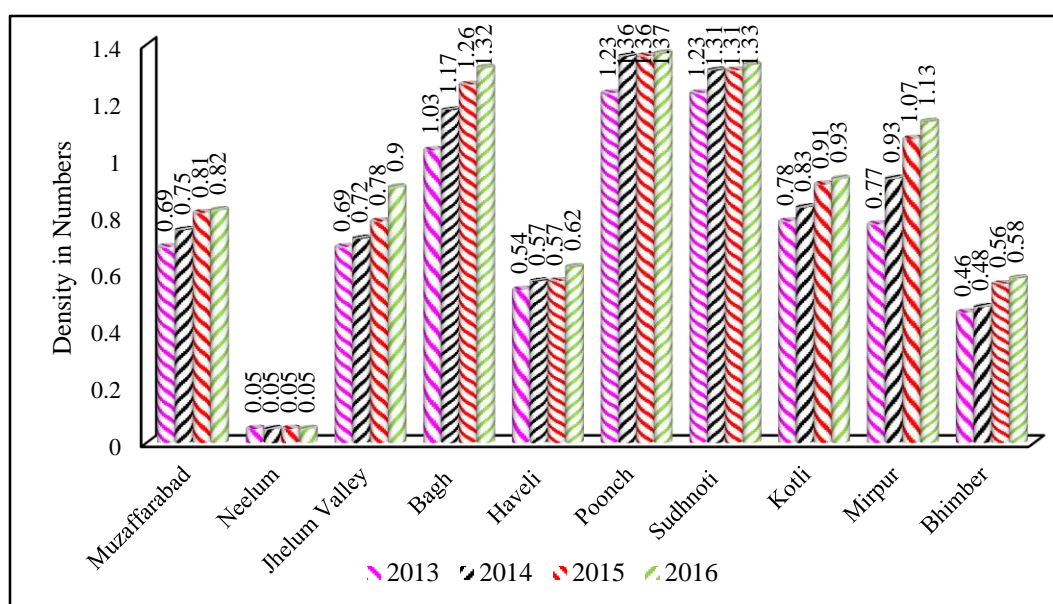


Figure 10.3: District-wise Metaled Road Density in AJ&K 2013 to 2016

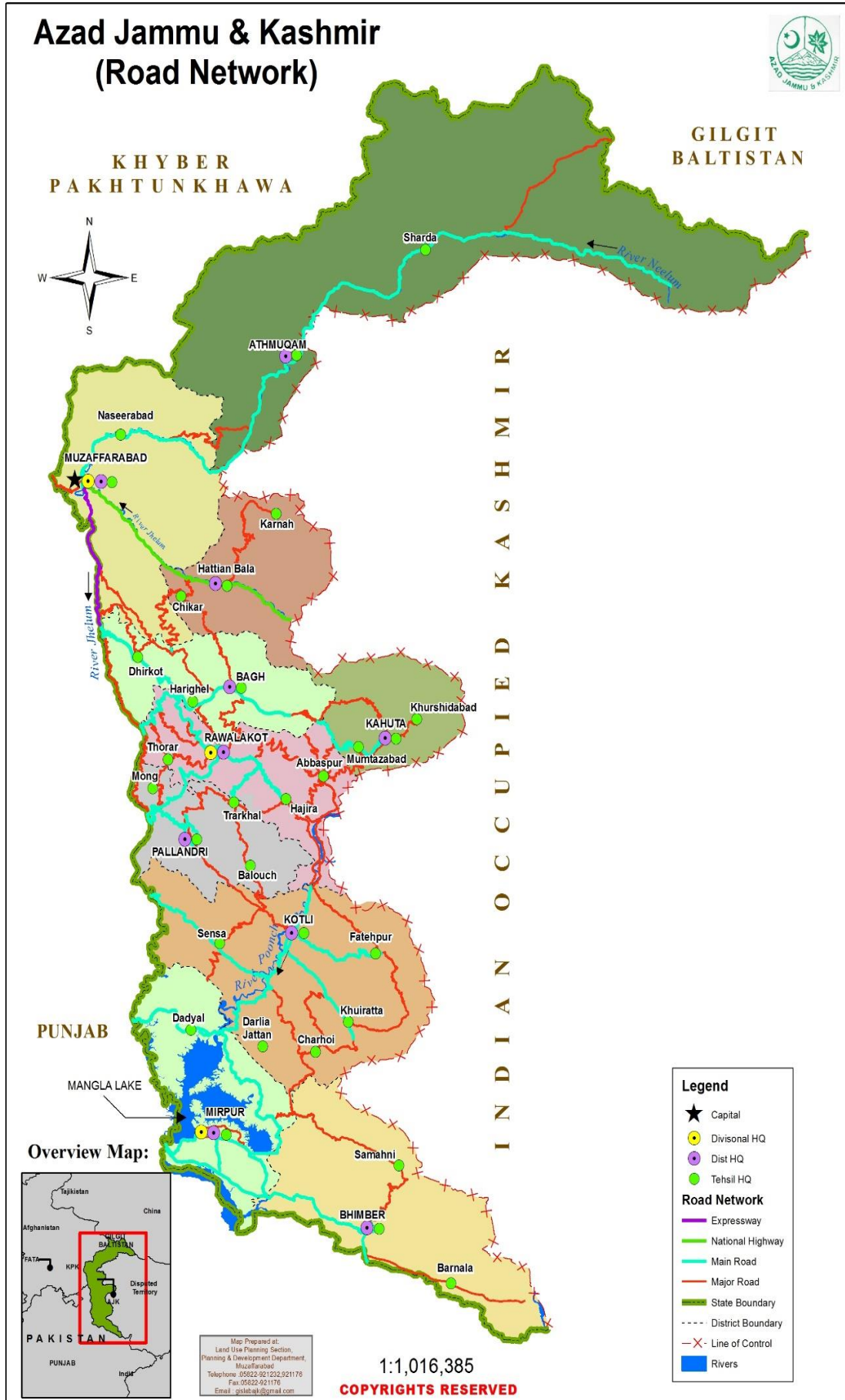

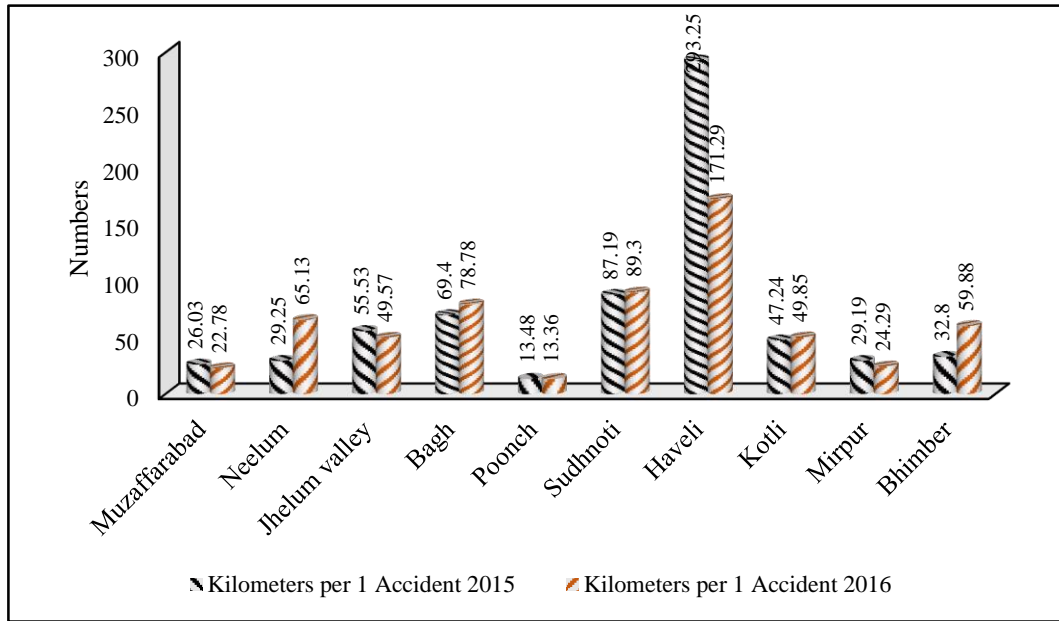


Figure 10.4: Kilometers of Road per 1 Accident in different districts of AJ&K 2015 to 2016

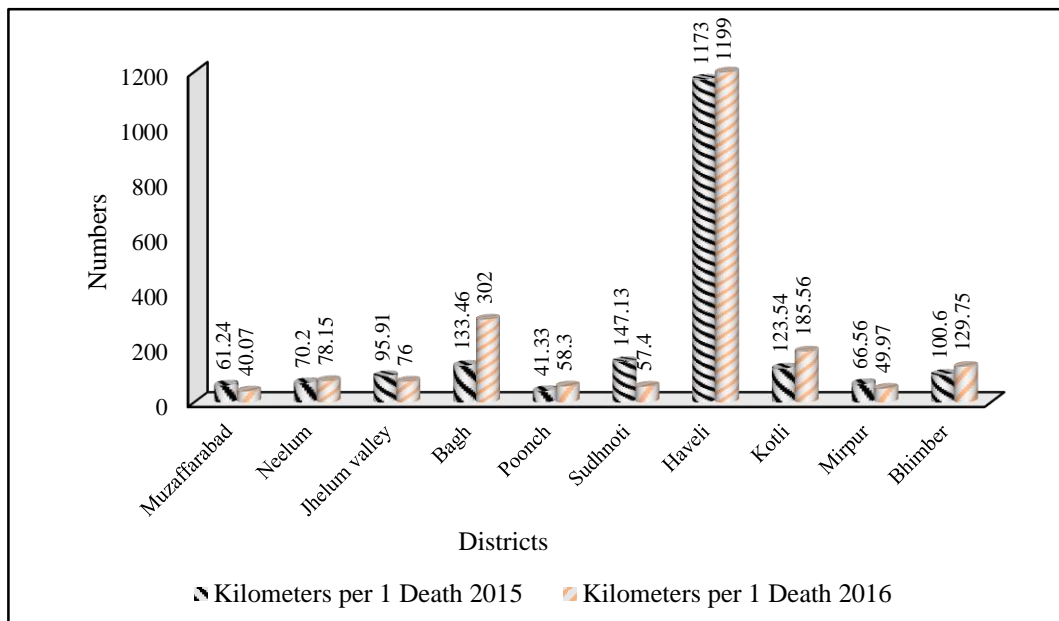


Figure 10.5: Kilometers of Road per 1 Injured Person in different districts of AJ&K 2013 to 2016

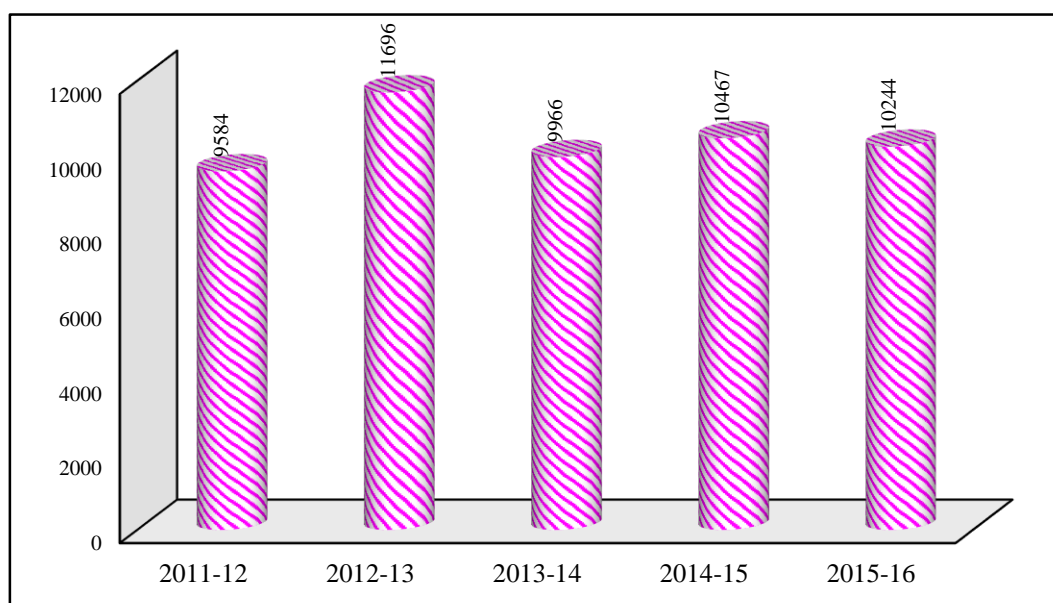


Figure 11.1: Number of Vehicles Registered in AJ&K 2011-12 to 2015-16

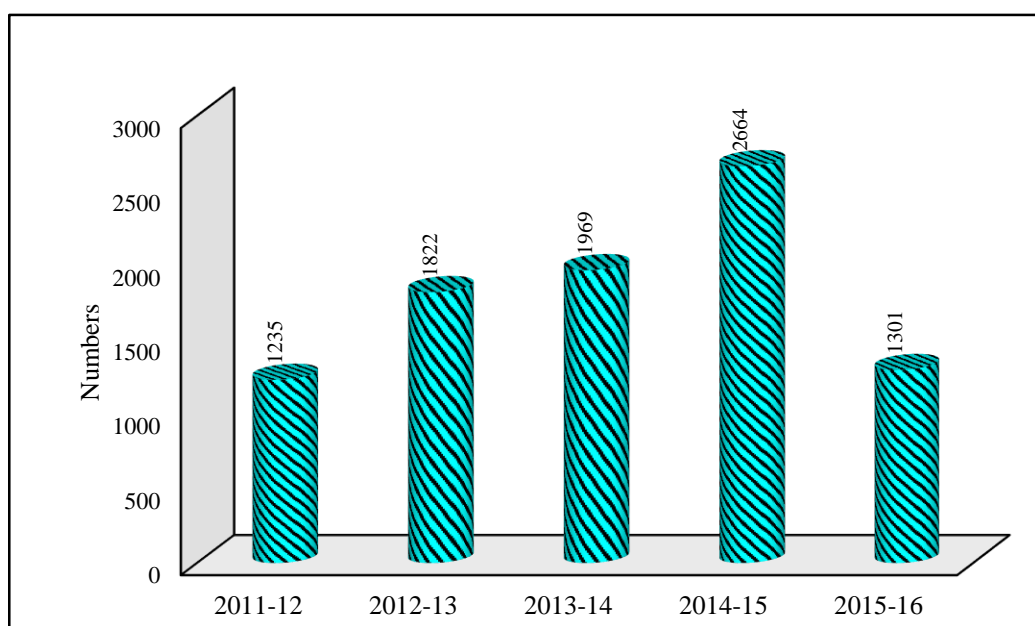


Figure 11.2: Number of Vehicles Registered in Muzaffarabad Division 2011-12 to 2015-16

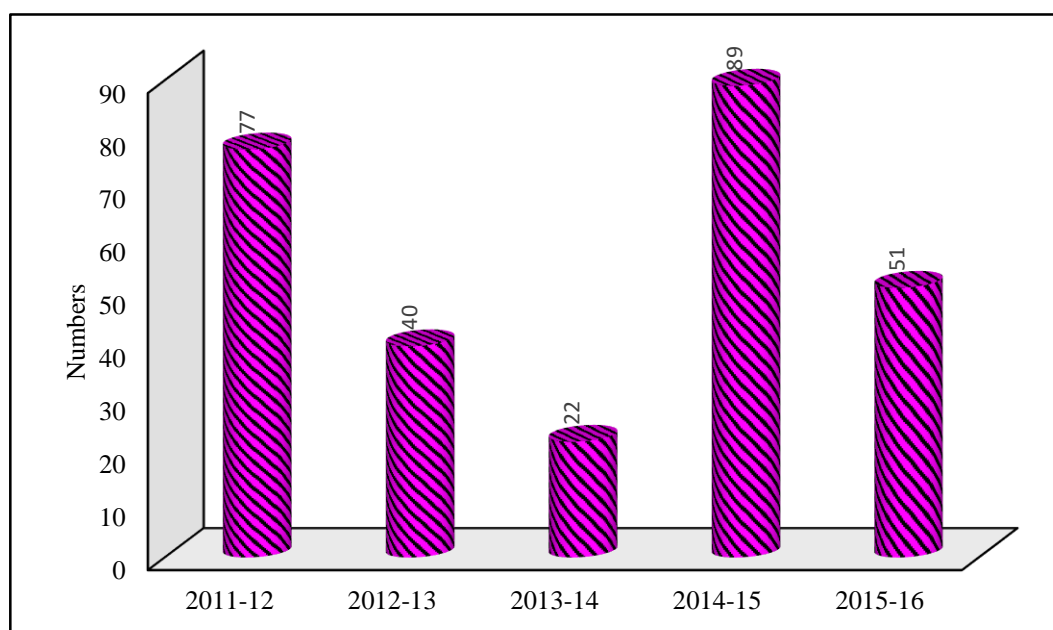
**Figure 11.3:** Number of Vehicles Registered in Bagh and Haveli 2011-12 to 2015-16

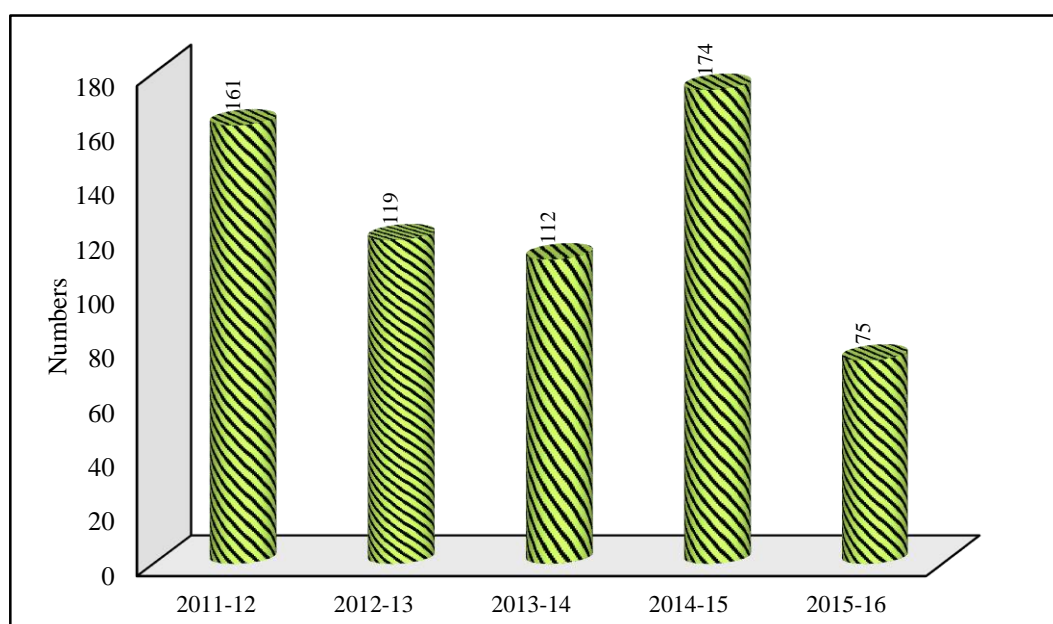
**Figure 11.4:** Number of Vehicles Registered in District Poonch 2011-12 to 2015-16

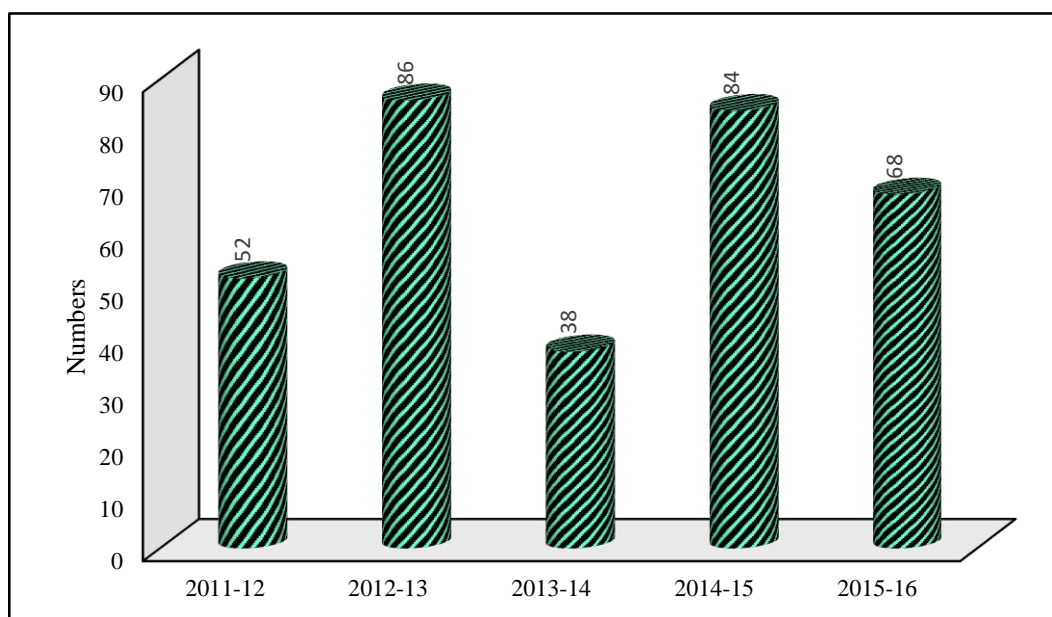


Figure 11.5: Number of Vehicles Registered in District Sudhnoti 2011-12 to 2015-16

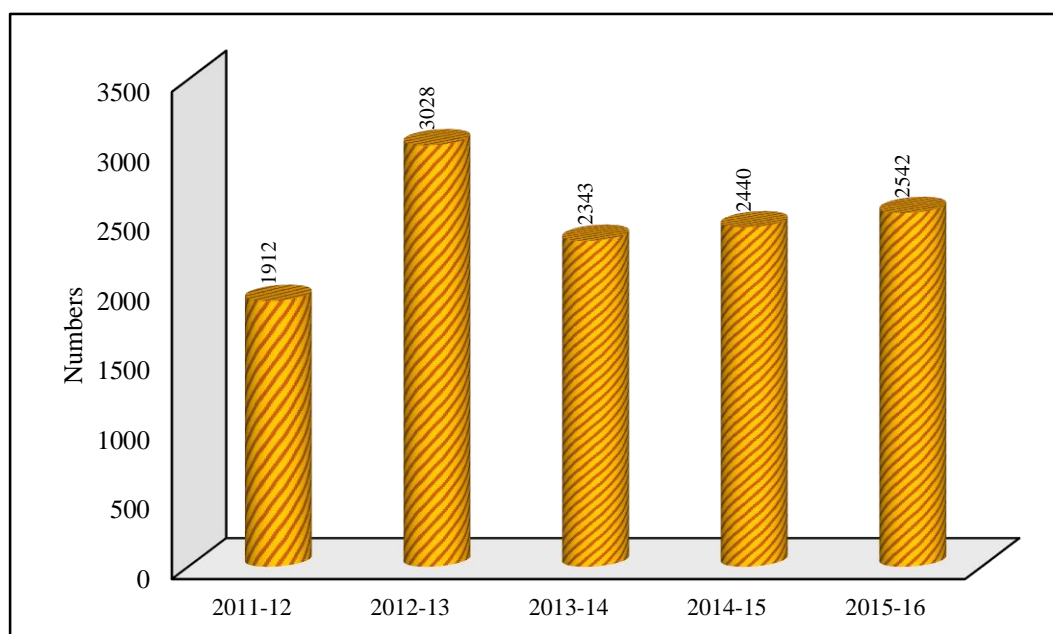


Figure 11.6: Number of Vehicles Registered in District Kotli 2011-12 to 2015-16

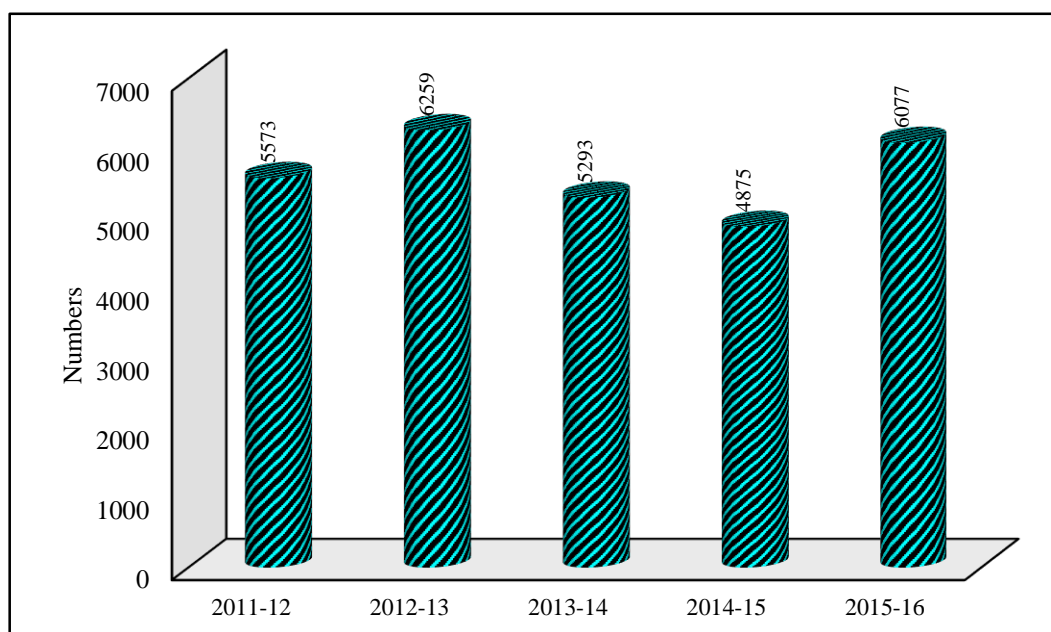


Figure 11.7: Number of Vehicles Registered in District Mirpur 2011-12 to 2015-16

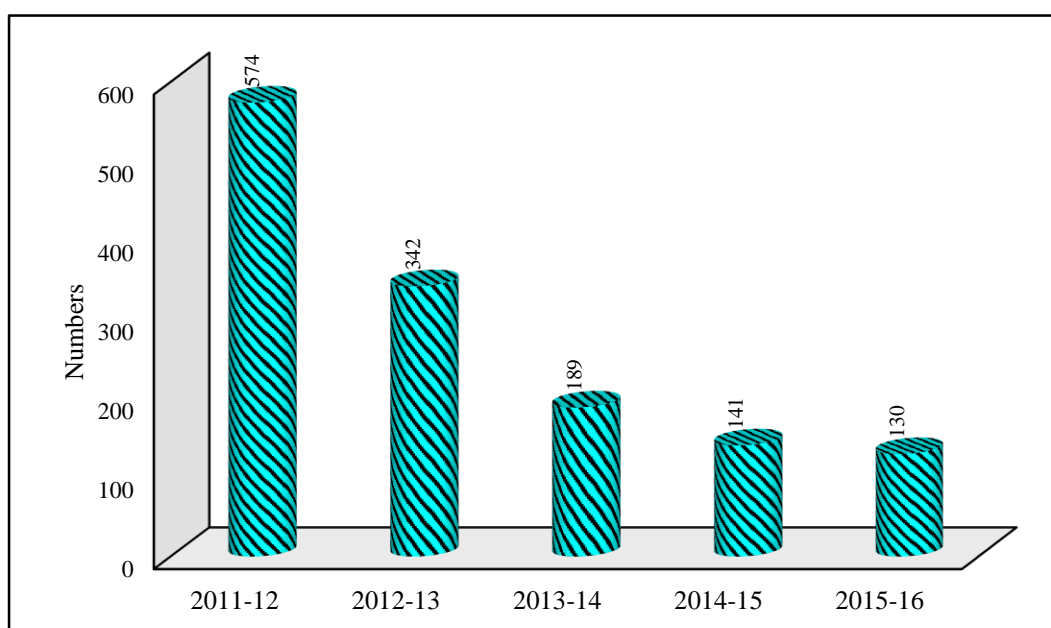



Figure 11.8: Number of Vehicles Registered in District Bhimber 2011-12 to 2015-16

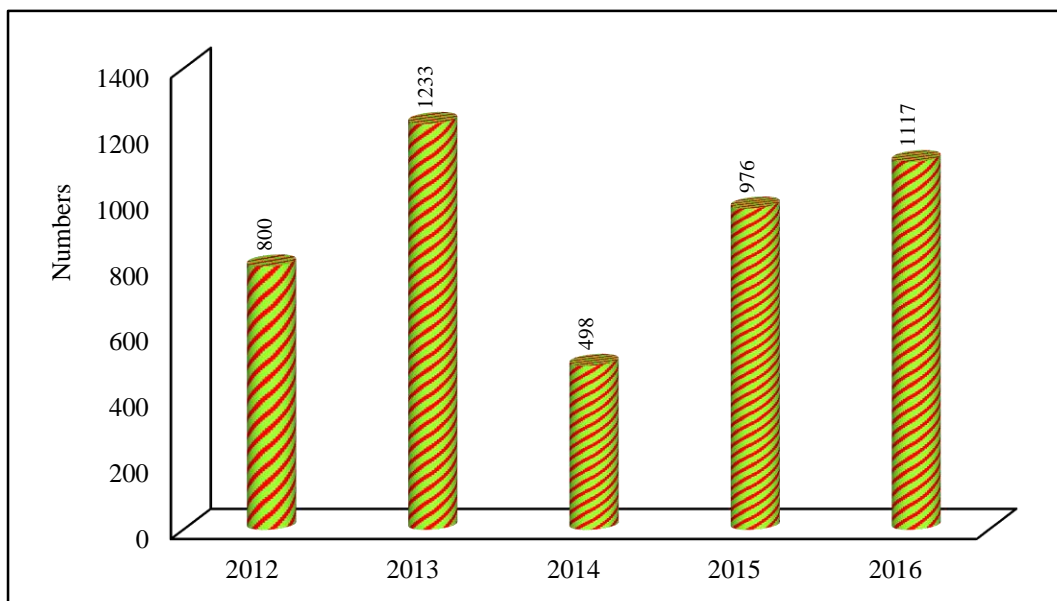


Figure 12.1: Number of Reported Crimes in District Muzaffarabad 2012 to 2016

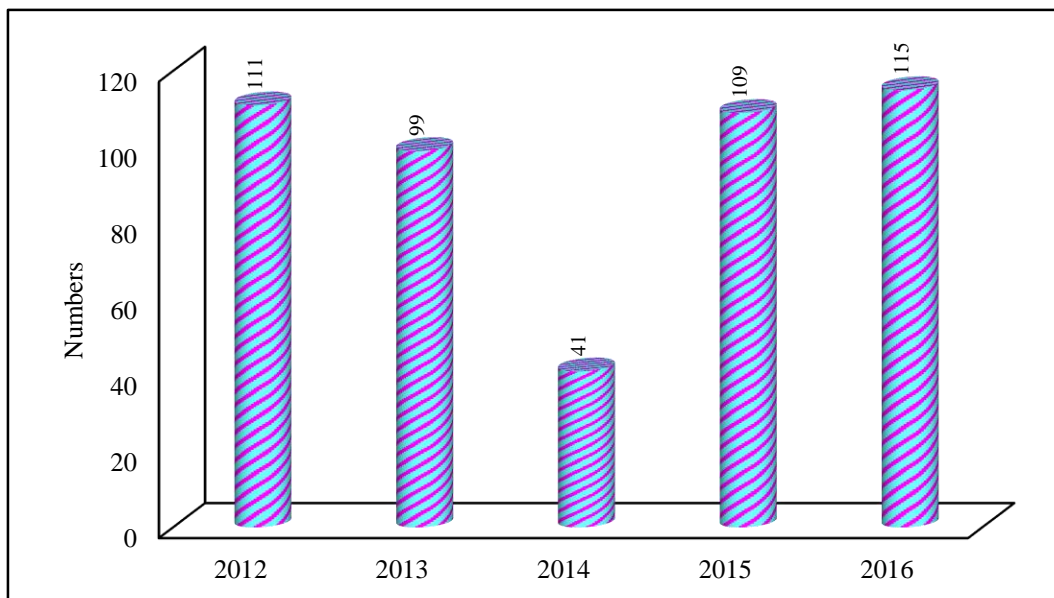


Figure 12.2: Number of Reported Crimes in District Neelum 2012 to 2016

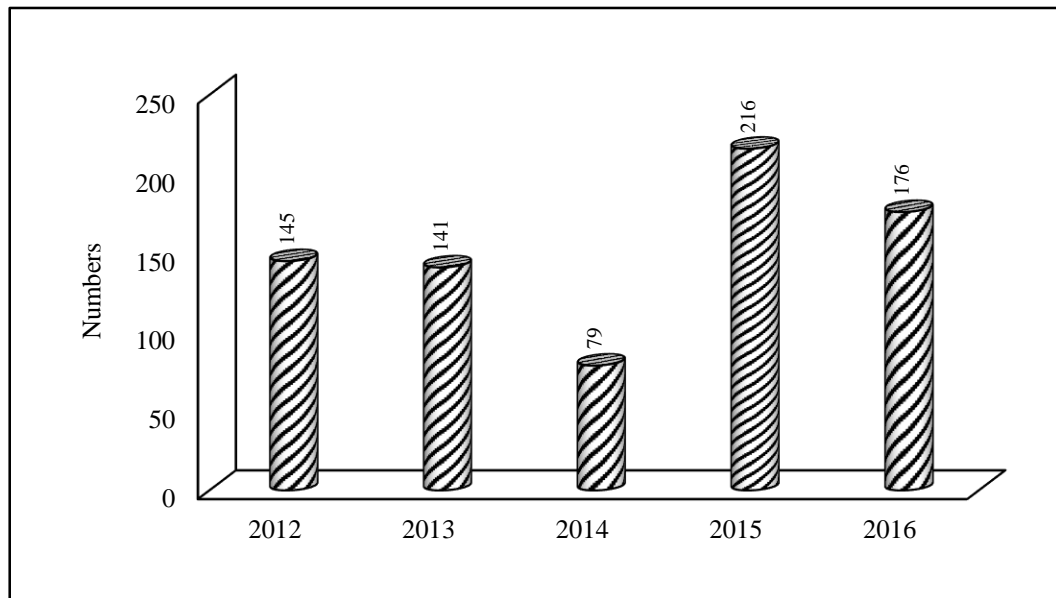


Figure 12.3: Number of Reported Crimes in District Jhelum Valley 2012 to 2016

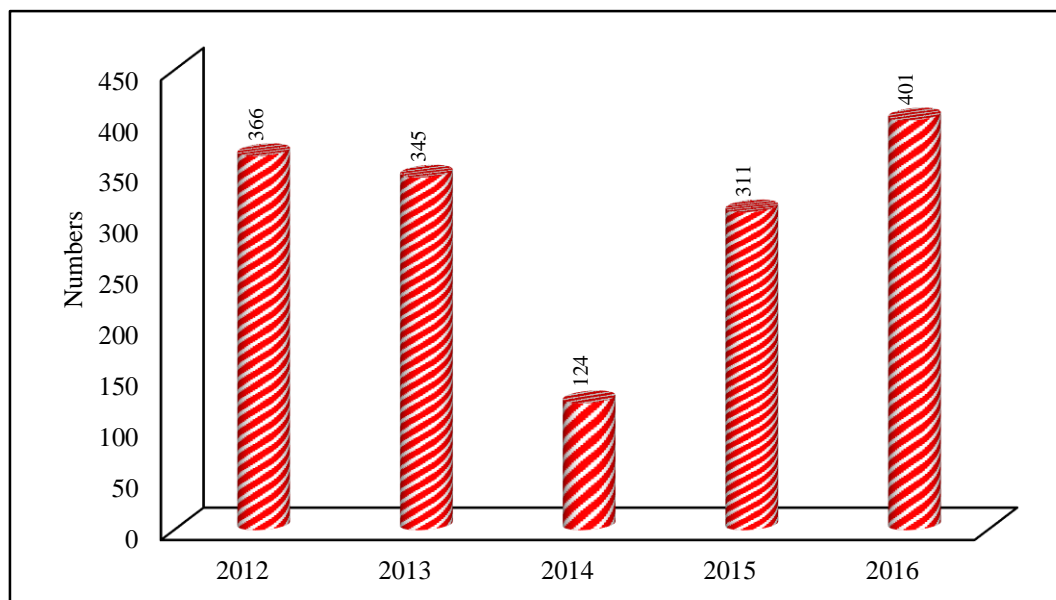


Figure 12.4: Number of Reported Crimes in District Bagh 2012 to 2016

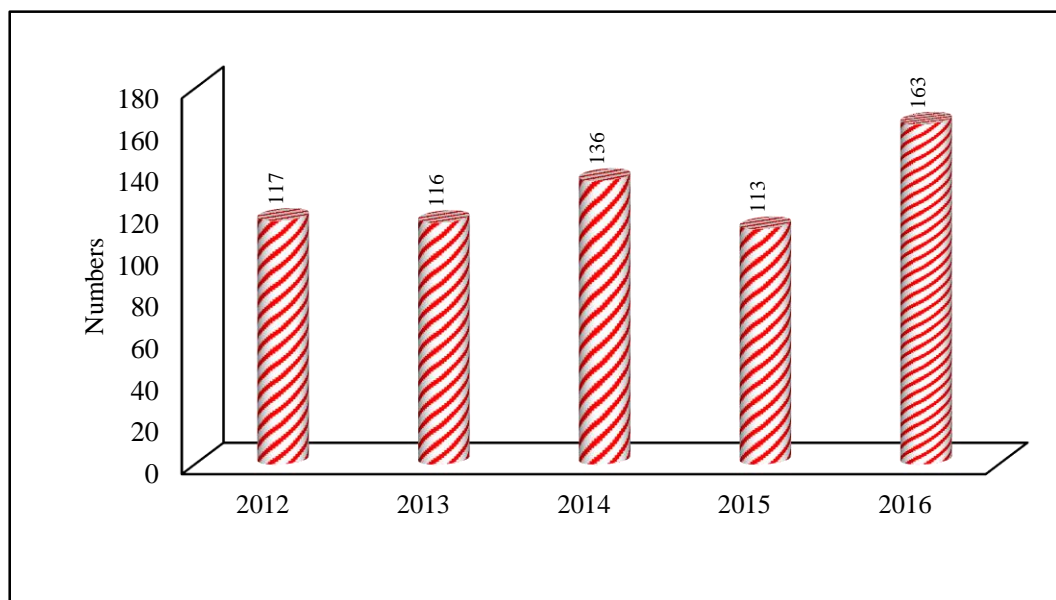


Figure 12.5: Number of Reported Crimes in District Haveli 2012 to 2016

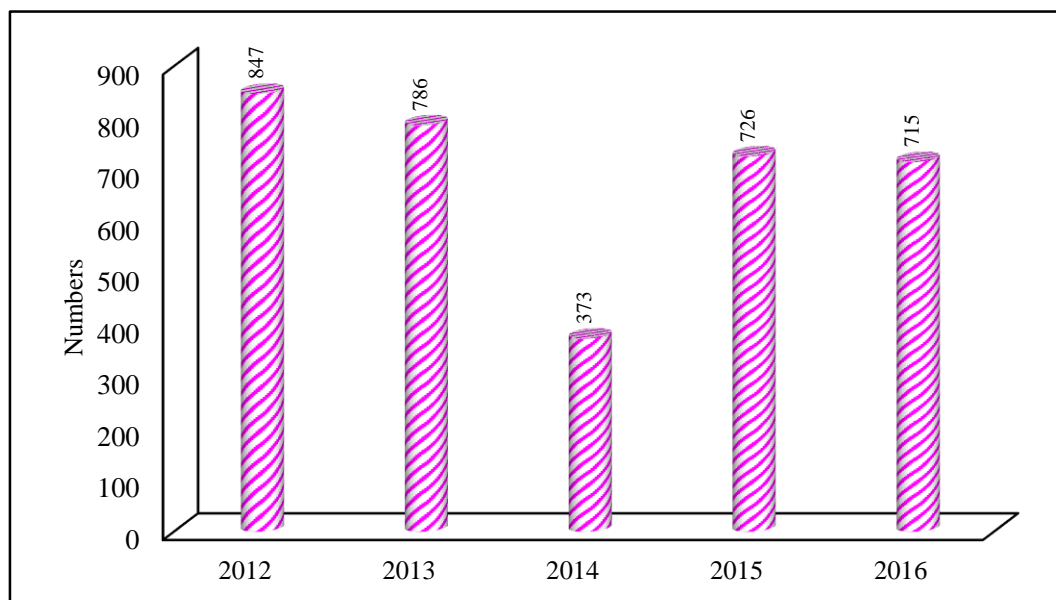


Figure 12.6: Number of Reported Crimes in District Poonch 2012 to 2016

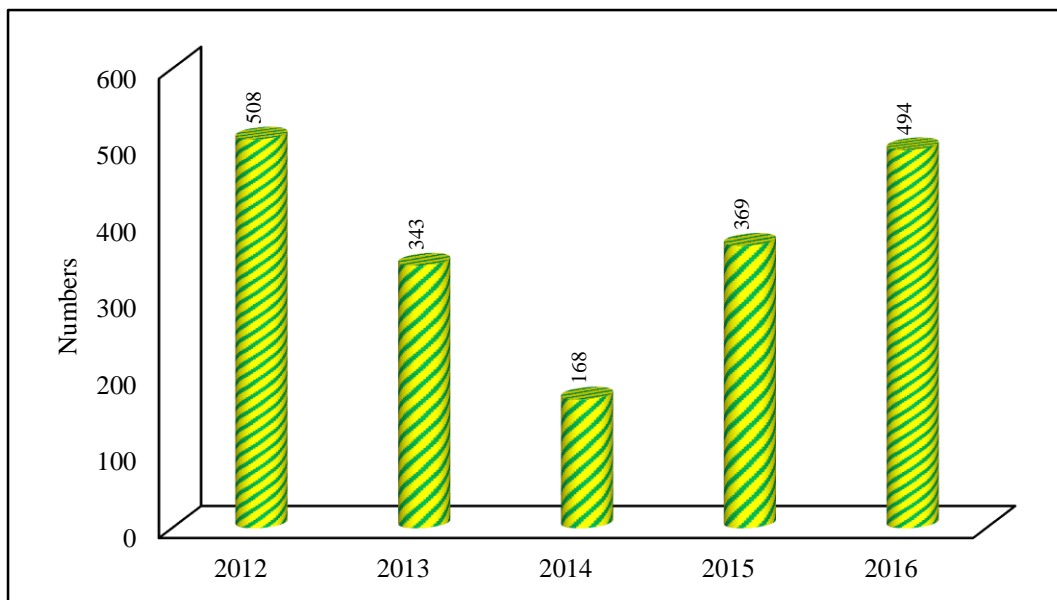


Figure 12.7: Number of Reported Crimes in District Sudhnoti 2012 to 2016

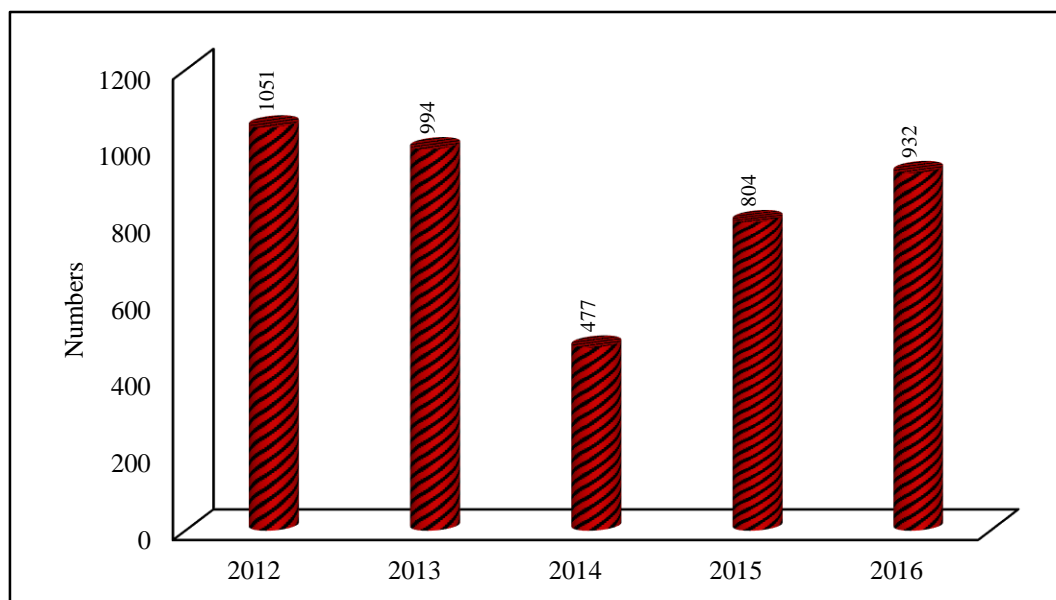


Figure 12.8: Number of Reported Crimes in District Kotli 2012 to 2016

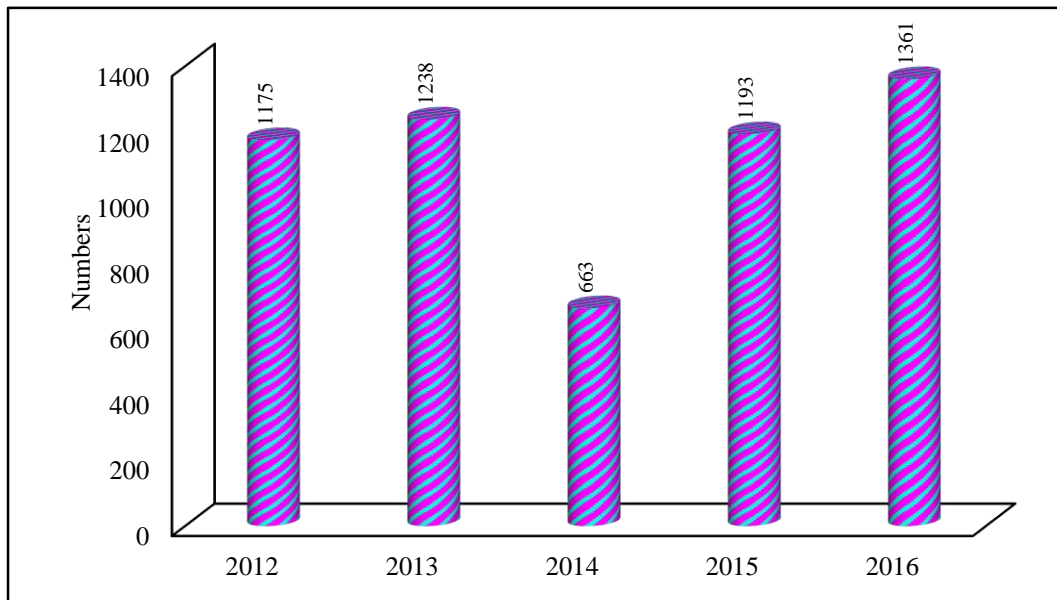


Figure 12.9: Number of Reported Crimes in District Mirpur 2012 to 2016

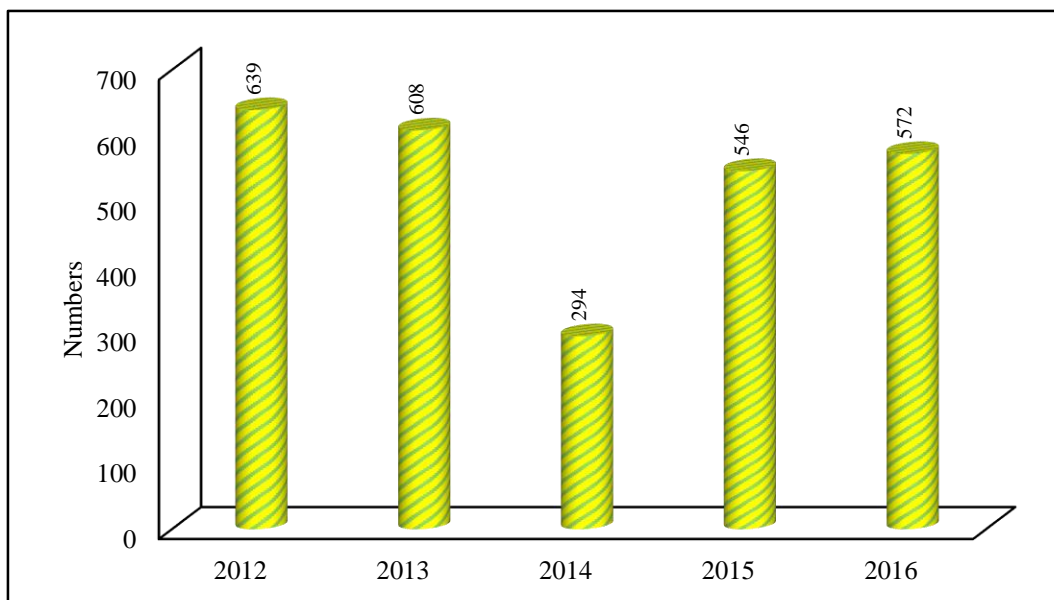


Figure 12.10: Number of Reported Crimes in District Bhimber 2012 to 2016

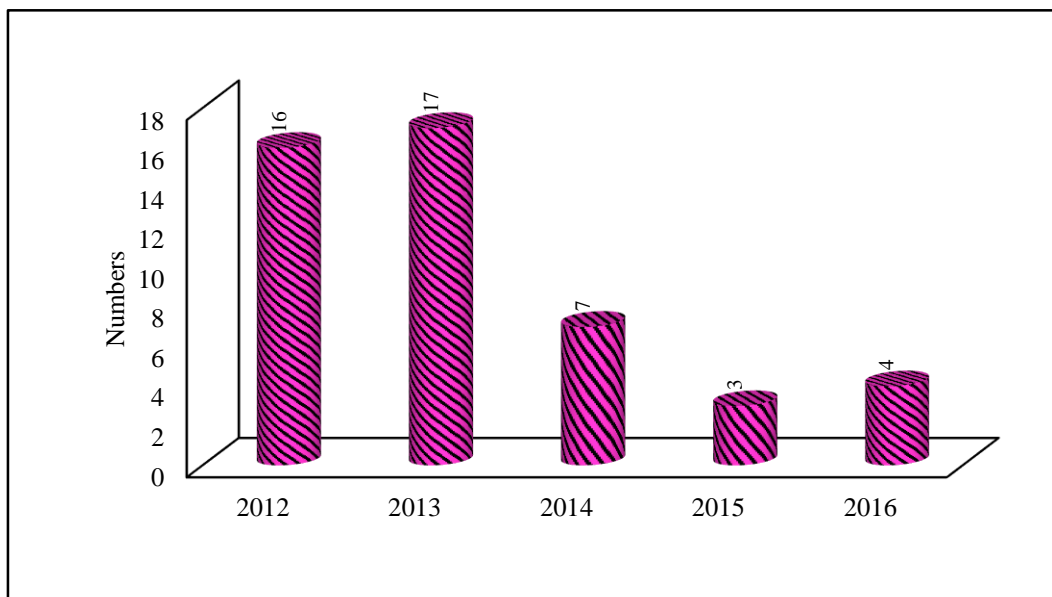


Figure 12.11: Number of Rape Cases in AJ&K 2012 to 2016

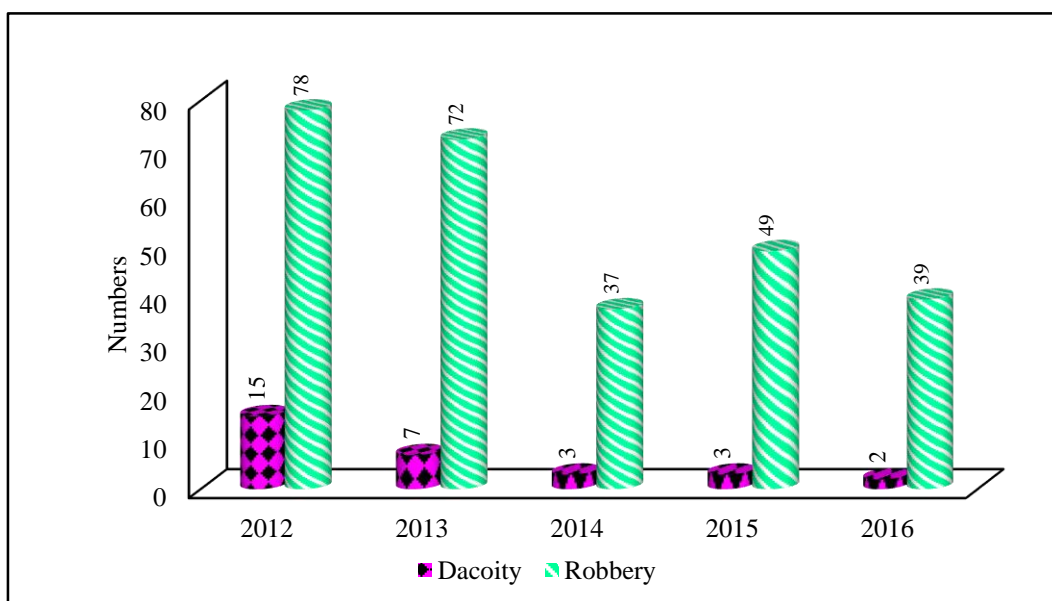


Figure 12.12: Number of Dacoity and Robbery Cases in AJ&K 2012 to 2016

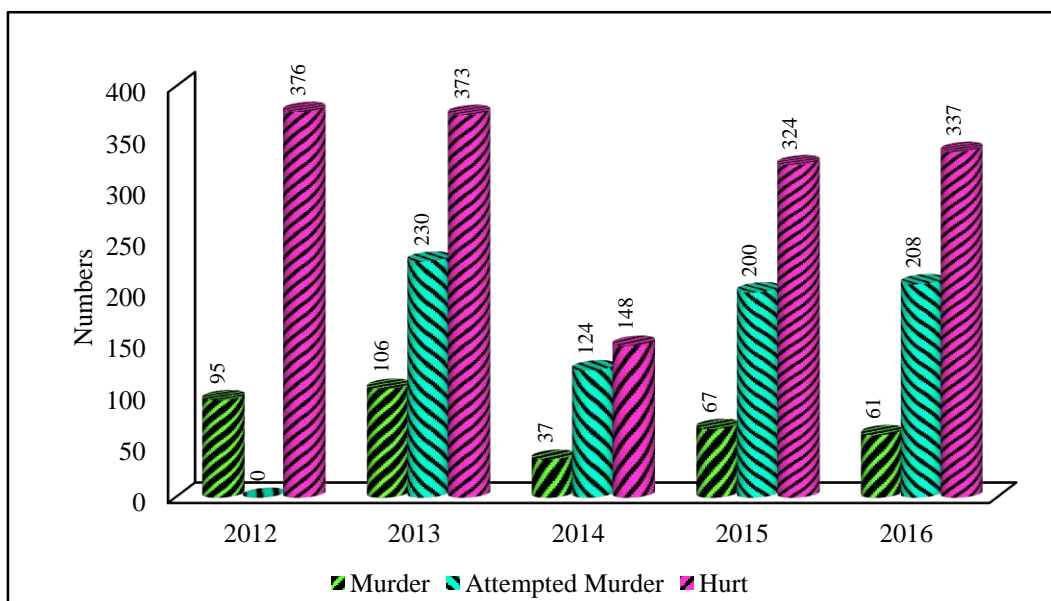


Figure 12.13: Number of Murder, Attempt Murder and Hurt Cases in AJ&K 2012 to 2016

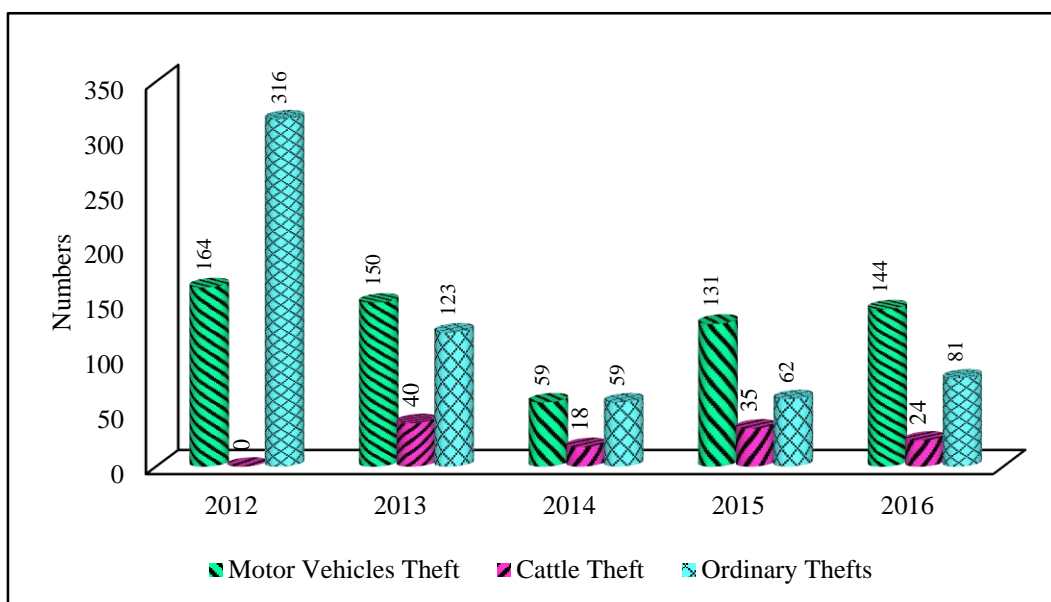


Figure 12.14: Number of Motor Vehicle Theft, Cattle Theft and Ordinary Theft in AJ&K 2012 to 2016

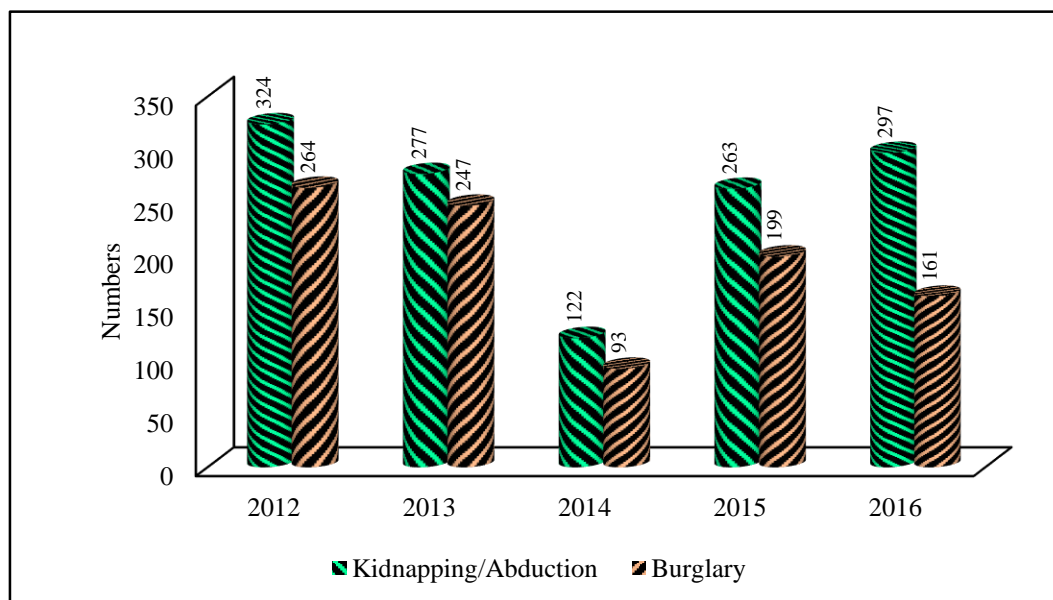


Figure 12.15: Number of Kidnapping/ Abduction and Burglary Cases in AJ&K 2012 to 2016

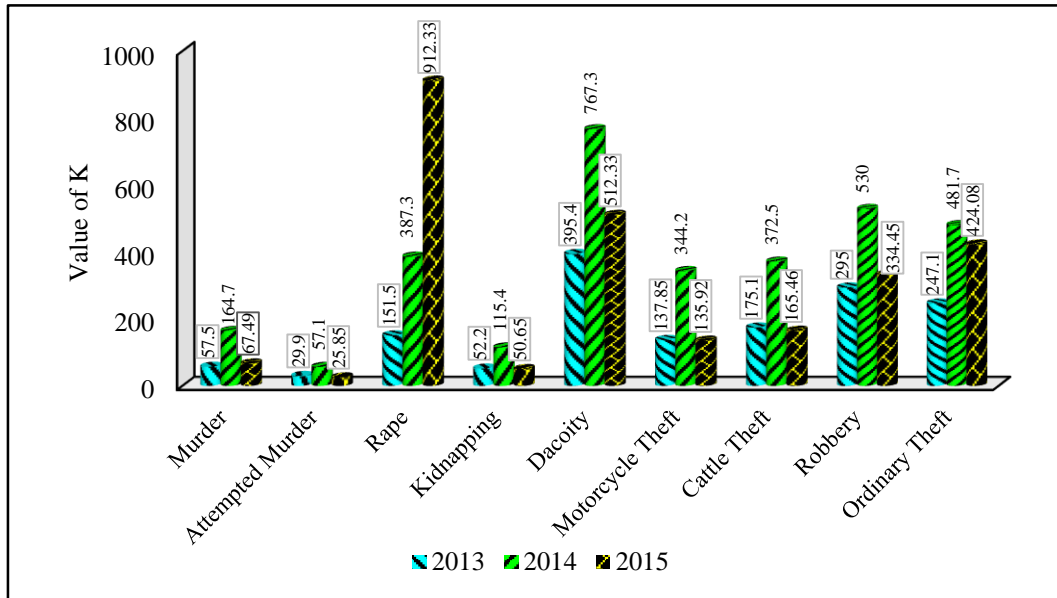


Figure 12.16: Comparison of Crime Rate of AJ&K with Punjab 2013 to 2015

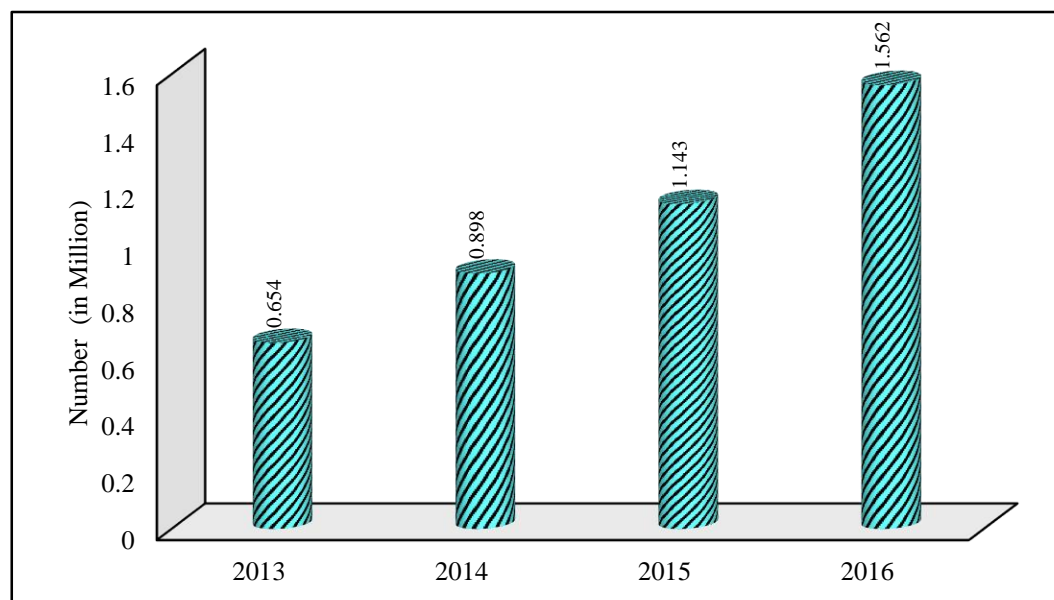


Figure 14.1: Tourist Flux in Azad Jammu & Kashmir 2013 to 2016

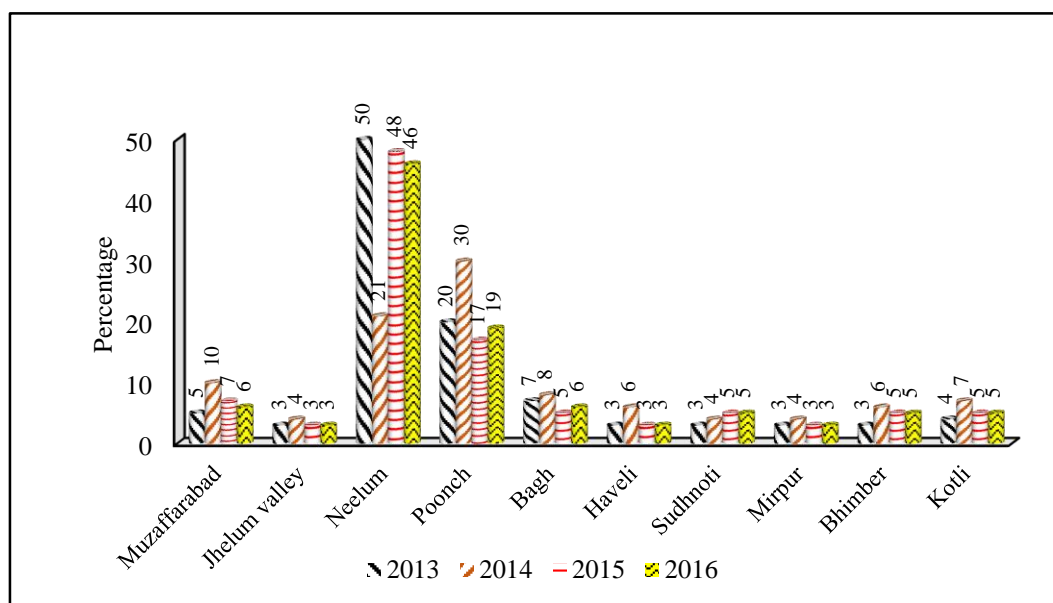


Figure 14.2: District-wise Percentage of Tourist Flux in AJ&K 2013 to 2016

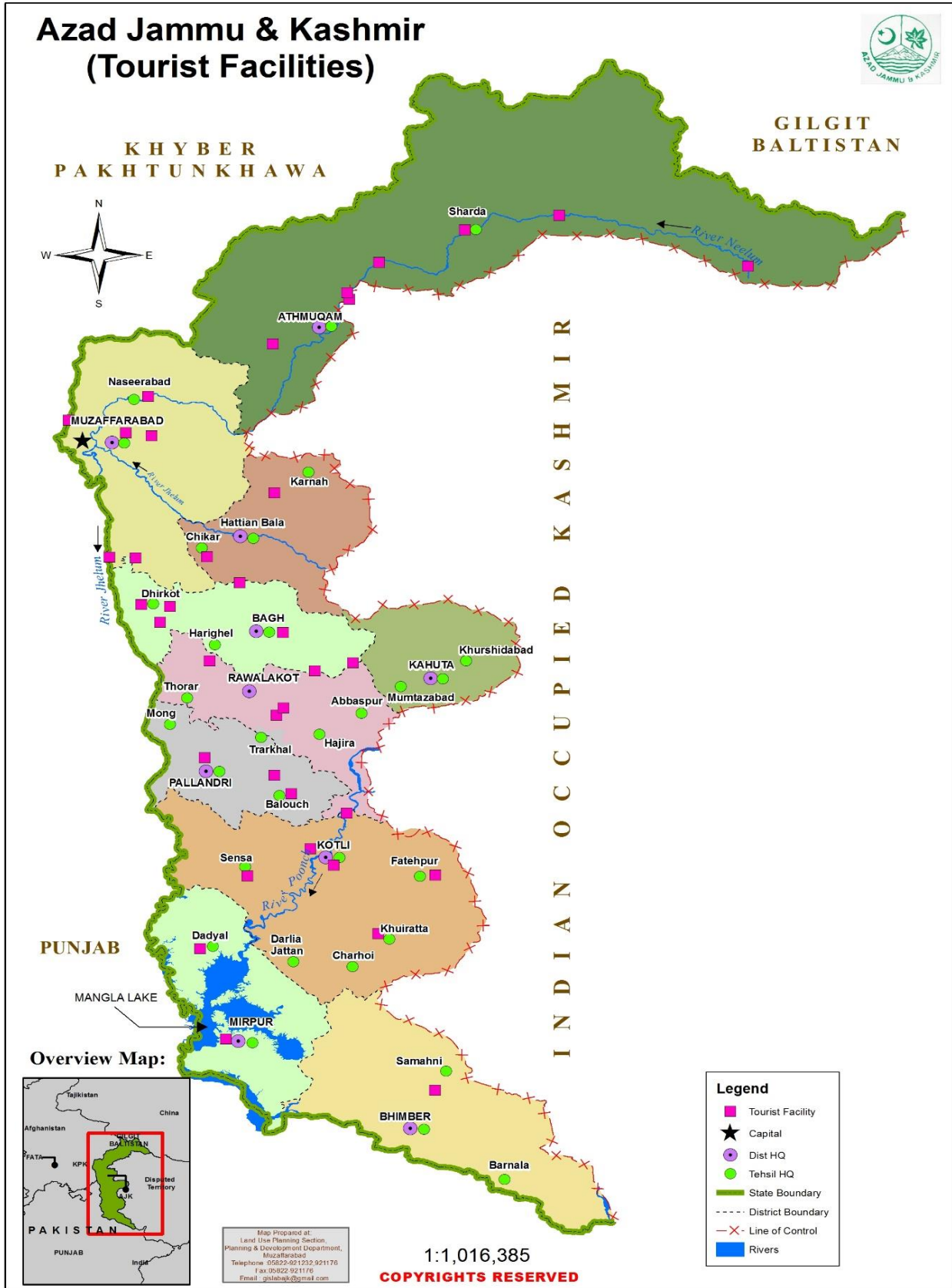

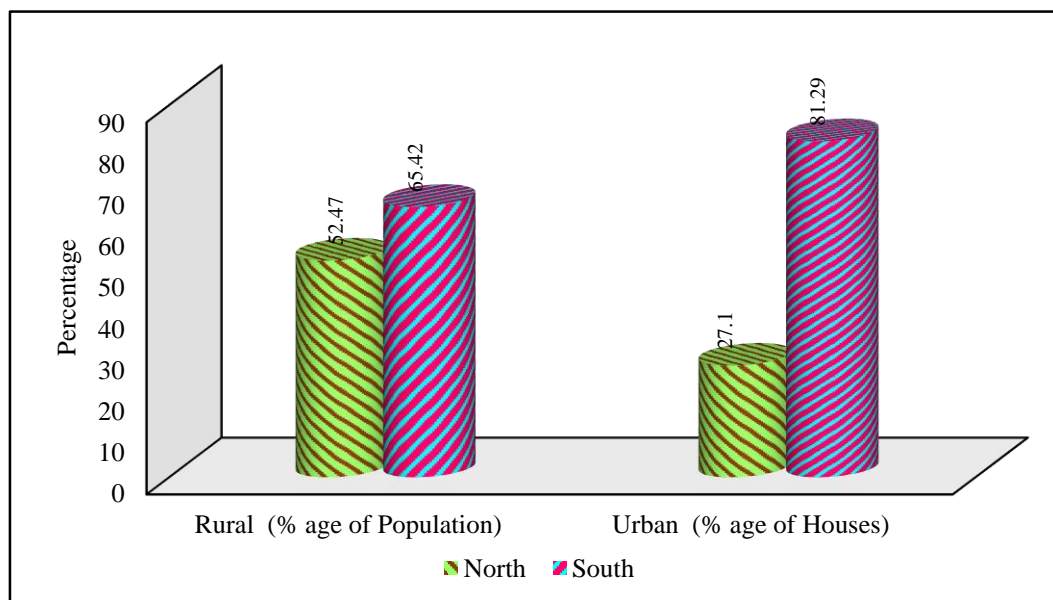


Figure 15.1: Urban and Rural Piped Water Supply in North and South Regions of AJ&K 2016

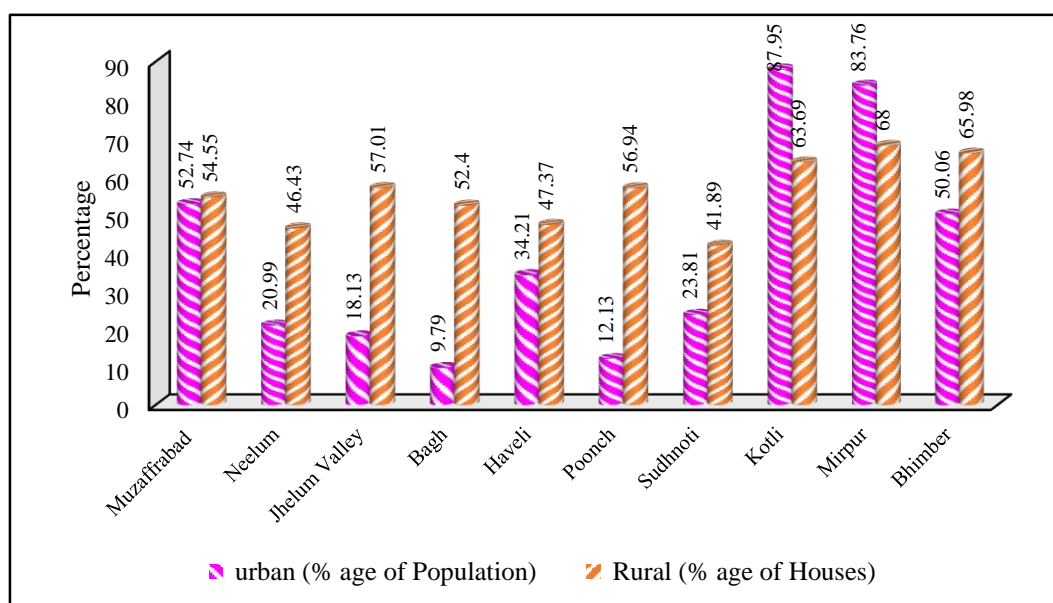


Figure 15.2: District-wise Urban and Rural Piped Water Supply in AJ&K 2016

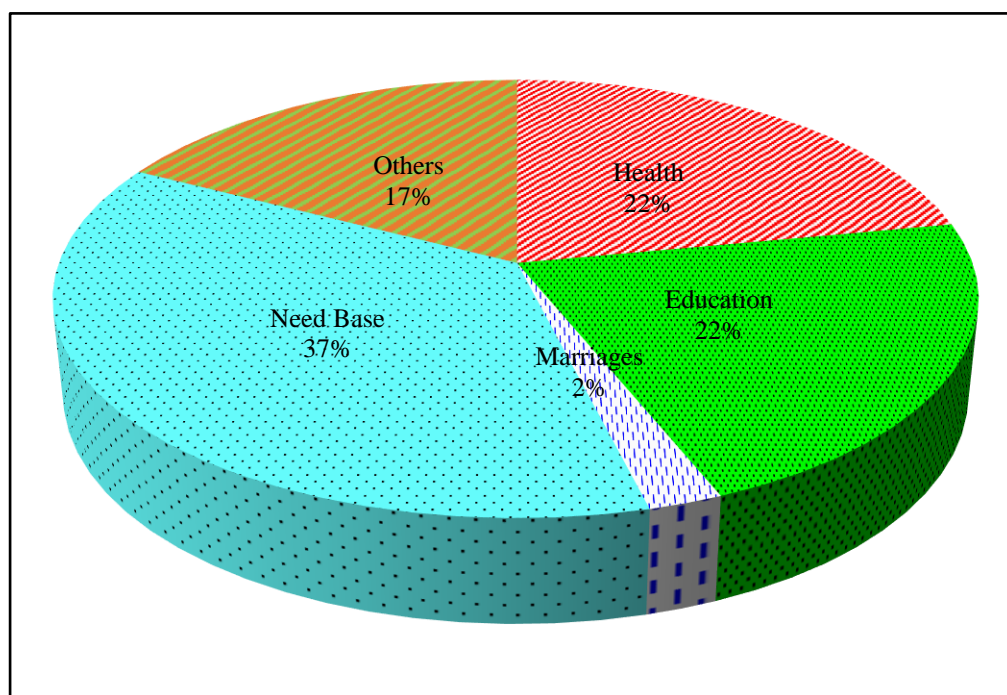


Figure 16.1: Categories-wise Percentage of Zakat Amount Disbursed in AJ&K 2016

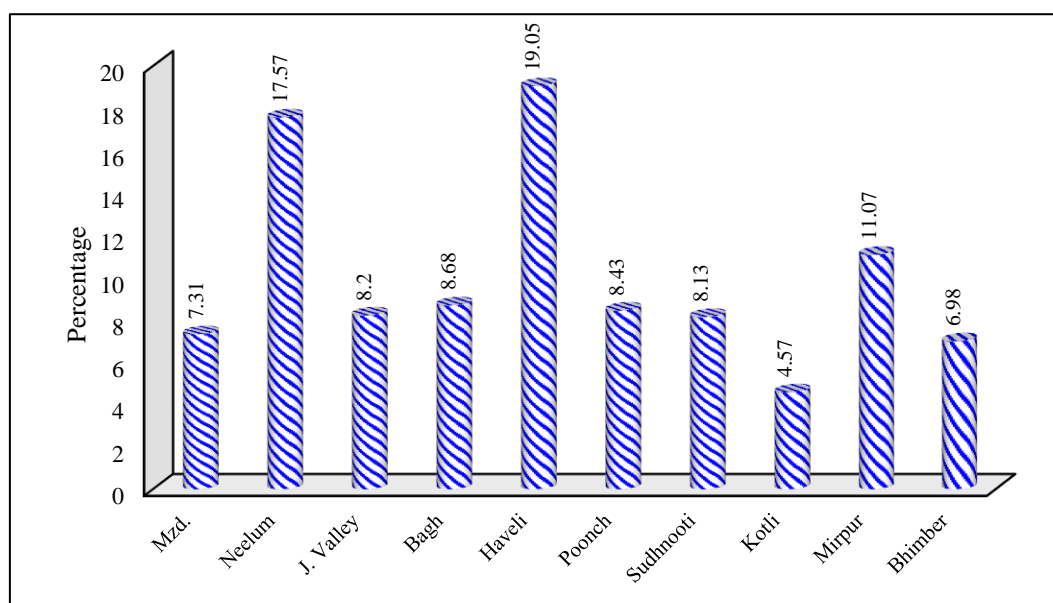


Figure 16.2: District-wise percentages of Zakat Mustahiqeen through their own PLS Account in AJ&K 2015-16

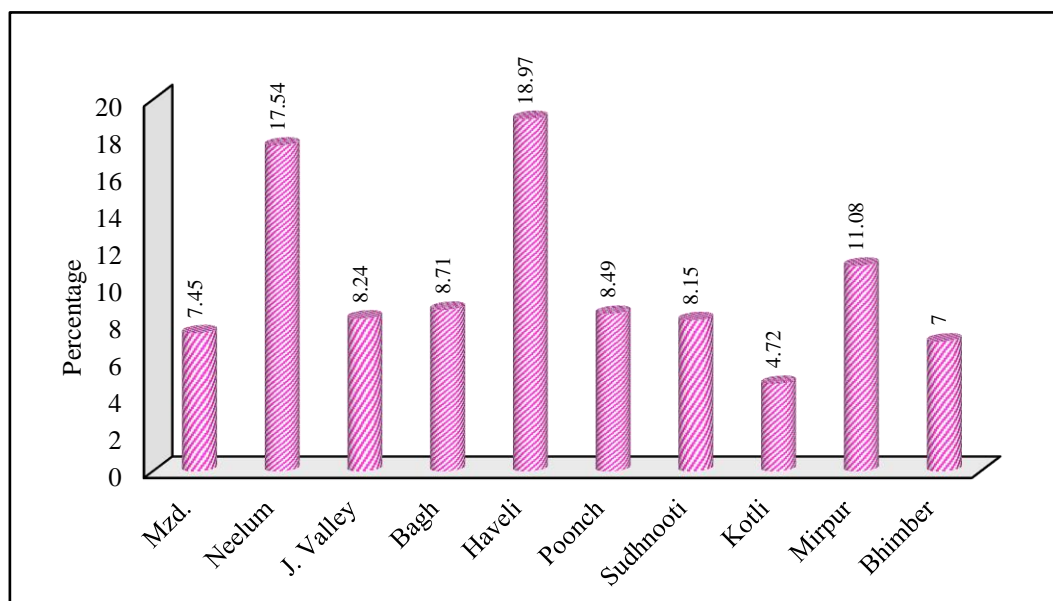


Figure 16.3: District-wise percentages of Zakat Mustahiqeen in AJ&K 2015-16

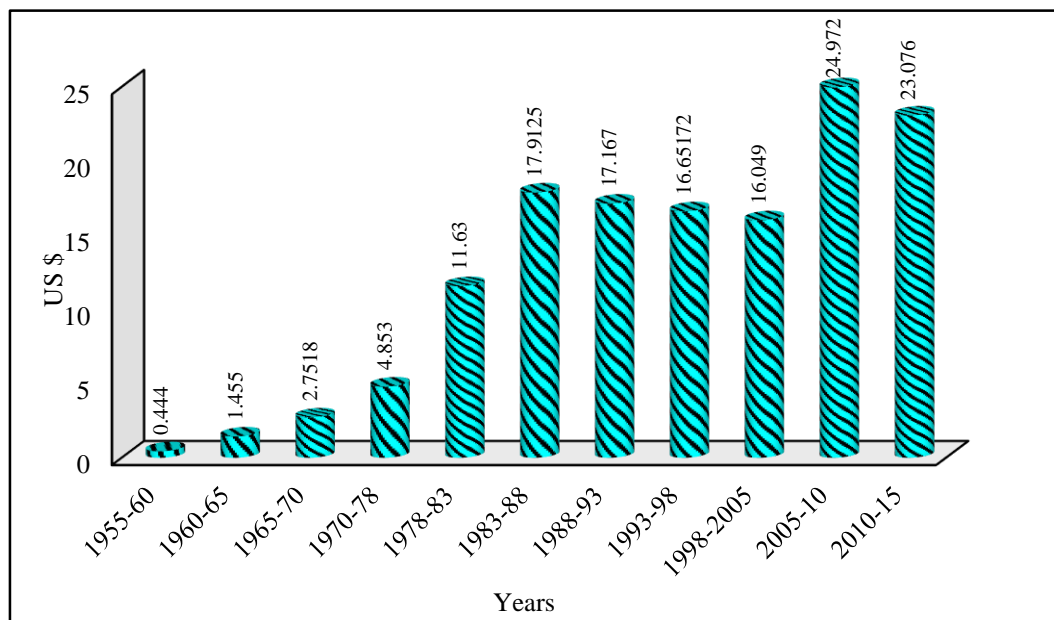


Figure 19.1: Per Capita ADP Allocation (in US \$) of AJ&K 1955-2015

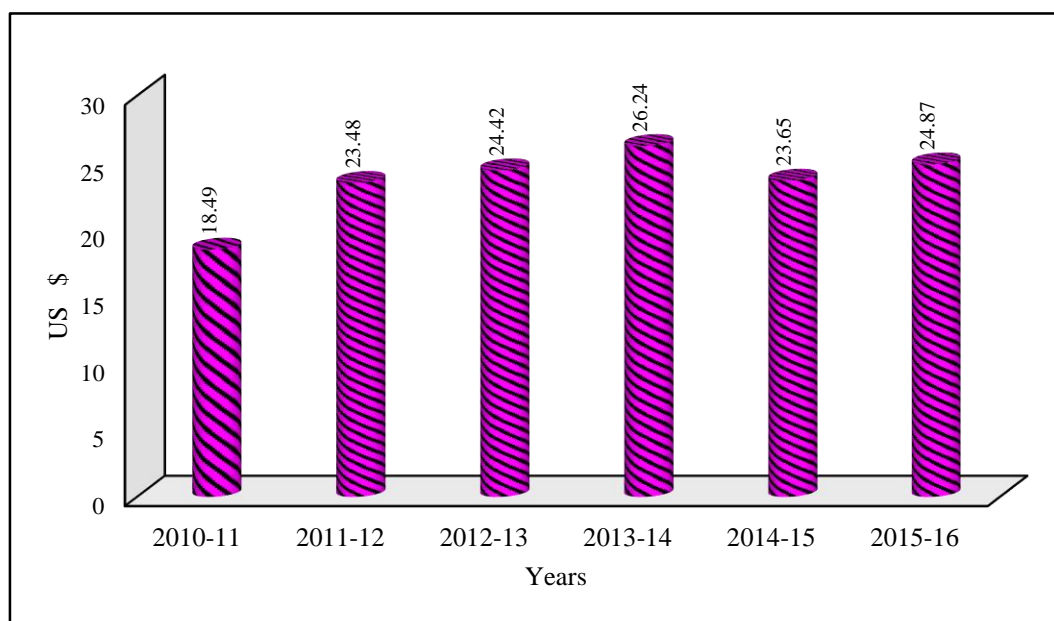


Figure 19.2: Per Capita ADP Allocation (in US \$) of AJ&K 2010-11 to 2015-16

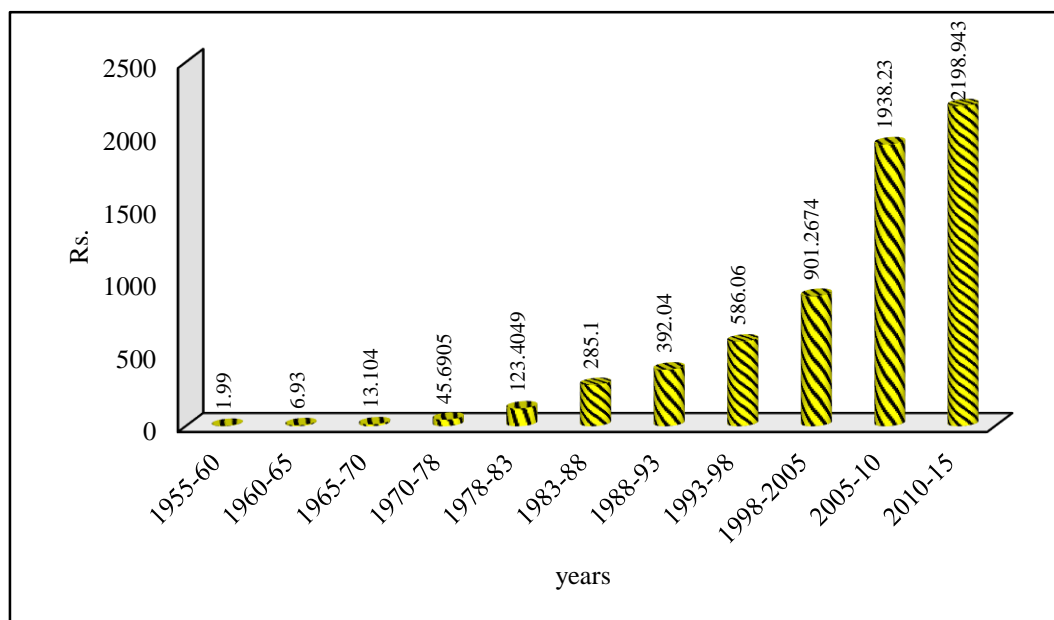


Figure 19.3: Per Capita ADP Allocation (in Rs.) of AJ&K 1955-2015

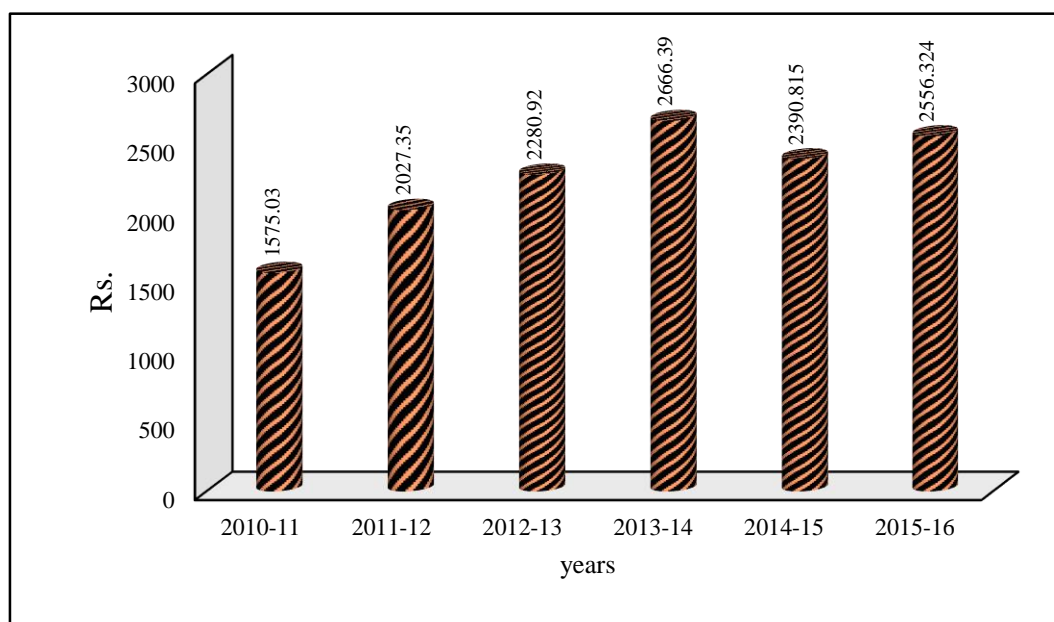


Figure 19.4: Per Capita ADP Allocation (in Rs.) of AJ&K 2010-11 to 2015-16

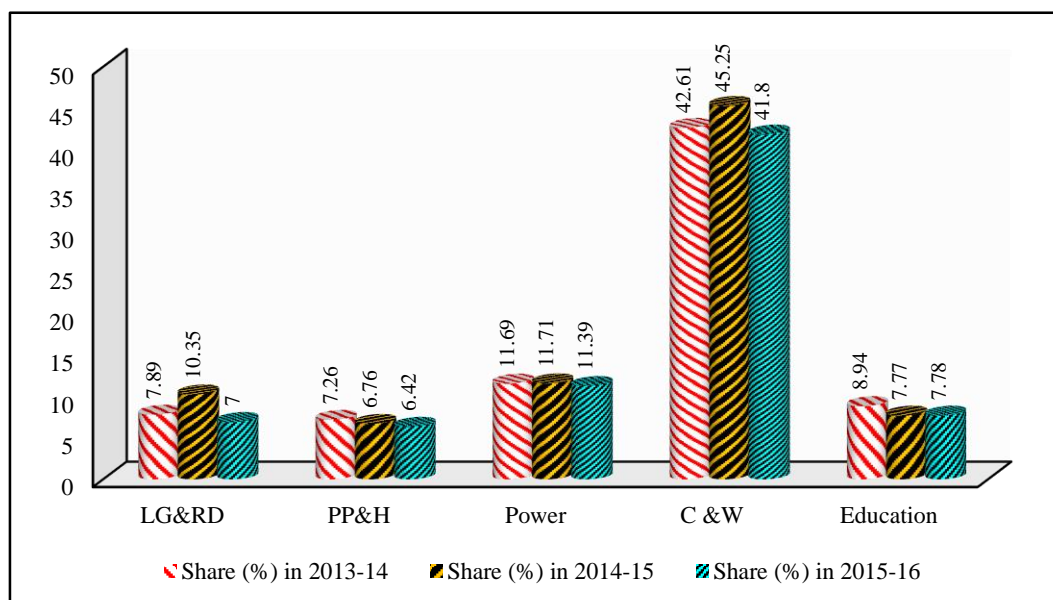


Figure 19.5: ADP Allocation Share (in %) of Sectors having more than 5% share 2013-14 to 2015-16

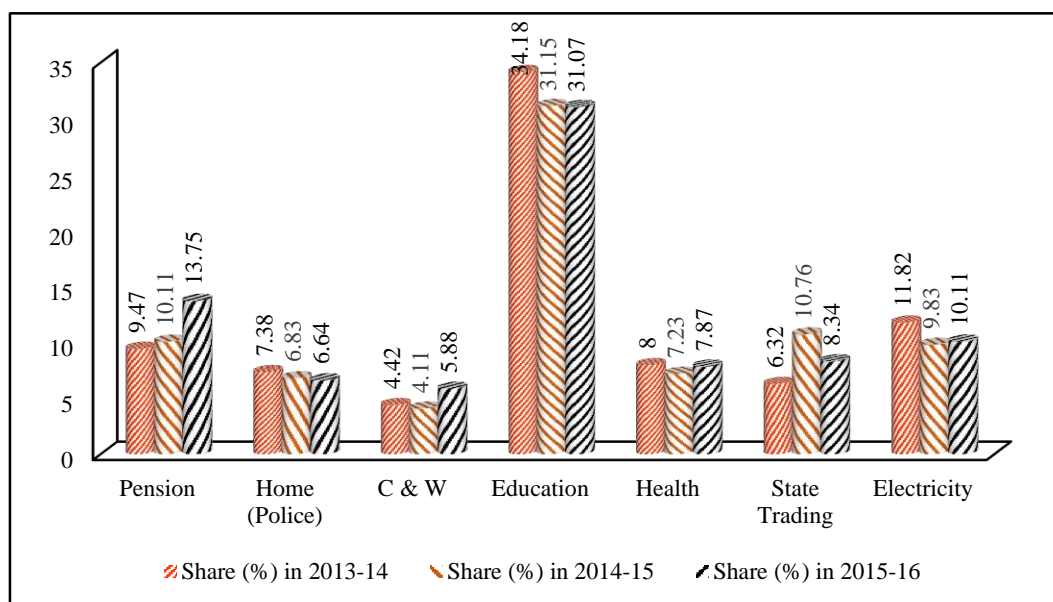


Figure 19.6: Non-Development Budget Share (in %) of Sectors having more than 5% Share 2013-14 to 2015-16

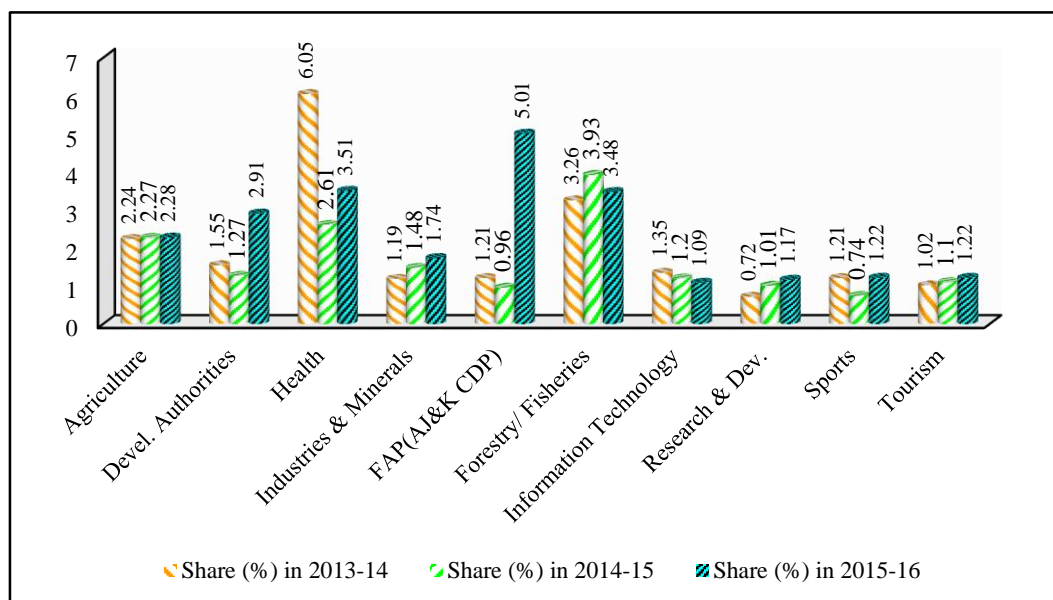


Figure 19.7: ADP Allocation Share (in %) of Sectors having share 1% to 5% 2013-14 to 2015-16

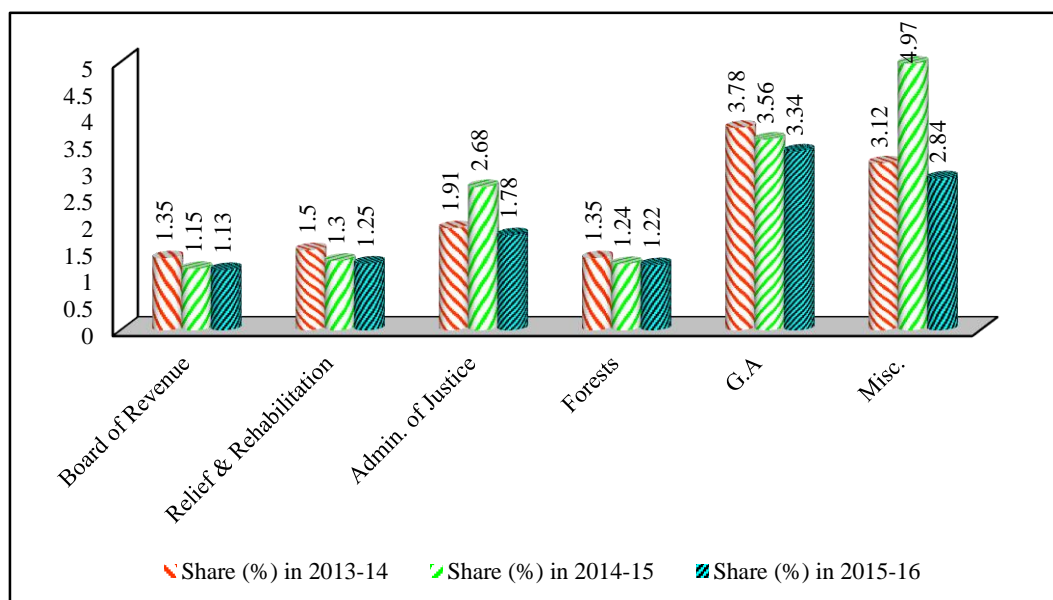


Figure 19.8: Non-Development Budget Share (in %) of Sectors having share 1% to 5% 2013-14 to 2015-16

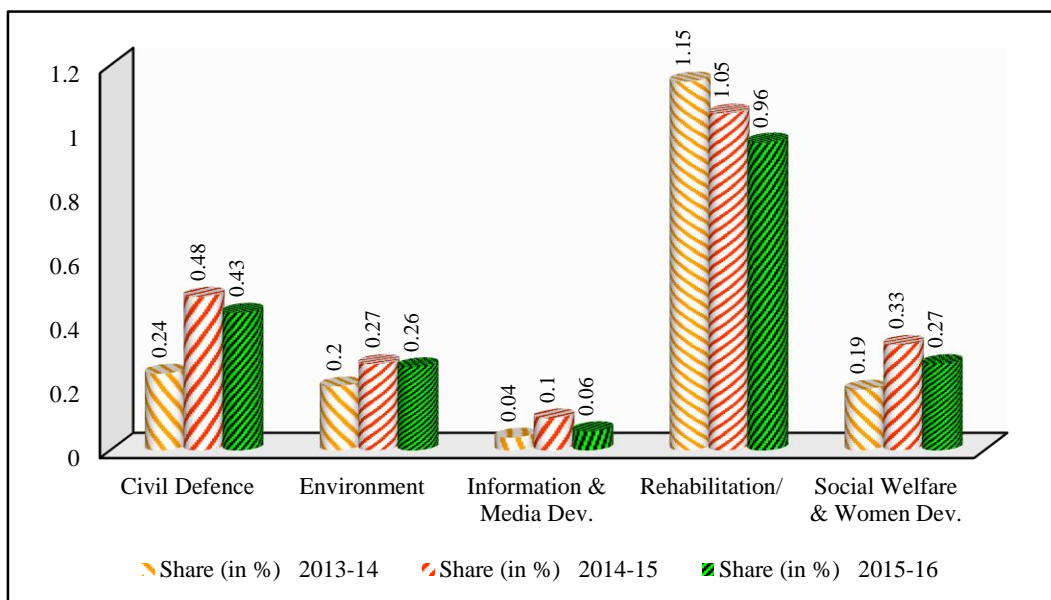


Figure 19.9: ADP Allocation Share (in %) of Sectors having less than 1% share 2013-14 to 2015-16

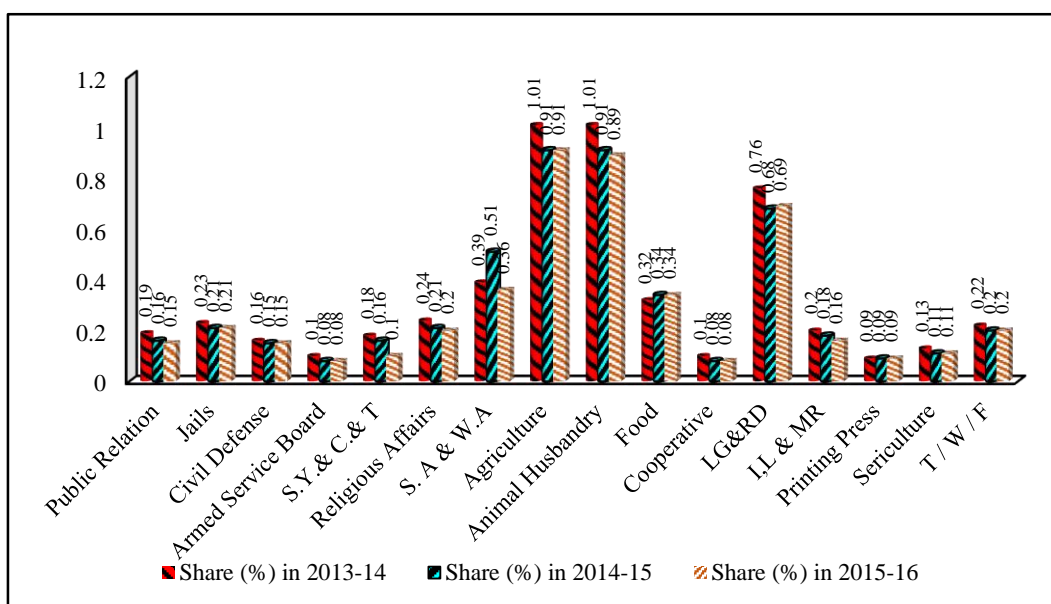


Figure 19.10: Non-Development Budget Share (in %) of Sectors having less than 1% Share 2013-14 to 2015-16

Financial Assistance for Landless

Under Rehabilitation Program for the “Landless”, financial assistance of Rs.75, 000/- has been provided for the purchase of five marlas of land. Under this program, **Rs. 94.65 million** has been disbursed to **1262** beneficiaries. Under second phase of this program “Virtual Landless”, financial assistance worth **Rs.593.10 million** has been disbursed to **7908** beneficiaries. The survey (residents of hazard land) has been completed by Geological Survey of Pakistan and financial assistance is being issued.

Pre-Fabricated Houses

Kingdom of Saudi Arabia and Swedish International Development Agency (SIDA) provided 4000 and 1200 prefabricated housing units respectively for Muzaffarabad & Bagh Cities. All of these houses have been erected/handed over to affectees after completion.

- **5,382** projects/ facilities (69% portfolio) have been completed and handed over to the concerned line departments

Chapter 22

PRICES

22.1 Inflation in Brief

Sensitive Price Indicator (SPI) in Muzaffarabad increased by 1.03% in July 2016 as compared to previous month (June 2016) and 2.26% in June 2016 as compared to previous month (May 2016). Rise of prices is higher in June 2016 as compared to July 2016. The SPI inflation was alarmingly more than double of SPI inflation of Pakistan in June 2016 and exactly same in July 2016 which means in Ramzan Inflation was high.

22.2 Background

Statistics plays a vital role in planning, policymaking, research and development in the modern world. Price index is the branch of statistics, which is widely used as a tool of measuring price changes at wholesale and retail levels. The Sensitive Price Indicator is one of the price index which is computed to assess the price movements of essential commodities at short interval so as to review the price situation and ultimately measures the inflation in these commodities in a certain area.

The Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS), initially known as Central Statistical Office (CSO) was established in 1950, gave due importance to Price Statistics soon after its inception. AJ&K Bureau of Statistics (AJKBoS) a newly established organization, started price collection in May 2016 as its first assignment and calculated SPI inflation along with price indices for different essential commodities in Muzaffarabad, the capital of AJ&K on month-on-month (MoM) basis. Due to lack of staff survey was piloted only in the Capital City.

22.3 Purpose of the Survey

The purpose of the survey was to measure fluctuations in prices of essential commodities in May to July 2016 with special focus on behaviour of prices in Pre-Ramzan, Ramzan and post-Ramzan.

22.4 Basket of Commodities

AJKBoS has selected a Basket of Commodities (list of commodities) containing 44 items, which are given in the Table:

22.5 Price Indices

Sensitive Price Indicator (SPI) for July 2016 and June 2016 are:

- SPI for July 2016 was 101.03 as compared to June 2016.
- SPI for June 2016 was 102.26 as compared to May 2016.

22.6 Comparison with Pakistan

- **SPI Inflation for June 2016 was 102.26 for Muzaffarabad as compared to May 2016 whereas it was 1.04% for Pakistan which reflects high prices during Ramzan.**
- SPI Inflation for July 2016 was 1.03% for Muzaffarabad as compared to June 2016, which is exactly equal to the SPI value for Pakistan.

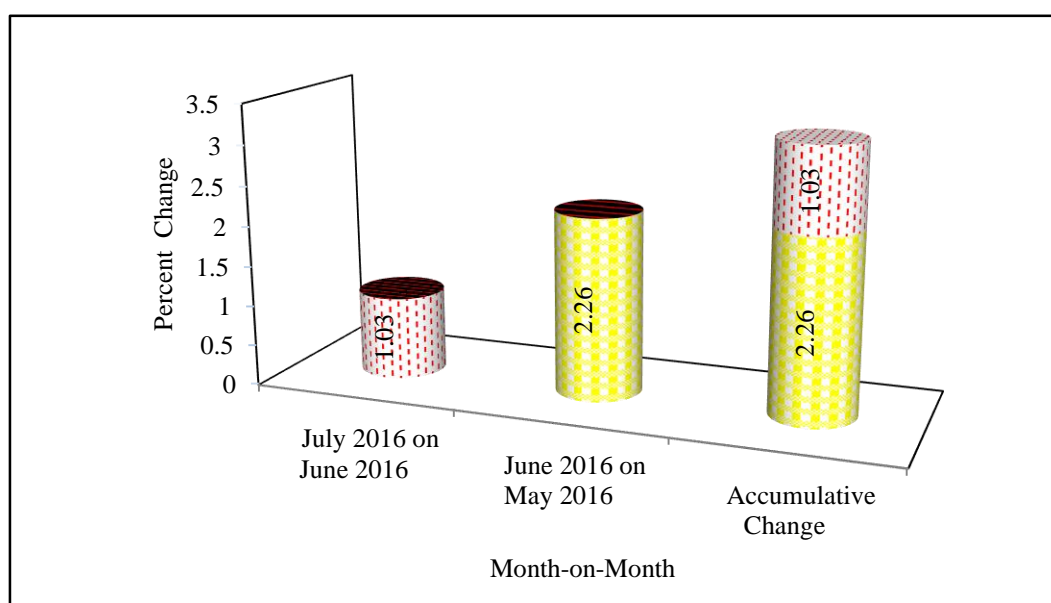


Figure 22.1: SPI Inflation on month-on-month basis for Muzaffarabad

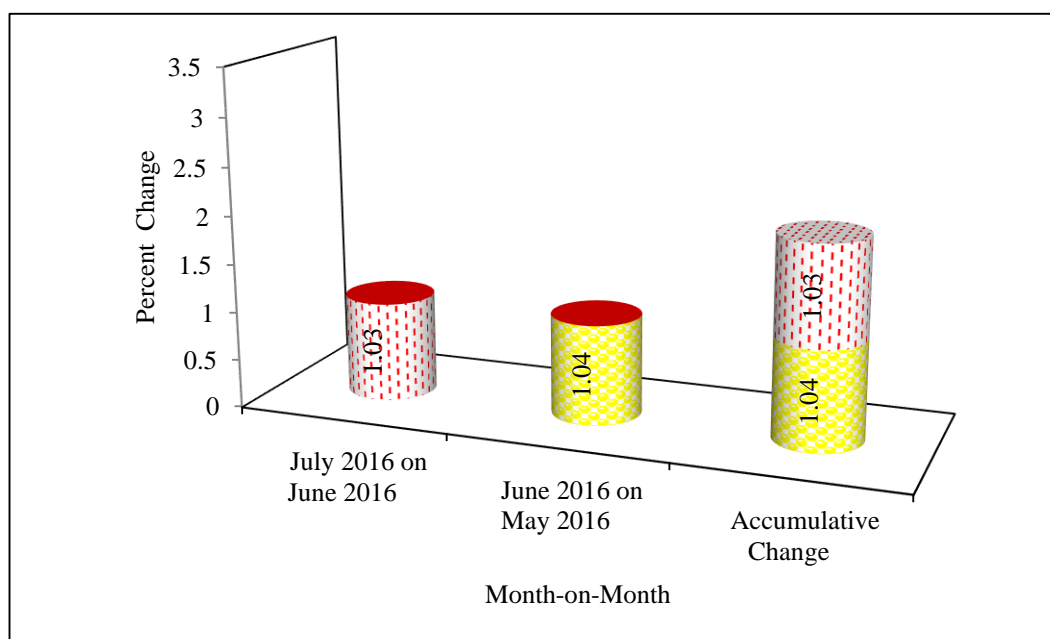


Figure 22.2: SPI Inflation on month-on-month basis for Pakistan

Main contributor commodities along with non-contributor commodities/group of commodities are given below while the detailed Indices are given in the Table 2.

July 2016 as compared to June 2016

Increase: Tomatoes (121.74%), Potatoes (26.89%), Eggs (13.82%), Sugar (6.87%) Electricity (2.30% and 3.60% for 300 to 700 units and 700 and above units, respectively) and Washing soap (4.17%).

Not changed: Petrol, Diesel, salt, tea (Packet), milk, yogourt, bath soap and mustard oil.

Decrease: Bananas (19.59%) and Chicken (8.29%)

June 2016 as compared to May 2016

Increase: Electricity (2.00% and 4.10% for 300 to 700 units and 700 and above units, respectively), Rice (6.94%), Pulses (4.05%), Vegetable (7.22%), Cigarette (9.62%), Cloths and Footwear (9.48%) and L.P.G. (4.65%).

Not changed: Petrol, Diesel, salt, tea (Packet), milk, yogourt, bath soap and mustard oil.

Decrease: Chicken (1.40%), Mutton (1.4%) and eggs (8.17%).

22.7 Guideline for Reader

The following points are helpful for the Reader for better understanding of the entries in the Table-2, below

- i) **For Columns (3) and (4)**
 - a) 100 means no change in price(s) of the commodity.
 - b) More than 100 means increase in the price(s) of the commodity.
 - c) Less than 100 means decrease in the price(s) of the commodity.
- ii) **For Columns (5) and (6)**
 - a) (+) means increase in price(s).
 - b) (-) means decrease in price(s).
 - c) Number with (+) sign indicates percent increase in the price(s).
 - d) Number with (-) sign indicates percent decrease in the price(s).
 - e) 0.00 means that price remains the same.
